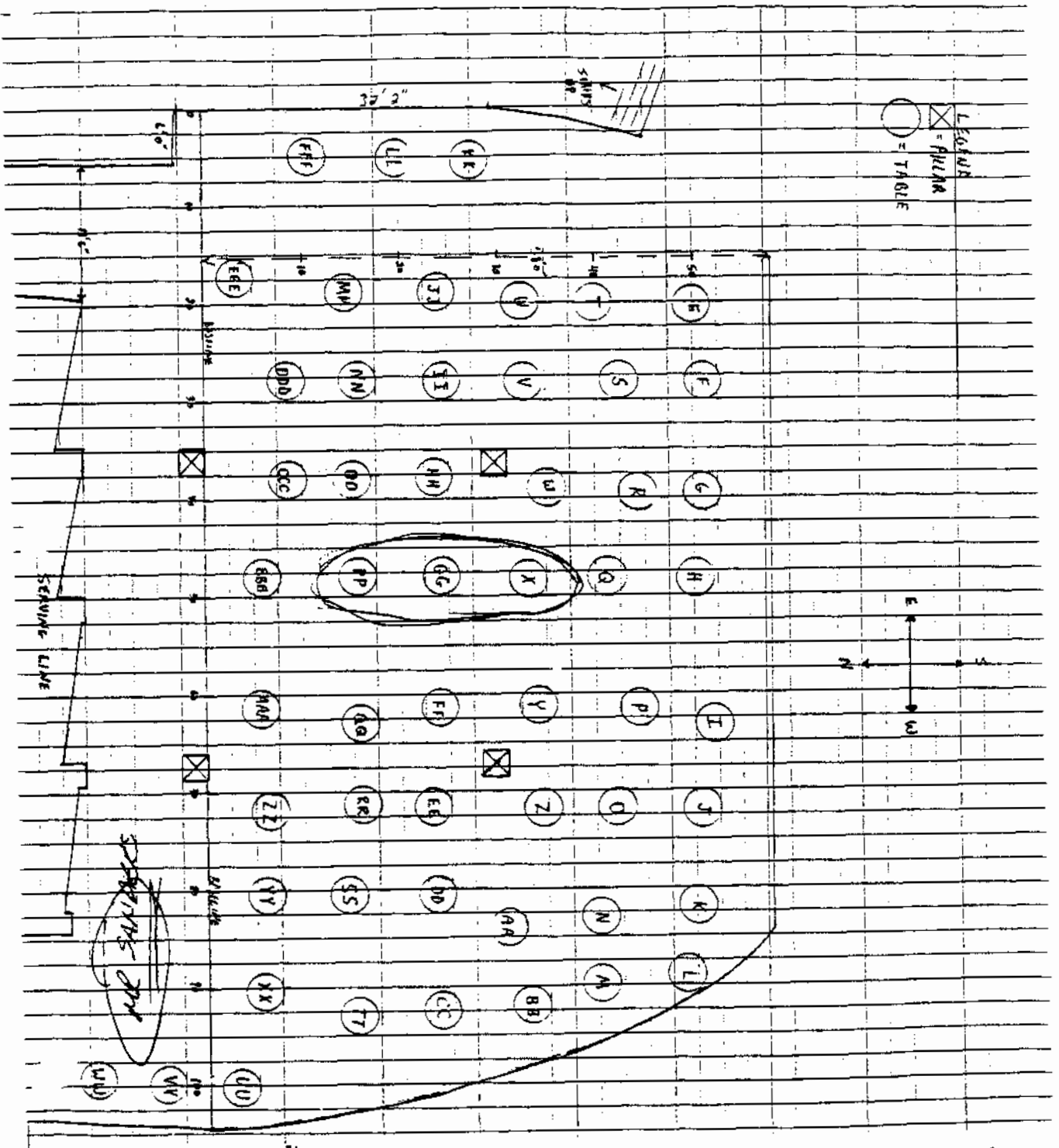

A: I have a friend, Brooke Skinner and she said that on the day of the incident she got into an argument with a girl who belonged to the Trench Coat Mafia and the girl told her "you'd better watch out, your all going to die today." I confronted the girl two days after the shooting and asked her about what she told Brooke and she denied saying it. I don't know the girls name. She's Hispanic female, short and heavy set in the 11th or 12th grade. She always wears army pants and black t- shirts. [editor's note: likely Alejandra Marsh]

Summary of Statement:

At about 11:30 am me and my friends were sitting in the cafeteria when a (female) teacher was yelling "get down, get down." I looked out the window to see a person sprinting away, another on the ground face down, and a kid who looked like he was trying to run but it looked like he was shot in the leg because he was all bloody. Then, a person with a gun dressed in black threw a bomb into the parking lot. As we ran up stairs I felt another blast and noticed someone lying on the floor so I ran into the closest room. While in the room we heard gunshots and felt blasts. We then set up a table in front of the door and about a minute later someone shot through the window of the door and the table spraying us with glass and wood fragments. While in the room our teacher at the time, set up a couple of tables and we hid behind them for about 3 hours, until we moved to

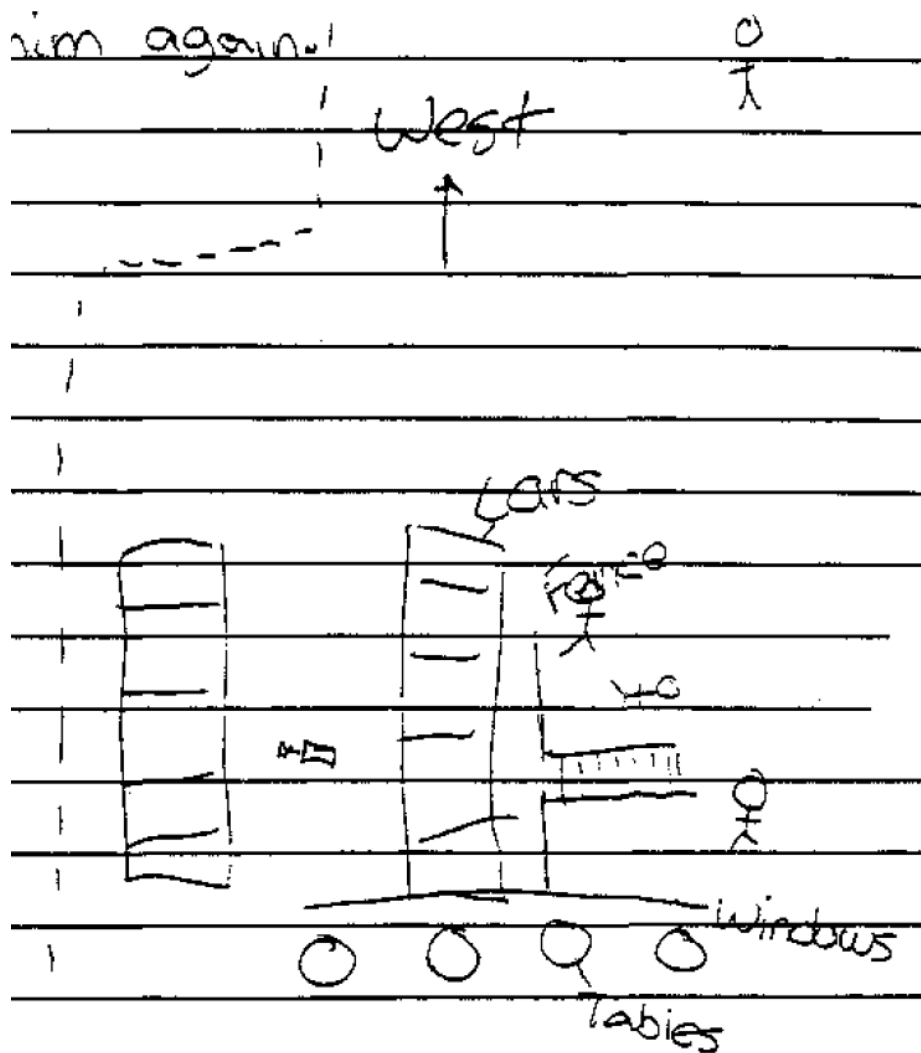

On 4/21/99 at 3:50pm I interviewed 15 year old Brad Miller at his home in Littleton, Co. Brad's parents were present for this interview. Brad agreed to speak with me about the incident at Columbine High School on 4/20/99.

He stated he was in the cafeteria around 11:30am when a teacher came running in and yelled "get down". Brad was seated at a table near the west windows of the cafeteria. He immediately got down on the ground and looked out the window towards the back of the school in the west parking lot. He saw one person laying face down on the ground and 1-2 other kids running outside. These kids appeared to be injured, recalling seeing one kid with blood on his leg. Then he saw a tall (over 6') white male with long dark hair wearing a long trench coat and dark pants carrying a gun. The gun was described as black, about 18" long. Brad was sure it was not a shotgun, more like a "semi automatic". This person also had a "pipe bomb" which Brad described as similar looking to a stick of dynamite. The man lit this "pipe bomb" with a lighter and threw it into the parking lot towards some cars. The man then disappeared around the outside corner staircase of the building. Brad recalled when he saw this man outside, he noticed 2-3 more "dynamite looking" bombs inside his trenchcoat. Brad believed this gunman to be alone as he saw no other people with weapons.

Brad ran out of the cafeteria after about 2 minutes under the table and followed most of the kids in the opposite direction from the gunfire. He described this as through the center of the cafeteria to

the concrete stairs which lead upstairs to the science area. He believed he was running upright. While going up the stairs he heard and felt another loud blast, possibly behind him and noticed someone laying on the floor near the steps. He ran into the nearest room, which was one of the front science rooms. Brad believed there is 4 or 5 science rooms which lead away from the main hallway. He was in this room with about 9 students and one teacher. They put tables in front of the door to protect themselves. A few minutes later someone walked by the door where they had put tables in front of and stood there. The person then fired a single round through the glass window and into a table. Brad recalled wood and glass sprayed the room, but none was injured from this. He did not see the person who fired this round. The person did not enter the room.

A short time later, the group moved into a neighboring science classroom, further back from the main hallway where about 20 kids were hiding. The teacher, Douglas Kraft stayed with them. He continued to hear gunshots and blasts outside the room. He said everyone was very scared, but they remained as quiet as possible. He believed about 3 hours later, SWAT members rescued the group and escorted them out of the school.

Brad stated that later he recognized Dylan Klebold on TV as the gunman he saw outside the cafeteria around 11:30am. He stated he does not know Dylan Klebold, but has seen him around school as a student. Brad described Dylan Klebold as a loner and would hang out with guys that wore trenchcoats, but did not know any of there names. Brad stated he did not see anything unusual at the school before 11:30am on 4/20/99, nor did he have any information regarding other students who may have been involved.

On 4/27/99 I went back to Brad Miller's home to clarify his specific location in the CHS cafeteria at 11:30am on 4/20/99. Brads parents were also present for this interview. I provided Brad a drawing of the cafeteria, which depicted all the tables and their location in the cafeteria. I pointed out specific areas, such as the food line,

kitchen, and west windows of the cafeteria to give Brad a better understanding of the lay-out in this drawing.

He looked at the drawing and stated he was seated at either table CC or TT near the windows. Brad circled both of these tables on the drawing, but could not be specific as to which table. He stated he was seated facing the kitchen, and Nathan Anema and Tyler Stark, both CHS students were seated with him across the table. He believed Nathan was on his right facing the west windows.

Brad recalled that he came down the concrete stairs alone about 11:20am, stopped at "rebel corner" to buy a salad for lunch. Rebel corner is at the bottom of the concrete stairs towards the south student entrance. He noticed no unusual duffle bags in the cafeteria, and stated "there are hundreds of backpacks in there". I asked specifically about a large duffle bag, he reiterated that he saw nothing unusual. He purchased his salad and walked alone through the middle of the cafeteria, at an angle towards his table. He believed that Nathan and Tyler were arriving at the table at the same time he was. He had just sat down when a teacher yelled "get down".

Brad stated he was wearing a dark blue t-shirt, tan pants and white hat on 4/20/99. He left a black Jansport backpack on the floor near his table. The backpack had books and school notebooks in it.

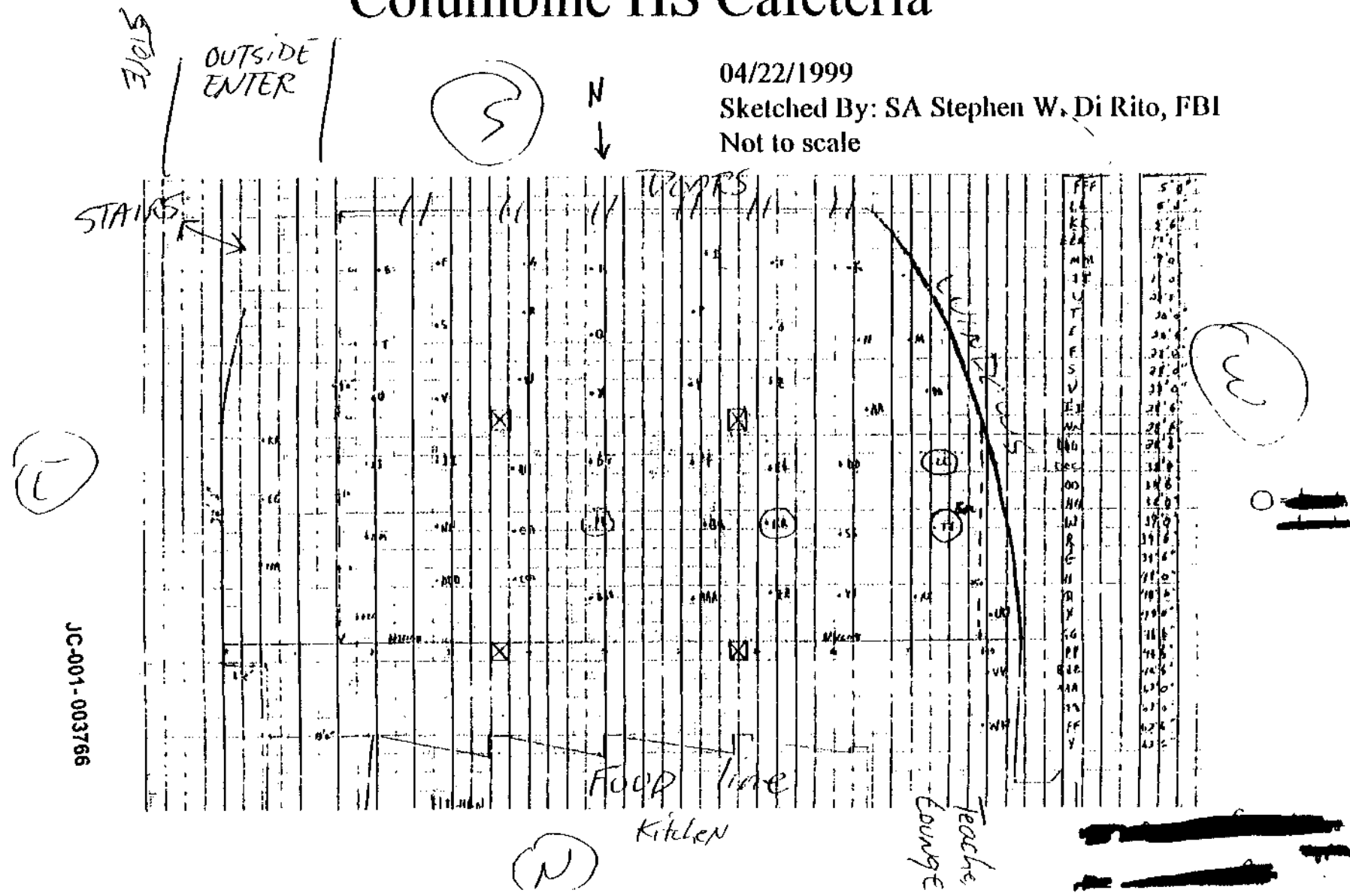

INVESTIGATION:

On 05-07-99, between the hours of 1003 and 1030 hours, I had an opportunity to speak with Elaine Miller in reference to the incident that occurred at Columbine High School on 04-20-99

Elaine Miller explained that she arrived at Columbine High School on 04-20-99, at about 0725 hours, and that she was car pooling with her friend, Jenny Doyle. Upon arriving at the school, they parked in the Junior parking lot, and entered the school from the east side near the Math/Science hall. Miller explained when she first arrived at the school, she went to Ms Mosier's classroom, where she dropped off her cheerleading bag, and then proceeded to her first hour Journalism class. After first hour, she has a Geometry class taught by Mr Smith, but on this date, they had a substitute teacher. After being released from Geometry, she proceeded to her third hour Spanish class, which is down in the Foreign Language hallway, east of the cafeteria.

I provided Miller a map of the cafeteria area and asked if she observed two large duffle bags or sports bags, one being blue in color and the other being orangish/red in color, which were located in the central core area of the cafeteria, and asked if she saw those two bags when she was going to her Spanish class. Miller stated she could not see the bags and could not provide any additional information about the bags. After being released from her Spanish class, she went to her English class, which is up in the Math hall, and was taught by Ms. Bohack. Miller stated they were released from English class at about 1110 hours, and after being released from her class, she went directly to the cafeteria, and believes she arrived at about 1111 hours.



Again, using the map of the cafeteria area, I asked Miller to tell me where she was seated. Miller explained there were three tables just to the west of the student store in REBEL corner, and that she sat at the middle table. These tables were not depicted on the map, and I had Miller draw them on the map. Seated at the table with her were her friends, Amy Staley (303-973-9865), Shannon Zele (unknown phone), Brooke Allison (303-978-9319), B.J. Secord (unknown phone); Isiah Salazar (unknown phone), and Dave Schulte (303-798-4274).

Miller told me after placing her backpack on a chair at the table, she proceeded to the student store where she got her lunch. After she returned back to the table, she placed her backpack, which she described as being blue in color JanSport and placed it on the window ledge near her table.

Miller told me shortly after she sat at her table and began to eat lunch, that she recalls seeing several students running outside, telling me that it was near the southwest corner of the school. Later, she explained to me that somebody yelled from within the cafeteria that somebody has a gun, at which time she recalls seeing the janitors who started to tell the students to get down underneath their tables. Miller described the students, who were sitting over near the west side of the cafeteria, started to run east towards the stairways. Again, she remembers hearing janitors yelling and telling everyone to leave the cafeteria area. Miller told me she ran east down the Foreign Language hall into the last French room in the hallway. Miller described there were anywhere from 40 students and three teachers inside the classroom. After they reached the classroom, she recalled hearing several gunshots and explained that she heard four loud explosions, describing the explosions as being powerful enough to rattle the building and cause ceiling tiles to shake and start to crumble. Miller believes they were in the French room anywhere from 10 to 15 minutes after the incident occurred. Realizing they probably were not safe, she stated the teachers within the classroom told them they needed to evacuate the building, at which time they went out an emergency exit just outside the classroom, and exited into the Junior parking lot. The students continued to run south to the Morman house located at Pierce and Polk.

Miller stated after she got to the house, that she was given a ride by Jeremy Zele, who is Shannon Zele's brother, at which time she went to Shannon Zele's house. Accompanying her to Shannon Zele's house were Mike Foster, Carder Kingsbury, and Colleen Schwartzott. Miller was asked if she knew about what time they left the French classroom. She stated she recalls seeing the clock, and it was about 1135 hours. I asked her if she had called her parents immediately after the incident. She told me she

called her mother and told her what had occurred, and this was between 1145 and 1150 hours.

Miller was asked if she had observed any gunmen while she was in the Columbine High School or after she exited. She told me she did not. I also reconfirmed with her that she did not see the two large duffle bags or sports bags that I had described earlier, and again she told me she had no further information as to who owned those bags or who might have brought them into the school. Miller was asked if she knew about the group "Trench Coat Mafia," specifically Eric Harris or Dylan Klebold, or any other members associated with them. She could not provide any information about the group or its members. I asked her if she knew Eric Harris had a Website, and she told me she was unaware of that.


I asked Miller to describe what she was wearing on the incident date. She told me she was wearing a pair of GAP blue jeans, a forest green Abercrombie Poler shirt, and she had some platform shoes on. Miller was asked if there was any rumors about school of anything that was going to happen on the incident date. She explained that the only thing she thought was strange was the phrase of the day said something to the effect of "Don't you wish you weren't here?" Miller could provide no additional information reference this incident.

At the completion of my interview, I had Miller depict where she was sitting on a map I provided her of the cafeteria area, and asked her to show me her direction of travel out of the school. A copy of that map is attached with this supplemental report.

INVESTIGATION:

On April 27, 1999 at 1005 hours I contacted Tim Miller at his home for an interview. His parents were present. Tim then told me the following:

- * He is a freshman at Columbine High.
- * When asked, he said he does not know Eric Harris by name or face. He has seen him around school based on the photos he has seen on the news. He said that the same goes for Dylan Klebold.
- * When asked about other students who wear trench coats, he said that he has see a couple other students like that but does not know their names.

* When asked if he saw anyone associated with Eric, Dylan or the trench coat students the day of the shooting or in the cafeteria, he said he did not.

* He did not see any unusual objects in the cafeteria. He did not see any object other than backpacks in the cafeteria. When asked specifically, he said he did not see any duffle bag.

* He said that he got out of his 4th hour science class at 11:10 a.m. He went down the stairs by the science area to the cafeteria. He walked into the cafeteria to the pop machines by the west exit door. He got a pop and then went to his lunch table.

* Referring to the cafeteria diagram, he pointed to table FF as being the one he was at. He said it was by the pillar. This was then confirmed with the location his backpack was recovered.

* He was at that table with Devin Casteel, Jeff Morroni, John Strobel, Pat Vassar, Kyle Hayes, and (Joseph) Austin Steckler.

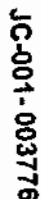
* He was wearing jeans, brown shoes, and a blue Rebel football t-shirt that has a small emblem on the front and a large football with a patriot on the back.

* The first thing he noticed was the students closest to the west windows left those tables and went to look out the window. He heard someone say something about a fight.

* He then saw Mr. Sanders run in from the west cafeteria door. He thought Mr. Sanders ran in from the outside but never saw him outside. (Teacher lounge door is in the same location.)

* He said Mr. Sanders told everyone to "get down" several times. He said a janitor with a Yankees hat was behind Mr. Sanders at that time. Mr. Sanders made the warning from the pop machine area by that west door.

She went to all of her regular morning classes. At about 11:10, she went to the cafeteria. She went downstairs and then went to the bathroom and then got food at the school store. After she got her food, she was walking back to go sit down, and someone came by screaming from the other side of the cafeteria that there was someone with a gun and to get down.

Brianna was wearing her back pack. She ran into the bathroom. She saw two freshman girls in the bathroom. She didn't know them. Also in there were Tessa Nelson and a girl named Tiffany [editor's note: Tiffany Lien]. Tiffany

is in Winterguard. Another girl, a sophomore named Trisia Mutschler (303 948-0806) was also in there. The girls stayed in the bath room. The bathroom door was closed. She could hear shots being fired in the cafeteria. She said that she knew what she heard were gun shots because she's heard her dad shoot in the hills.

Brianna said that the stall doors in the bathroom were locked. The girls were standing on the toilets so no one could see their feet. She saw two feet enter the bathroom. She didn't remember anything about the feet. Brianna said that she turned and looked at the other girls. It sounded like the shooter was in the bathroom. She said that she heard the person shoot the wall or something. She heard 3 to 4 shots in the bathroom. She heard what she thought was a bomb go off in the boy's bathroom. She said that when the bomb went off in the boy's bathroom, the feet she saw in the girl's bathroom were not there. She thinks that the bomb went off before the feet came into the girl's bathroom.

The girls stayed in the bathroom. Then Brianna heard shooting from upstairs, from the area of the science hall. She said that they were in the bathroom for maybe 10 to 15 minutes. She peeked out and ran down the first business hall and out the door.

Brianna never saw anyone carrying in the duffle bags. She didn't know Eric Harris or Dylan Klebold. She left her back pack in the bathroom. It was a green Coldwater Canyon back pack. It was hung on a hook in the bathroom.

Brianna said that she knew some of the girls from the TCM. They were Pauline Colby, Kristen Thiebault, and Nicole Markham. She said that she just knew them to say "hi" to. She said that she saw Kristen on April 20th during third hour. They just passed in the hall and said, "hi". She didn't remember what Kristen was wearing. Brianna said that Pauline usually works in the student store every day. She didn't see Pauline at all on Tuesday. She thought she saw her on Monday or Friday at the school store. They just, said "hi".

Brianna said that she hadn't seen Nicole since the Wednesday before the shooting.


Brianna said that the two freshman girls were saying that, "It was [REDACTED] Brianna said that while they were at the seminary later, the two girls told Trisha and Brianna that [REDACTED] [REDACTED] had been throwing bombs. Brianna has seen [REDACTED] around the school, but doesn't know him. She said that she didn't see [REDACTED] at the school that day.

OBSERVATION / INVESTIGATION:

On April 28, 1999 I was assigned to interview Jeffrey Morroni who is a student at Columbine High School and was possibly in the cafeteria at the time of the shooting.

On April 29, 1999 at 1530 I went to 7945 S. Webster St. and conducted an interview with Jeffrey Morroni. Jeffrey Morroni stated that he was in the ninth grade and had been in the cafeteria on April 20th. Jeffrey advised that he was seated at the table identified as FF on the diagram marked "Morroni" with Tim Miller, Devin Casteel, Jacob Hemelstrand, and Johnny Strobel. Jeffrey said that Tim Miller had already been interviewed. Jeffrey related that he arrived in the cafeteria about 11:10AM. He continued to say that he did not see anything like a duffel bag in the cafeteria when he got there. Jeffrey said that he had been in the cafeteria about fifteen minutes when students sitting at tables to the west of his all stood up looking out the windows. Jeffrey said he thought a fight had started outside and he stood up and looked out the window. At this same time a teacher came running into the cafeteria from the direction of the west exit door and directed all the students to get down under the tables. Jeffrey reported that immediately after the teacher told everyone to get down he heard a loud explosion and gun shots coming from outside the cafeteria. Jeffrey reported that he hid behind a trash can near his table for about thirty seconds and then he and other students crawled to the stairs leading to the south main level hall. Once at the stairs the group ran up the stairs and east through the south hall. Jeffrey said that he paused a minute to see where Tim Miller was but a teacher told him to keep running. Jeffrey said he turned and started to run again when he heard five shots that sounded like they were coming from behind him in the area of the library. Jeffrey exited the school by way of the main door and ran across Pierce Street to a park on the east side of Pierce Street. Jeffrey

said that he was in the park for ten to fifteen minutes when the group started to run again. He reported that he went with a group to the home of a female student, who he did not know, where they hid in the basement for some time. Jeffrey reported that he did not see anyone with a gun nor did he know who was shooting. Jeffrey said that he had heard no rumors about pending trouble at school on April 20th.

Jeffrey stated that he knows no one associated with the Trench Coat Mafia, nor has he had any contact with anyone associated with the Trench Coat Mafia. Jeffrey said that he does know Dylan Klebold because they shared some classes but he had no contact with Klebold. Further, Jeffrey stated that he is not familiar with any names Dylan Klebold or Eric Harris might have used on the internet.

Jeffrey advised that his back pack was a black Eddie Bauer and it contained a calculator, spanish book, and Language arts and spanish note book.

Jeffrey related an incident he had observed about a month before the shooting. He reported that he was seated in the cafeteria with friends when a Josh Nielsen walked by the table dressed in gothic clothes. As Nielsen approached Arty Mar to Jeffrey to look at him, which Jeffrey did. As Nielsen walked by the table he looked at everyone and said "I want to slit their throats." Jeffrey advised that he did not think Nielsen was associated with the Trench Coat Mafia but he wasn't sure.

Jeffrey could provide no additional information, and the interview concluded at 1605 hours.

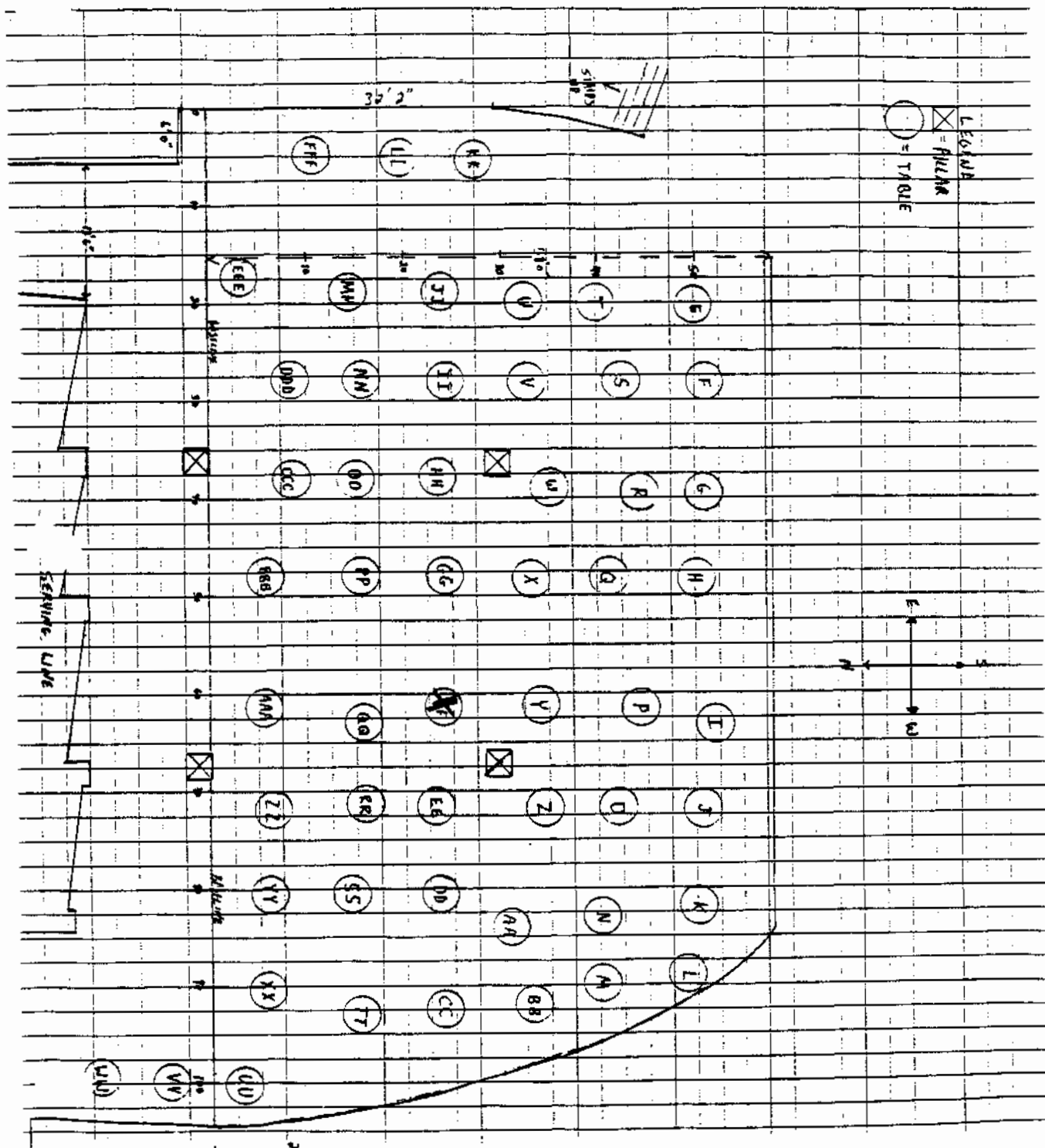

On 05/05/99 I was assigned Information Control Number DN2844 for follow up investigation. The Information Control Narrative stated that Kylee Morton is on the original Cafeteria Backpack List. On 05/07/99 I responded to 6290 South Fenton Ct., and met with Kylee Morton and her mother, Tracy Morton. Kylee Morton confirmed that she had been in the cafeteria when the incident began.

Morton said that on 04/20/99 she woke up late and her mom dropped her off at school at about 0830 hours. She went in through the main entrance of the school and went to her locker which is located by the fire doors near the auditorium. She then went to the main attendance office to drop off a note her mother had given her and then she went to her American Government class which is on the main level. She then went to her 3rd hour math class. The teacher in her American Government class is Ms. Green and her 3rd hour math class is Ms. DiManna. From 3rd hour she went to her 4th hour Spanish class which is located on the lower level. The teacher is Ms. Killion. She said that after her 4th hour she went to her locker to change her pack and then went to the A lunch. She looked at the maps provided and said that she placed her pack down at table FFF, then went to service line with her friend Sara Schweitzberger and then went and sat at table DD. She said that

at table FFF there were already people there when she arrived. She listed those people as Elsa (editor's note: Elsa Coffey-Berg).

Lacy Deal, Jenny Naifeh, Alexis Mazula, Tōry Owens, Candice Cushman, Jamie Thurmon, Sara Schweitzberger and Stephanie Lebsack. She said that she visited with the people at table DD and then made her way back to table FFF.

Morton said that when she got back to her table she heard someone yell out that someone had been shot and heard someone yell that everybody should get down. She said at first she didn't want to believe what was happening was true and she stood up for a second. She said that people had started making their way across the cafeteria toward the stairs and as she was standing looking across the cafeteria she saw a person standing with a gun. She said this person was a male and was wearing dark clothes, black pants. He was wearing a light colored shirt and she could see a long gun silhouetted in his hands. She could not describe what type of long gun it was, but said it

initially not a hand gun. She said that she also believes that this person shot the gun several times. She said that she first observed this person near table SS then he moved between the tables ending up between table EE and the pillar. She said as this person was moving through the cafeteria she turned and started to exit and could not identify this person. She said she saw people run into the kitchen and as people were running she heard what she thought were five shotgun blasts, although she did not see anyone shooting. She added that she thought the suspect she saw in the cafeteria might have had a backpack on and did have dark hair.

Morton then ran into the ladies bathroom. She said that she and approximately five other students got into the handicapped stall in the ladies room. She said they were in there for less than five minutes when they heard someone screaming to unlock the stall door. They peeked out of the bathroom and saw Mr. Anders Jr. escorting students into the auditorium area and on to the stage. Morton said she went with the group into the auditorium and on to the stage and down the stairs. She said they started to go up through the auditorium when got to the back they sat in some seats. Mr. Anders Jr. then told them to get on the floor. They again heard some type of shooting or

explosions coming from what Morton believed was the cafeteria area. A janitor then came in and told

them to go out through some back doors which exited into the far language hallway and out through the far language wing into the parking lot. Morton said that while she was in the auditorium and while she was exiting the fire alarm was activated.

Morton said that while she was exiting the building and running to Leawood Park she heard several more big explosions. At the park she was able to make contact with her brother who took her home and she was able to contact her mother by telephone. Tracy Morton indicated she received the call at 11:42 a.m.

Morton describes her backpack as maroon in color, Jansport, with her name on the back of the front pocket. He backpack contains her language books, notebooks, a reading book, numerous folders and homework papers, a day planner and her glasses. Morton said she was wearing a black skirt, a white shirt with a black sweater and full black shoes.

Morton said that last semester she had a physical education class with Eric Harris. She said that prior to the class he always wore army or a black trench coat. She said he seemed to be very withdrawn and didn't really connect with anyone in the class. She had no particular problem with Harris in the class. She said she observed no one picking on him, although the seniors made fun of the underclassmen routinely and that everyone sort of expected that, but he was not singled out.

Morton could provide no further information on the trench coat mafia or Eric Harris or Dylan Klebold. She does not have a ICQ account and has not used the internet to access any of the trench coat mafia sites. She had not heard of any students talking about bomb making or gun acquisitions and does not know anyone with a double pierced eyebrow. She was also not present for the Rebel News Network, Thought of the Day.

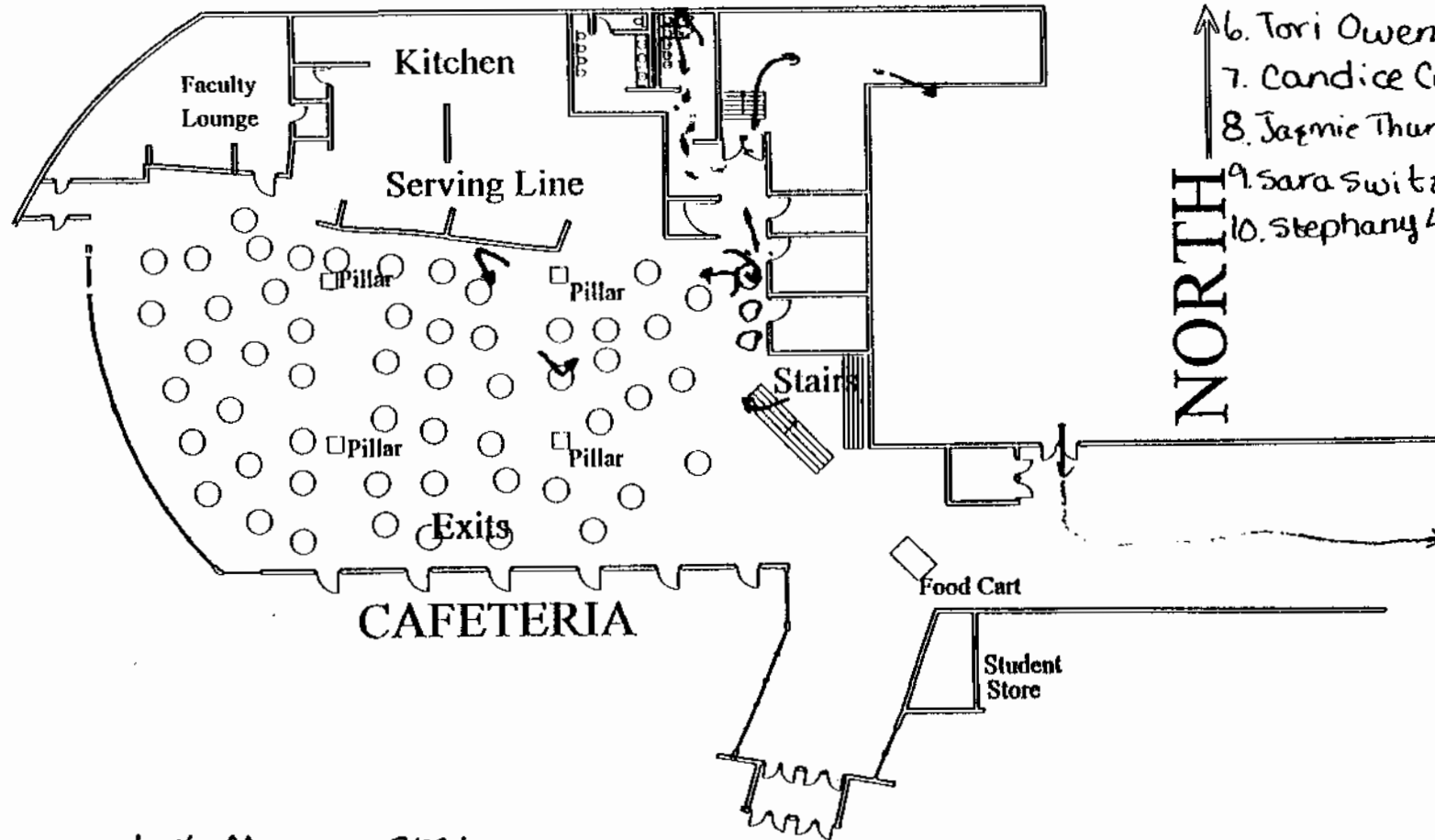

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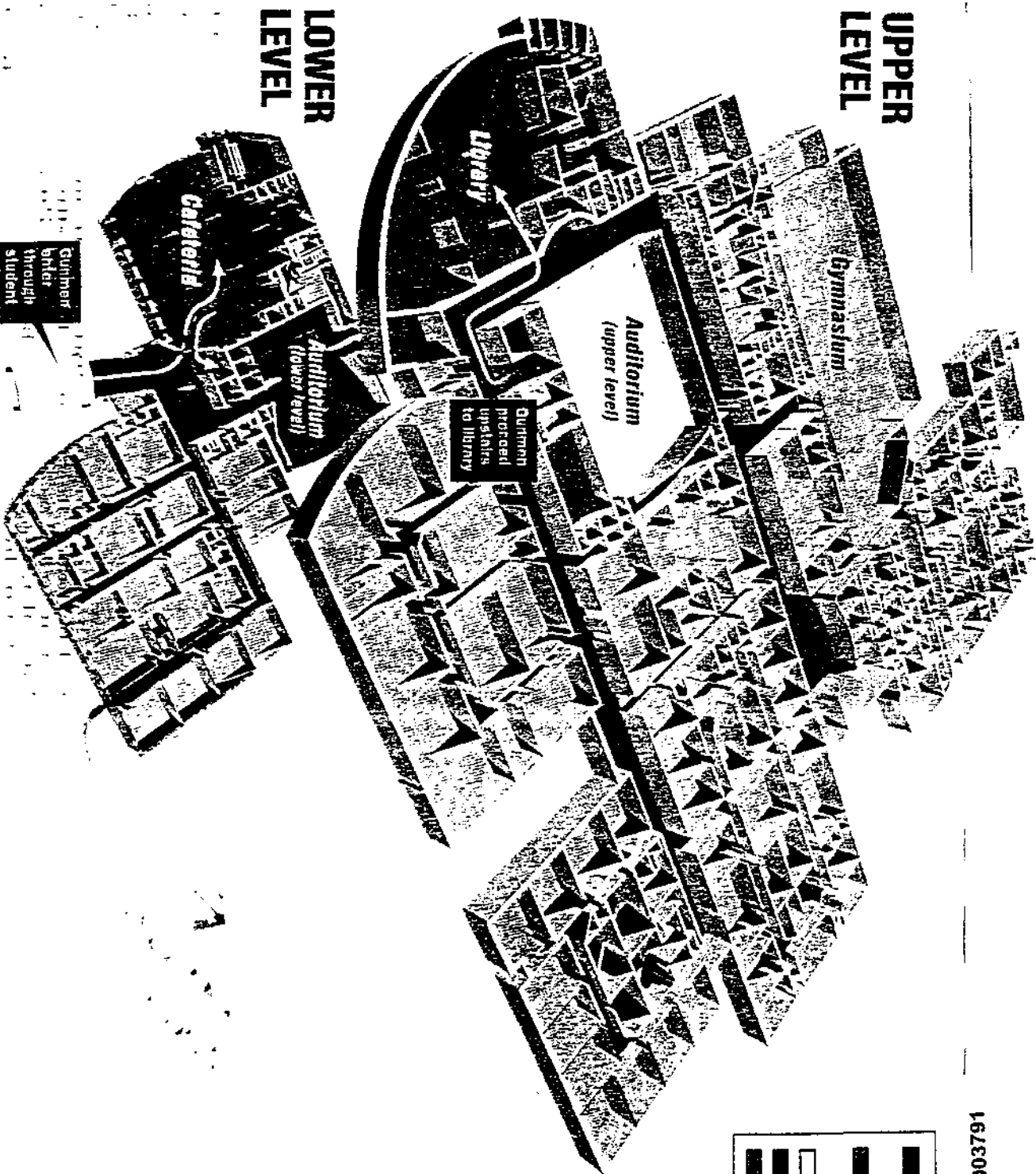

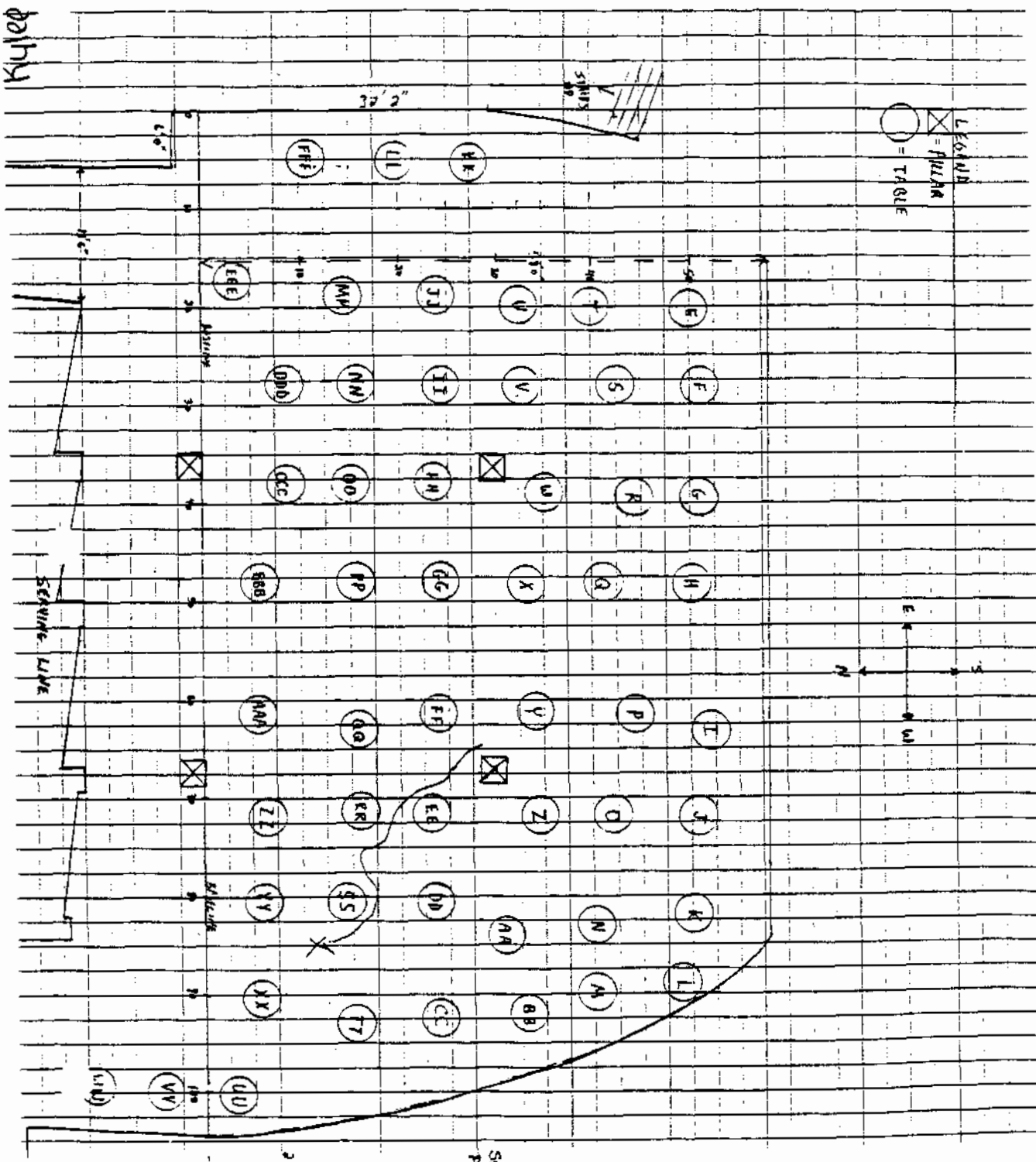

On April 29, 1999, between the hours of 0922 and 1014, I had an opportunity to speak with Lauren reference the incident that occurred at Columbine High School on April 20, 1999. Also present for the interview were her parents, Jeff and Kathleen.

Lauren stated that on Tuesday, April 20, 1999, she arrived in the cafeteria of the school around 1030 hours, stating that she does not have a fourth period class and she usually spends most of her time down in the cafeteria area. Lauren identified, from a map


I provided that she sat at table NN and that at the table with her were her friends, Naomi Lucero, telephone number (303) 973-1368, Jenny Pollack, telephone number (303) 933-4625, (Justina) Tina Thorsen, telephone number unknown, Natalie Baker, telephone number unknown, Cassie (last name unknown) [editor's note: possibly Kelcy Fowler], telephone number unknown, Nicole Ray, telephone number unknown, and Amy Stone, telephone number unknown.

Lauren was asked when she initially arrived at the cafeteria if she observed two large duffle bags or sports type bags, describing one as being blue in color, and another being an orangish red, possibly near the table where she was seated in the cafeteria. I also asked her if she remembers seeing anybody that might have brought those packs in and then walked away from them. Lauren told me that she did not see the two duffle bags. I asked Lauren when she first noticed something was wrong in the cafeteria and to describe the events. She stated that between 1125 and 1130 hours she remembers that an unidentified janitor came from the west side of the cafeteria area and that he was telling everyone in the cafeteria to get down under the tables. Shortly after this she remembers hearing somebody near the west windows of the cafeteria yell, "He's got a gun." At this point she crouched down under the table, where she remained for just a few seconds. She stated during the incident the students who were near the west end of the cafeteria started moving east, at which time she got up and moved east toward the staircase in the cafeteria. Once she reached the staircase she proceeded up to the main level and headed east, passing the science and math rooms, where she exited from the high school.

Lauren was asked if she ever saw a gunman in the cafeteria or outside west of the cafeteria. She stated that while she was in the school she never saw a gunman. She didn't stay in the cafeteria for a long period of time. After she exited from Columbine High School she remembers that she went to the park just east of the school, where she remained for a short period of time. While at the park she remembers hearing gunshots and from the park she ran to her friend, Lindsay Blair's residence.

Lauren was asked if she knew Eric Harris or Dylan Klebold. She stated that last semester she had a third period gym class with Eric Harris. She stated that she did not know the individual by name and that she never met Dylan Klebold. Lauren was asked if she knew of any other members of the "Trench Coat Mafia." Again she stated that she didn't know any of the members. I asked if she knew about Eric Harris' web site. She stated up until she heard the news reports about it, she had no idea about the web site.

Again, I verified that Lauren did not see the two large duffle bags or sports bags described earlier in the cafeteria, nor did she see any gunman at Columbine High School. Lauren was asked if she could recall any other classmates who were seated in the cafeteria around her. She told me that she remembers Brittany Barry being in the cafeteria, Lauren (last name unknown), Britney Gillette, and Brock (last name unknown). Lauren was asked who else exited from the school with her and remained in the park just east of the school. She stated that Julie Naslund, telephone number unknown, Marni MacClennan, telephone number (303) 932-0878, Chanelle Plank, telephone number (303) 904-1614, and Renee Shirek, telephone number unknown, also exited the school and stayed at the park with her.

Lauren was asked if there were any rumors around the school prior to the incident of something "brewing." She stated that the only thing she knew about April 20th was National Marijuana Day. Other than that she could not provide any additional information.

At the completion of my interview, Lauren was provided a map of the cafeteria and asked to depict where she was seated and her movement out of the cafeteria. A copy of that diagram is attached to report.

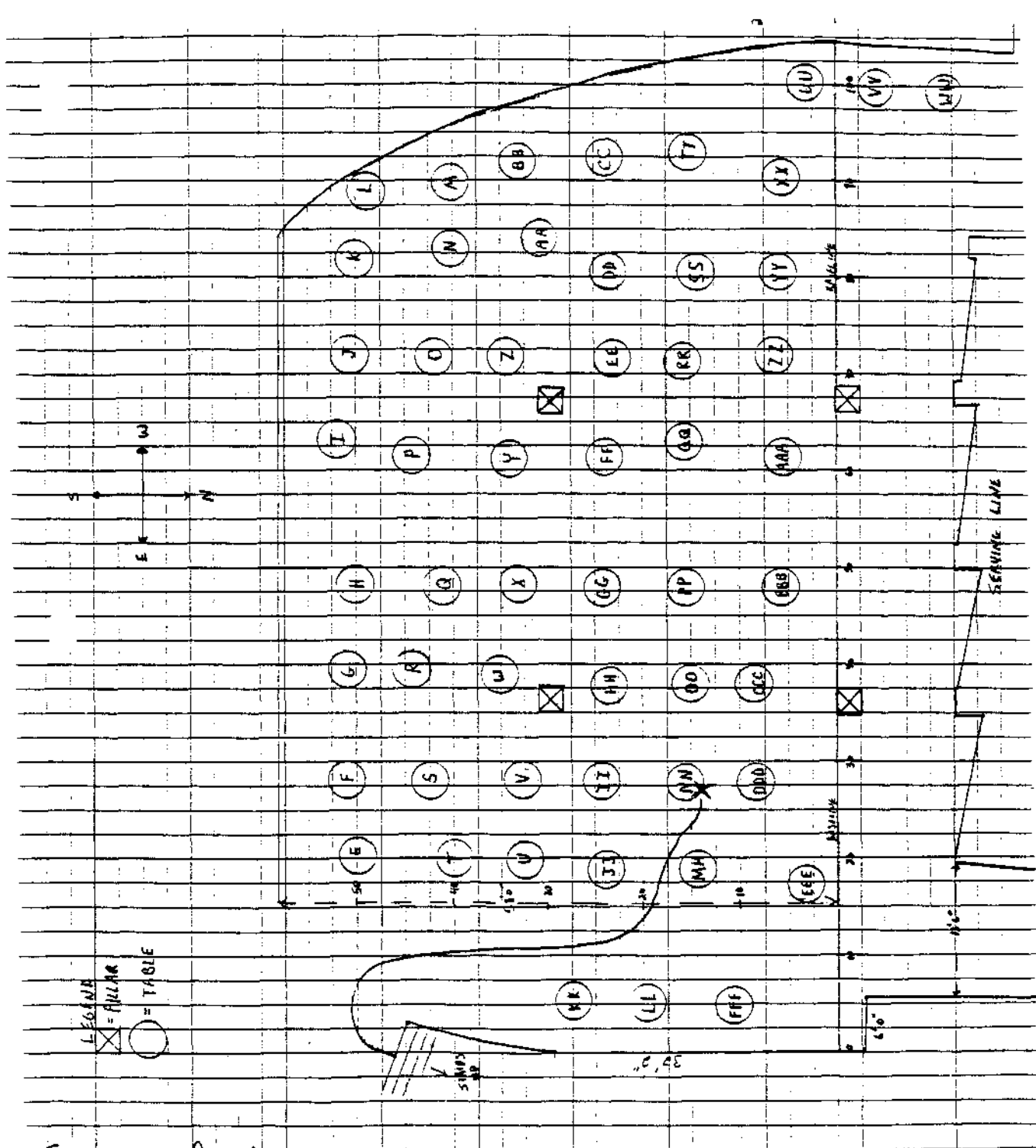

INVESTIGATION:

On 05-07-99 at 0830 hours I interviewed Dawn Muirhead in the presence of her parents at their business, Custom Air Inc., 3930 South Decatur Street.

Dawn stated that her mother drove her to school the morning of 04-20-99 and she arrived at 0720 hours. She stated she entered the school through the front entrance and saw nothing unusual going on outside. She stated her fourth class is an off hour and she entered the cafeteria between 1015 hours and 1020 hours. She stated she used the elevator to get to the cafeteria.

Dawn stated she knew who HARRIS was but she didn't know who KLEBOLD was. She did not know him by name, only recognized who he was. She stated she did not see them at all the morning of the shooting. Dawn stated she was not familiar with the "trench coat mafia" group at all, but was aware that they existed.

Dawn stated that when she got to the cafeteria there were about 30 kids there already. She stated that after she got something to eat she and Loni Brown and Katie Thompson sat outside. Dawn indicated on the larger diagram where she sat with an "X". She stated they were outside perhaps five minutes before they heard shots. She stated there were kids outside in the parking lot at the time and she did not see anyone wearing a long, black coat. She stated there were girls that ran and hid behind cars on the west side of the school and she indicated where on the diagram. She also indicated on the diagram where she saw a girl fall to the ground, this is where she put a circle and a "X".

Dawn stated she ran into the cafeteria through one of the south exit doors. She heard someone say that someone has a gun. She never saw the shooter. She stated she got under the first table near the student entrance. She then ran east in the lower level hallway into the last foreign language room. She stated there were 20 to 30 kids and two teachers with her. She did not know what the teachers' names were. At this time the fire alarm went off. She heard shots being fired upstairs. She stated they were in the room for approximately ten minutes before they went out the south door. Dawn stated she and others ran through the junior/senior parking lot. She did not notice any car coming or going at this time from the parking lot. She stated they stayed on the west side of Pierce and went to the first house off of Pierce south of the school. She stated this was a seminary house and she stayed there for three to four hours.

Dawn stated she left her backpack next to the table where she was hiding under. Inside the backpack she had her school ID, her wallet, a geometry book, and a government book. She was wearing black shorts and blue shirt.

She stated she thought she remembered the thought for the day as being something like, "I bet you wish you weren't here".

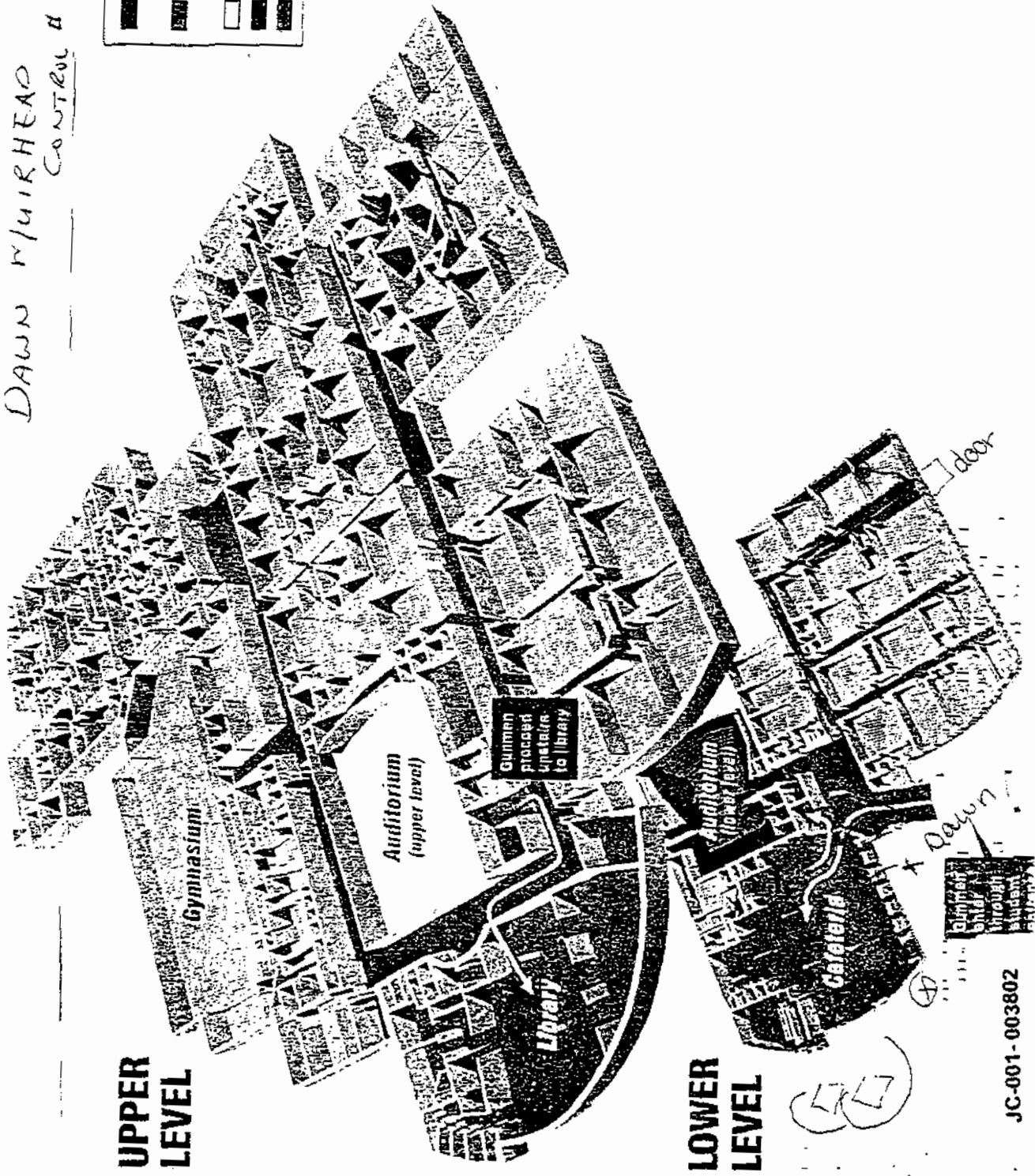

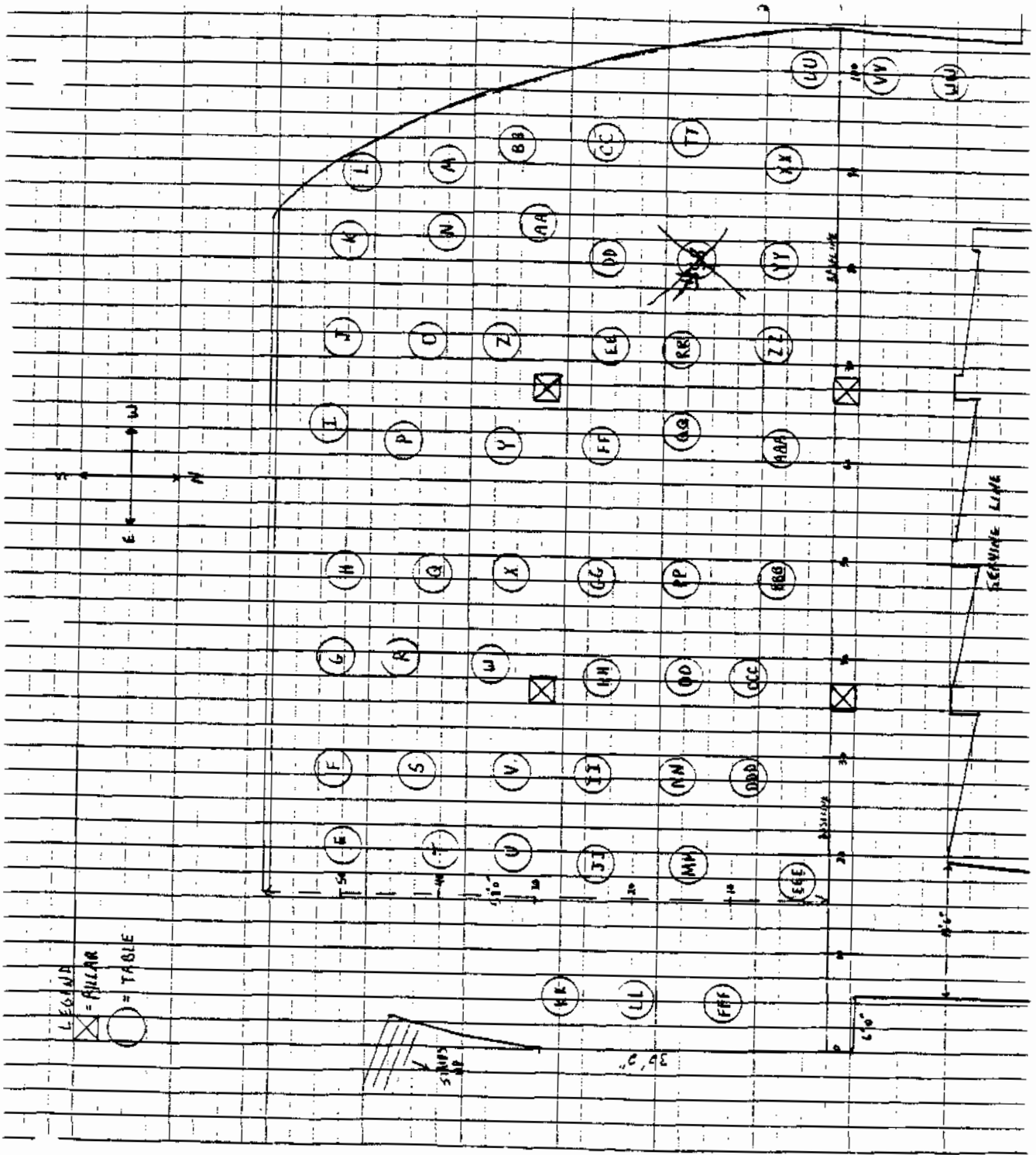



MULLEN said he, along with Michael KISH and Sean NOSSAMAN, was seated in the cafeteria at a table near the teacher's lounge at approximately 11:20 - 11:30 a.m. eating lunch. MULLEN heard three loud popping sounds and then saw three people lying on the floor. One of the people lying on the floor was a freshman complaining that he could not move. MULLEN said they heard a very loud blast and could feel the concussion. He believed the blast originated from 75 - 100 feet away. A custodian, known only to

MULLEN as TOM, told everyone to get on the floor. MULLEN said he and KISH ran into the kitchen and hid inside of a bathroom with four other students. According to MULLEN, he stayed inside the bathroom for approximately 45 minutes to an hour. MULLEN stated Dustin GORTON and Brent KOSTALNICK, two of the people hiding in the bathroom, ventured out to see if the cafeteria was clear while MULLEN stayed and comforted a frightened female student. MULLEN stated that after GORTON and KOSTALNICK indicated it was clear to leave, MULLEN went to the dishwashing room, banged on the door in and attempted to coax those hiding inside to leave with them. The people inside had barricaded themselves in and refused to come out. MULLEN stated they heard noises above the ceiling tile so the group moved faster to get out of the cafeteria. MULLEN said he heard a loud bang of something heavy falling through the ceiling. The group then ran through the cafeteria and hid behind cars in the parking lot near the stairs. Other students in the parking lot said a teacher had fallen through the ceiling [editor's note: this was Joyce Jankowski]. MULLEN and KISH met up again with NOSSAMAN in the parking lot and the three of them later ran to the soccer field where they took cover inside of a police car. The police transported them to Caley Court where a triage and holding area was established. MULLEN stated the cafeteria had appeared normal prior to the attack. MULLEN said he did not notice any strange backpacks or bags in the cafeteria. He also said he did not see the shooters but could hear them coming down the stairs as he ran inside the kitchen.

Eventually, he and others exited the restroom. He tried to get the people in the closet to come with him but they wouldn't respond. He went out the west door of the Commons and hid behind a blue car with a sheriff. He then ran to the soccer fields. He also recalled smoke coming in under the bathroom door which prompted them to leave.

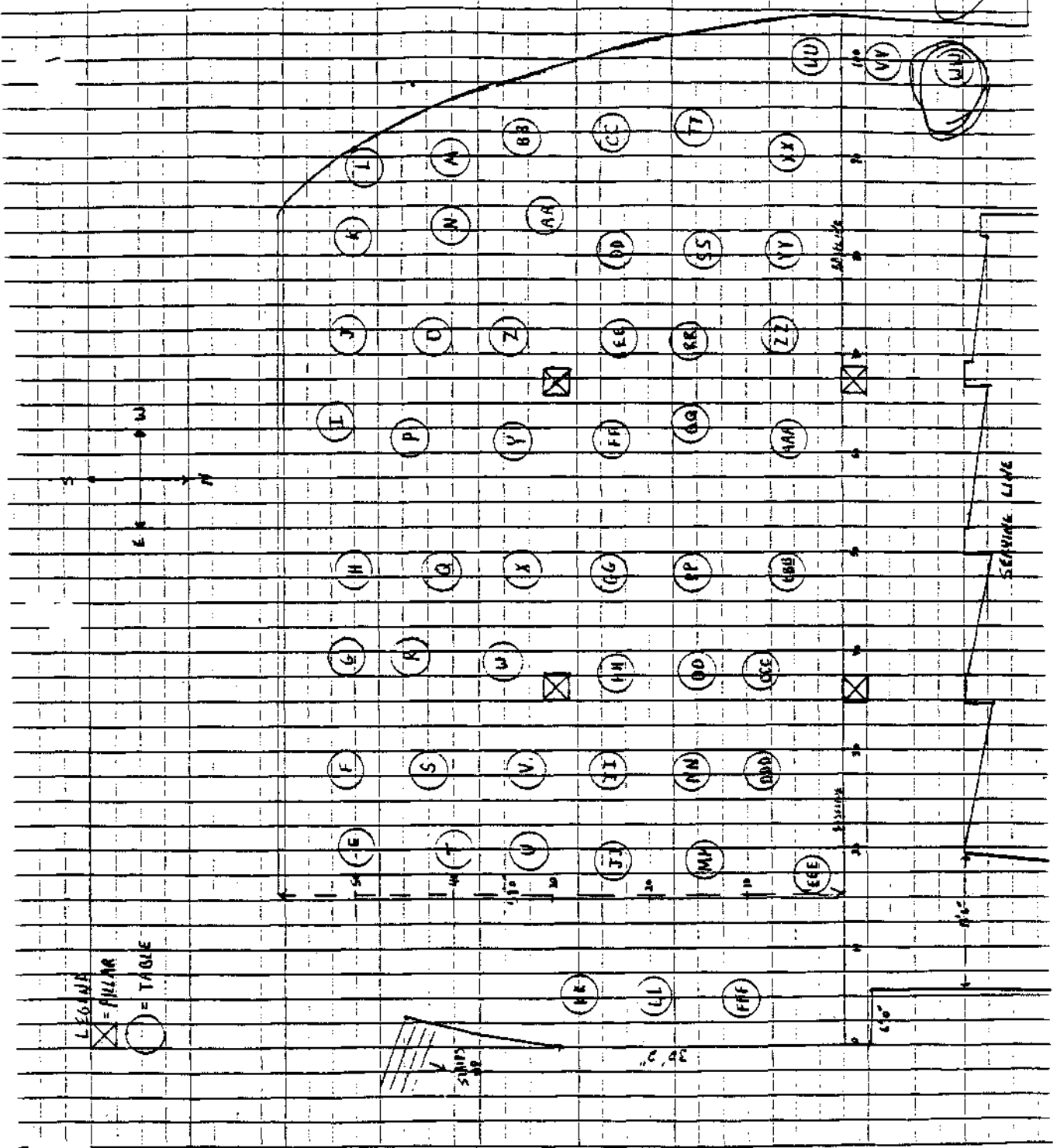

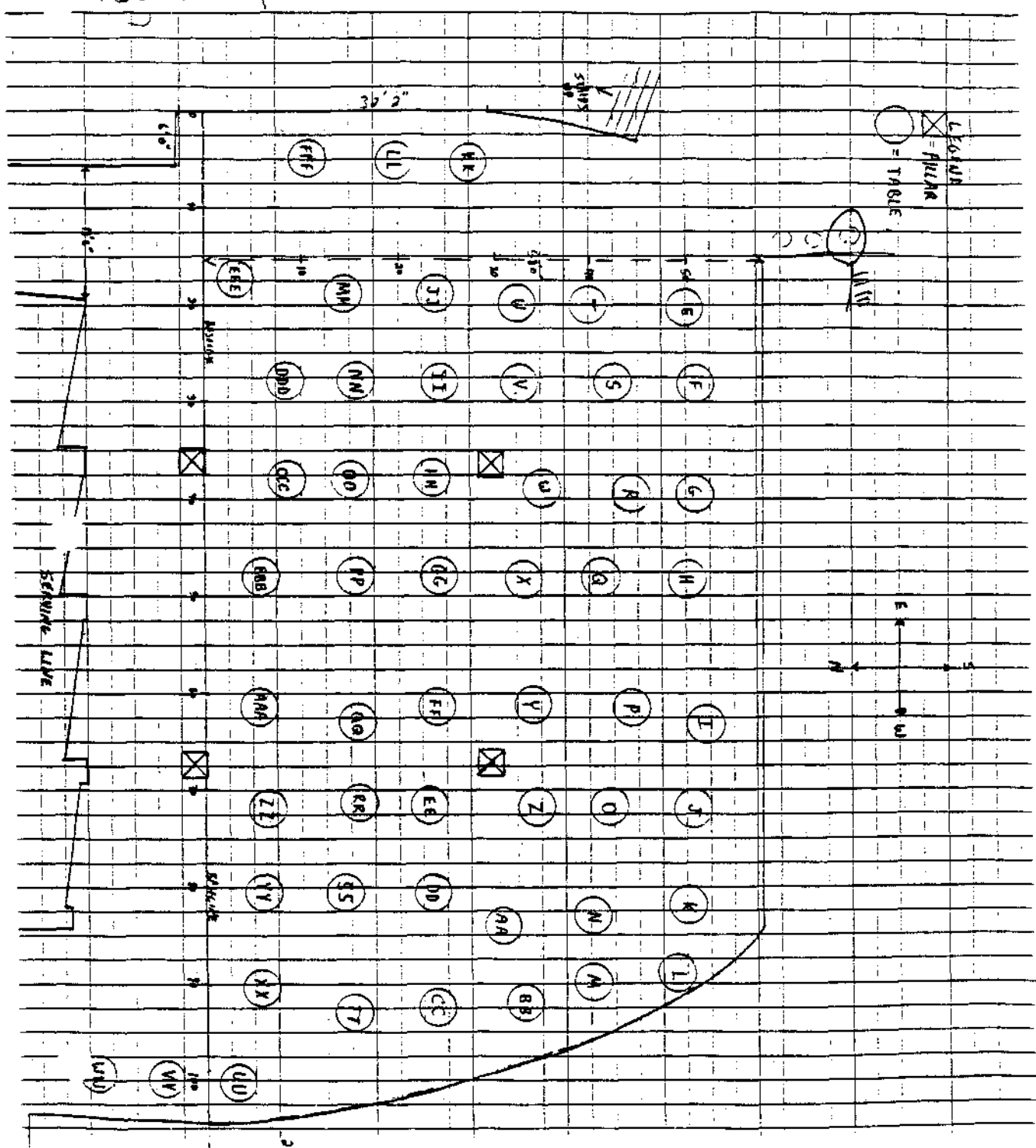

On 4-27-99, between the hours of 1517 and 1604, I had an opportunity to interview Jamie in reference to what she observed in the cafeteria at Columbine H.S. on 4-20-99. Also present during the interview was her mother, Marilyn.

Jamie stated on 4-20-99, that she had just left her 4th period class which is language. Jamie said the passing bell rings at 1110 hours, and she arrived at the cafeteria around 1118 to 1120 hours. She stated the reason she was late in getting to the cafeteria was that she had to go to the office to pay for her school parking pass. After she left the school office, she stated she walked down the main hallway, until she reached the middle hallway on the left, at which time she proceeded south through the school and down to the science and math hallway, at which time she proceeded west to the stairs and down into the cafeteria. 

reached the cafeteria area she identified table "AAA" as the table she sat at. Also at the table were her friends, Brittany Davies, Lindsay Wyant, Brandy (unk last name's) [editor's note: Brandi Wiseman], Tiffany (unk last name) [editor's note: Tiffany Spevak], Tiffany's boyfriend, possibly first name of John [editor's note: Jean Richer]. I asked Jamie if upon arrival into the cafeteria area if she observed two large duffel bags or sports type bag. I described one as being blue in color, and the other as being orange-ish/red in color. I asked if she observed those packs or if she had observed anyone bring those packs in the cafeteria and place them in the general area of her table. She stated due to the amount of backpacks inside the cafeteria she did not see anybody carrying anything like that and leave it in the cafeteria. Jamie said after she placed her backpack at her table she went to the food service line where she got her lunch and later returned back to her table. Shortly after she sat down she remembers hearing two or three "pops" described as gunshots outside, just west of the cafeteria area. Jamie stated shortly after the pops she observed a school teacher by the name of Mr. Sanders, standing near the north/west doors of the cafeteria where he was telling students to get down under their tables. Also by Mr. Sanders was a janitor who she described as short, skinny, and this individual was also telling them to get down. Shortly after this Jamie explained hearing an explosion, telling me she believed it was just overhead and possibly in the vicinity of the library upstairs, at which time herself and other individuals went into the kitchen hallway where there were about "60" students gathered and two teachers, Ms. Abbott and Ms. Killian. From the kitchen area they went into the auditorium which allowed them to gain access into the main upper level of the school at which time they went past the tech lab, past the counselors room where they exited a north/west door, at which time the students ran north to where they jumped a fence and proceeded into Clement Park.

Jamie was asked if she ever observed a gunman while she was in the cafeteria area or after she exited Columbine H.S. She stated she never saw a gunman. Jamie was asked to describe her dress on 4-20-99. She said she was dressed in a black tank top, a kaiki colored skirt. She was wearing black slip on shoes. She was also asked if she left any other additional items inside Columbine H.S. when she left on Tuesday. She stated the only items she left was her backpack which was located in the cafeteria area, and of course she had school books in her locker.

Jamie was asked if she knew the members of the Trench Coat Mafia, to include Eric Harris and Dylan Klebold. She stated she never knew the individuals and didn't know much about the group. I asked if she had overheard any rumors in school reference to this incident possibly occurring. She said the only thing she overheard was that there was a bomb threat made at the school on Monday, 4-19-99. Jamie was asked if she recognized any other people sitting at other tables around her. She stated at table

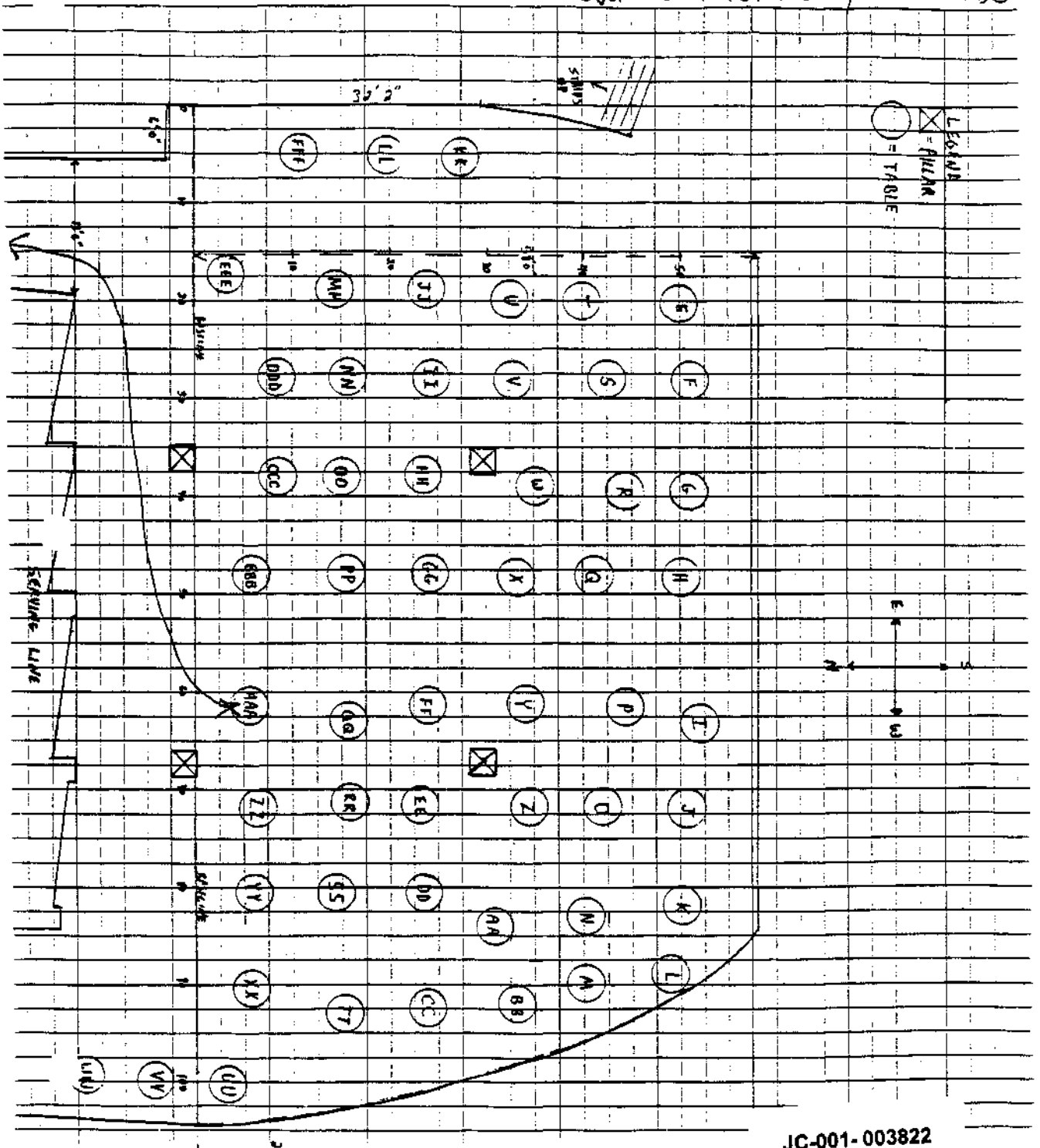

Jennifer Ann Munson, DOB 09/07/1984, 6553 South Brentwood Way, Littleton, Colorado, telephone (303)742-0839, a student at Columbine High School, was interviewed at her home in the presence of her father, Larry Munson, by Special Agent (SA) Ricky V. Wright regarding the incident that took place on 04/20/1999 at Columbine High School. After being advised as

to the identity of the interviewing agent and the nature of the interview, Munson provided the following information:

At approximately 11:08 am, Munson got out of dance class, which was in the wrestling room, and left the gymnasium area. Munson went west down the north main hall and then south by the library and down the stairs to the cafeteria. Munson sat down at a lunchroom table (marked V on diagram sketch) and noticed that she had lost her purse. Munson decided to go and look in the classrooms she was in earlier that day. Munson left the cafeteria and went to the math hall and the language arts hall and looked in classrooms there. Munson then went to the choir room, which is just east of the stairs to the cafeteria and found her purse. Someone had turned in the purse to the choir teacher, Mr. Andres. Munson does not recall seeing anything unusual while she was looking for her purse. Munson then returned to the cafeteria and sat down. Munson remembers that Valerie Jugert, Sara Filipiak, Alex Goldberg, Lindsay Blair, Naomi Lucero, and Brandi Malonson, were also sitting at the table. Munson was facing east. Munson recalls that Valerie Jugert was sitting to her left.

Munson got up and got a soda from a soda machine in the northeast corner of the cafeteria and sat back down. She was drinking her soda when she saw about 20 students running down the north side of the cafeteria toward the stairs. Mr. Sanders was running down the south side of the cafeteria telling everyone to get down. Munson got under the table and could hear popping sounds coming from outside. Munson recalls that there were a lot of people screaming while they were under the tables. Everyone then got up and started to run. Munson got up and ran up the stairs and then east down the south main hall and out the exit at the end of the hall. Once outside, Munson ran across Pierce Street to Leawood Park.

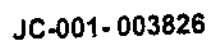

I then went to the pop machines by the teachers' lounge. I noticed some commotion at the door. We stayed there for about 5 minutes. I heard shots while under the table. I saw people running toward the other end of the cafeteria. I got up and ran toward the east end of the room. I grabbed my backpack off the table. I had been with my friends. I ran into the lower auditorium and out the other doors. I went out by the teachers parking and came home to call my mother.

That night I showed my mother, Colleen, my 1998 year book and pointed out Stair. This same picture was shown to Det. Polak. I also signed a photo copy of the year book picture of Stair.

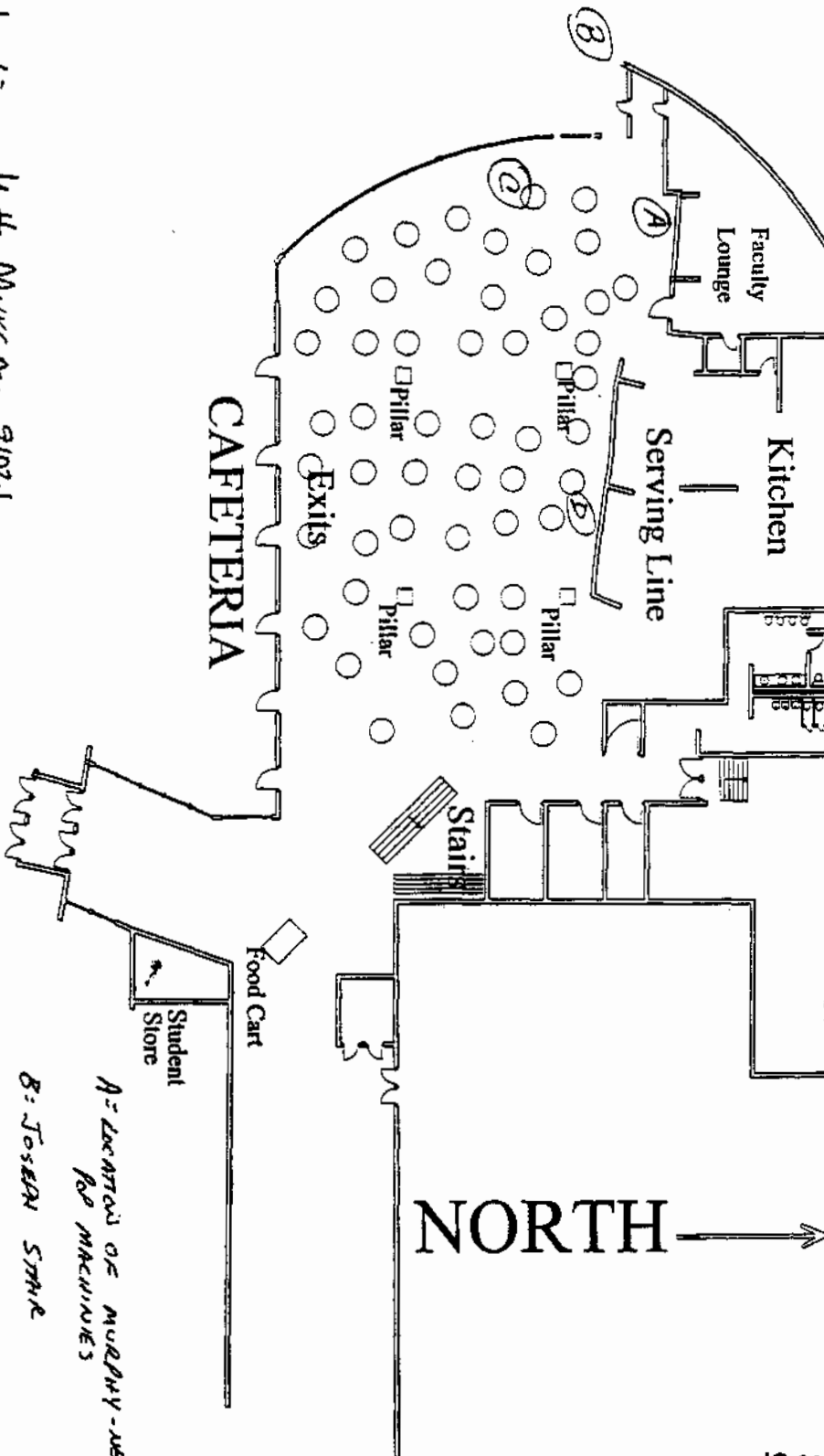

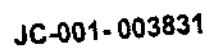



INVESTIGATION:

On 04-30-99, at about 11:15 a.m., I interviewed CHS student Leiha Murphy at her residence as follow up to DN2059 Leiha's mother. Colleen Murphy, was present during the interview.

Leiha told me that on 04-20-99, at about 11:10 a.m., she had just finished her fourth period class. Consistent with her normal routine, Leiha said that she met two other students, who she identified as Ann Marie Kelly and Tasha Nygard, and that the three of them then walked downstairs and entered the cafeteria to eat lunch.

Upon entering the cafeteria, Leiha said that she placed her backpack on top of lunch table BBB or AAA. When asked if she could remember specifically which table it was, Leiha said, "I'm thinking more AAA." Leiha said her table "was right by the serving line." After placing her backpack on said table, Leiha said that she entered the serving line in order to purchase a school lunch. Leiha told me that while standing in the serving line, she remembered hearing a bell ring. I asked Leiha which bell she was referring to. She said it was the "five minute bell," which indicated to her that it was 11:15 a.m. Leiha said that she obtained a lunch from the serving line and brought it back to her table. Leiha said that she set her lunch on the table and then remembered that she wanted to get a soda pop. At that time, Leiha said that she remembered seeing students Ann Marie Kelly, Tasha Nygard, Tiffany Spevak, Jean Richer, and Brandi Wiseman sitting at said table. Leiha said she turned around and started walking toward the soda pop / vending machines located in the northwest corner of the cafeteria. Leiha said that as she walked

toward the soda machines, she stopped approximately midway between table WW and the corner of the serving line, when she noticed "approximately ten to fifteen students" congregated near the exit door, also located in the northwest corner of the cafeteria.

Leiha told me that she assumed that there was a fight taking place outside, and that upon looking through the windows on the west side of the cafeteria, directly west of tables WW and VV, she saw an individual whom she identified as [REDACTED]. Leiha told me that [REDACTED] was standing on or near the sidewalk, approximately ten to fifteen feet west of the windows next to tables WW and VV. Leiha said "I saw [REDACTED]. I think I saw him because he was away from the crowd outside." I asked Leiha what this individual was wearing. Leiha said, "He was wearing his trenchcoat and he had his hair down." Leiha told me that the trenchcoat was black. I asked Leiha if she happened to notice anything unusual or any distinguishing marks or features on the trenchcoat. Leiha said that she did not. I asked Leiha if she was certain that this individual was [REDACTED]. Leiha said, "Oh yeah, I'm certain." She then said, "I saw his face full on. I remember seeing his face completely." Leiha then said, "I remember him graduating last year." I asked Leiha if she personally knew [REDACTED]. Leiha told me that she did not personally know him, but remembered him from last year. Leiha said that on certain occasions, she remembered him wearing "makeup on his face and hands" and that because of that, he stood out from other students.

I asked Leiha what this individual was doing when she saw him. Leiha said, "I remember him standing. I thought he had just been involved in the fight." Leiha said that she did not remember him holding anything in his hands. Leiha said, "I remember him running, starting to run." I asked Leiha if she remembered in what direction this individual ran. Leiha told me that she did not remember the direction. I asked Leiha if she specifically remembered this individual actually running. Leiha said, "He was either walking really fast or he was running. It was not just a stroll or just a regular walk."

Leiha told me that after she recognized [REDACTED] he stood in place for approximately fifteen seconds, whereupon she heard someone from the crowd yell to 'get down.' Leiha said she does not remember specifically who yelled this, but thinks it may have been a custodian whom she remembered standing by the door among the crowd of students. Leiha described the custodian as a white male, "upper thirties to mid forties."

Leiha told me that simultaneously with the command to get down, several students within the crowd near the northwest door began to scream and dive under tables. Leiha told me that she quickly ran to and crawled under table WW or VV. Leiha said that she could not remember which table it was, but confirmed it was one of said tables as indicated on the cafeteria map. Leiha said that the table she crawled under "was right against the wall," indicating the west wall on the north end of the cafeteria. Leiha told me that she remembered students Mike Lavan, Shannon Ryan, and Tasha Olson being with her underneath table VV or WW. While underneath said table, Leiha told me that she heard a loud pop, which she thought was a single gunshot. Leiha told me that she remained under the table, facing west, for approximately two minutes. During that time, Leiha said that she did not see anything that was taking place outside because she was facing the wall below the bank of windows. Leiha said that during this time, there were numerous screams and a great deal of commotion among the students nearby and from other students within the cafeteria. Leiha said that after about two minutes, and while still underneath the table, she turned around (facing east) to see where her friends were. Leiha said that she "saw people running up the (interior) stairs," and decided to leave the cafeteria as quickly as possible.

Leiha said she then crawled out from underneath the table and ran eastward, in front of the serving line, back to table AAA or BBB where she retrieved her backpack, and then continued eastward to the northeast corner of the cafeteria, near some bathrooms. Leiha told me that near the bathrooms, she remembered seeing a teacher, who she identified as Mrs. Regnier, who was ushering students away from the windows and into the bathrooms on that side of the cafeteria. Leiha told me that she thinks teacher Dave Sanders may also have been in that area, ushering students up the stairs, but is not sure. Leiha said that she did not enter a bathroom. Leiha said that while she was near the bathrooms, she "heard two explosions in that upper hallway," referring to the hallway up the interior stairway. Leiha said that she was eventually ushered out of the cafeteria, along with students Ann Marie Kelly and Tasha Nygard. Leiha told me that she exited the lower level by way of the auditorium, which lead upstairs to the upper level of the school. Leiha said that she and others then exited the auditorium and eventually the school through the doors located on the east side of the gymnasium.

Leiha told me that at no time while inside the cafeteria or later while exiting the school did she ever see anyone with a gun or anyone doing any shooting. Leiha told me that she did not see Eric Harris or Dylan Klebold at any time. Leiha told me that

Leiha told me that, to her knowledge, up to the time when she observed [REDACTED] standing outside, and the commotion that ensued thereafter, there had been no unusual commotion taking place inside the cafeteria.

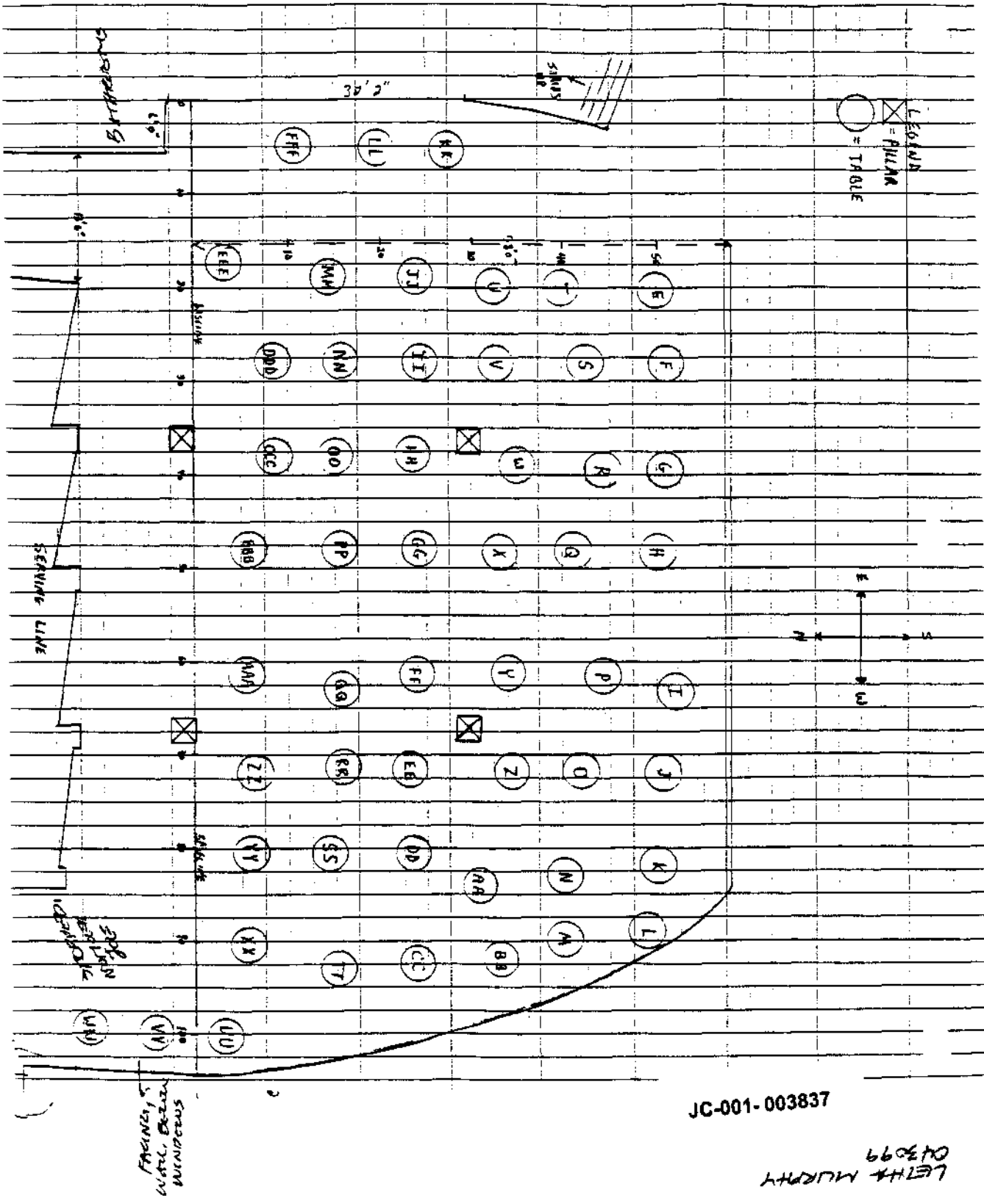
Prior to concluding the interview, I presented Leiha with a photo lineup to see if she could identify the individual who she had seen outside the cafeteria. 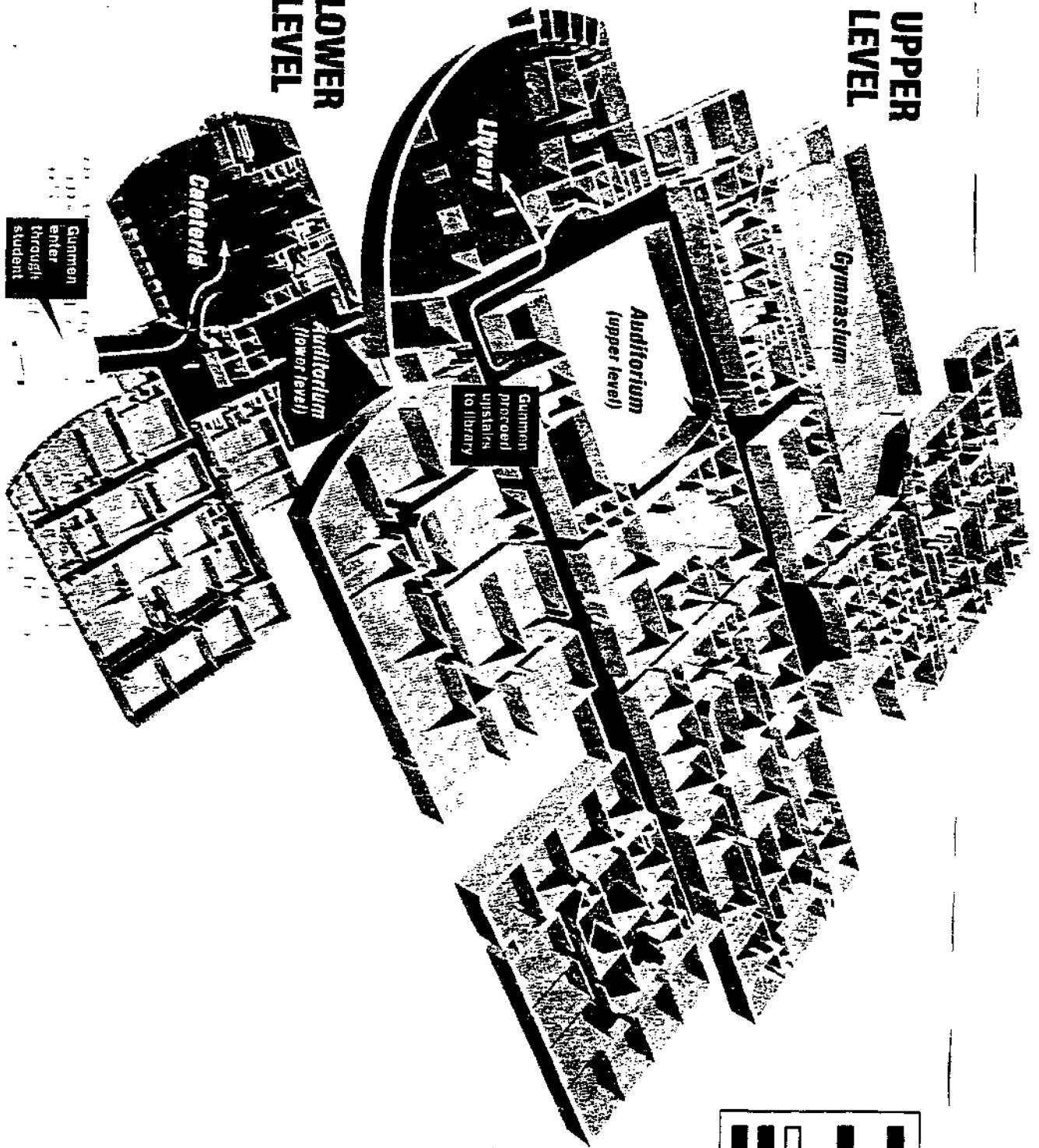

INVESTIGATION:

On 10-22-99 Columbine High School Student Leiha Murphy was re-interviewed at 5352 South Holland Street. Her mother, Colleen Murphy, was present for the interview.

The purpose for the re-interview was to clarify Murphy's observations during the April 20th shootings at Columbine High School, specifically the statements made by Murphy during an interview on 4-30-99 with Task Force investigators. In that interview, Murphy stated that she was certain that she saw [REDACTED] wearing a trench coat and standing near the sidewalk approximately 10 to 15 feet west of the cafeteria windows when the shooting started.

Murphy told me that she was in the cafeteria when the shooting started. Murphy said she noticed several students standing near the door at the northwest corner of the cafeteria near the teacher's lounge. Murphy looked out the cafeteria windows and saw a male wearing a trench coat standing at the bottom of the cement stairs. A short time later Murphy heard someone yell that someone had been shot, at which time Murphy saw the male in the trench coat run. Murphy then hid underneath a table in the cafeteria for three to five minutes. She then got up and ran towards the elevators, when she heard an explosion from upstairs. Murphy stated that she ran through the auditorium and then exited the school through a door by the weight room and art room. While running out of the school, Murphy noticed that the glass was broken out of the main school doors.

Later in the afternoon of 4-20-99 Murphy heard on the news that members of the Trench Coat Mafia were involved in the shooting. At that time, Murphy recalled [REDACTED] being a member of the Trench Coat Mafia. She looked up his photograph in the high school yearbook and recognized [REDACTED] as the same person she saw in the trench coat standing at the bottom of the cement stairs. Murphy stated that she saw [REDACTED] at school several times during her freshman year "enough times to recognize him." Murphy stated that she does not recall ever seeing Dylan Klebold at school.

I explained to Murphy that [REDACTED] has been interview by Task Force investigators and that he was submitted to, and passed, a polygraph test. I further advised Murphy that [REDACTED] has an alibi which places him in his home at the time of the shootings.

I then showed Murphy a series of four photographs (#44-A, 51-A, 52-A, 53-A) taken from the video camera in the cafeteria. Photographs 51-A, 52-A and 53-A all picture Dylan Klebold. After looking at those photos, Murphy agreed that the person she saw in a trench coat standing at the bottom of the cement stairs certainly could have been Dylan Klebold, and not [REDACTED]

Without going into specific detail, I explained to Murphy and her mother that the investigation into the shootings has been extremely thorough and at this point Task Force investigators can confidently conclude, based on the evidence, that Eric Harris and Dylan Klebold acted alone.

The interview was concluded with Murphy and her mother understanding and feeling comfortable with my explanation. Additionally, Murphy understood that the person she initially thought was [REDACTED] was, in fact, Dylan Klebold.

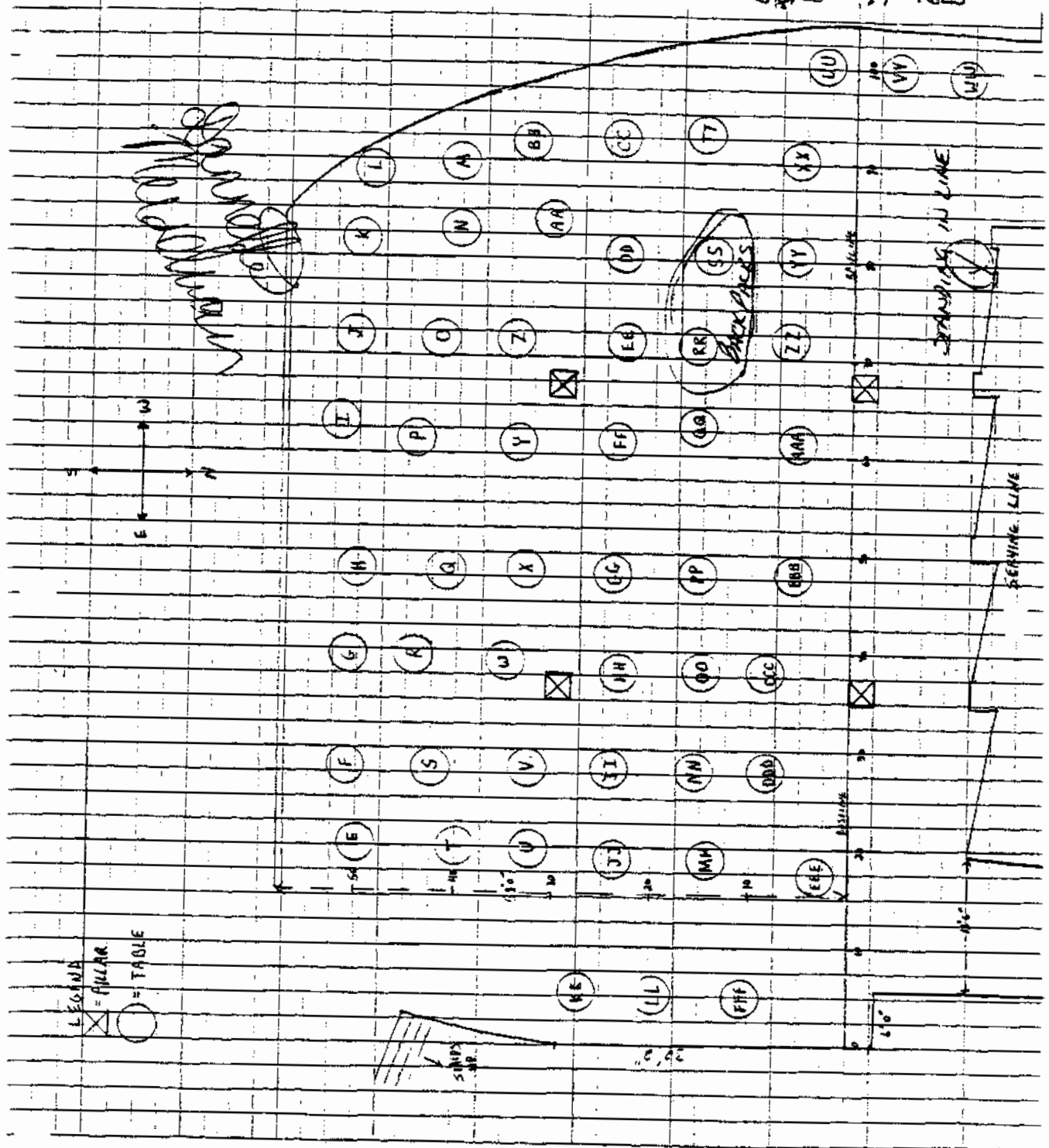

Then someone banged on the door. Eventually they opened the door to some teachers who directed them to the lower auditorium. The special ed kids were there. We stayed there for 15- 20 minutes. The sound of bombs and faint sound of bullets continued. The teachers directed them to the doors and we ran. More shots were heard. On June 4, 1999, this investigator met with Trisia Mutschler and her mother, Jeanie. Trisia advised that she arrived in the cafeteria at approximately 11:15 a.m., and went directly to the school store. She said there was some unknown commotion which she assumed was a fight until she heard someone yelling to the students, "get down." She said she then heard someone yelling for them to run. She stated that she ran into the nearby girl's bathroom where three other girls were already hiding. She stated that just before going in there, she looked outside to the south and observed a male subject wearing a white shirt, dark pants, and a black hat worn backwards. She said he was looking towards the cafeteria and had raised one of his arms into the air. Trisia said this was his left arm and further that his left hand looked like part of it was missing and was bloody.

Trisia said that she knew one of the girls with her in the bathroom and identified her as Brianna Milne. She stated that from

their location, she could hear gun shots. She said she heard footsteps coming into the bathroom and then a bomb exploded inside. She described hearing more shooting, more footsteps, and another bomb exploding inside the bathroom. She said she thought some of the gunshots were being fired from outside the bathroom through the bathroom walls. She said they stayed there for about ten minutes and then ran down the foreign language hall and out a south door, through the parking lot to a residence on Polk Street - the seminary house.

Trisia stated that she does not know Eric Harris or Dylan Klebold and does not associate with the trench coat mafia.

Trisia's mother advised that her daughter has until recently, been very reluctant to talk about her experience at the school. She has had one session with a counselor and her mother feels that Trisia is having a difficult time dealing with this situation.

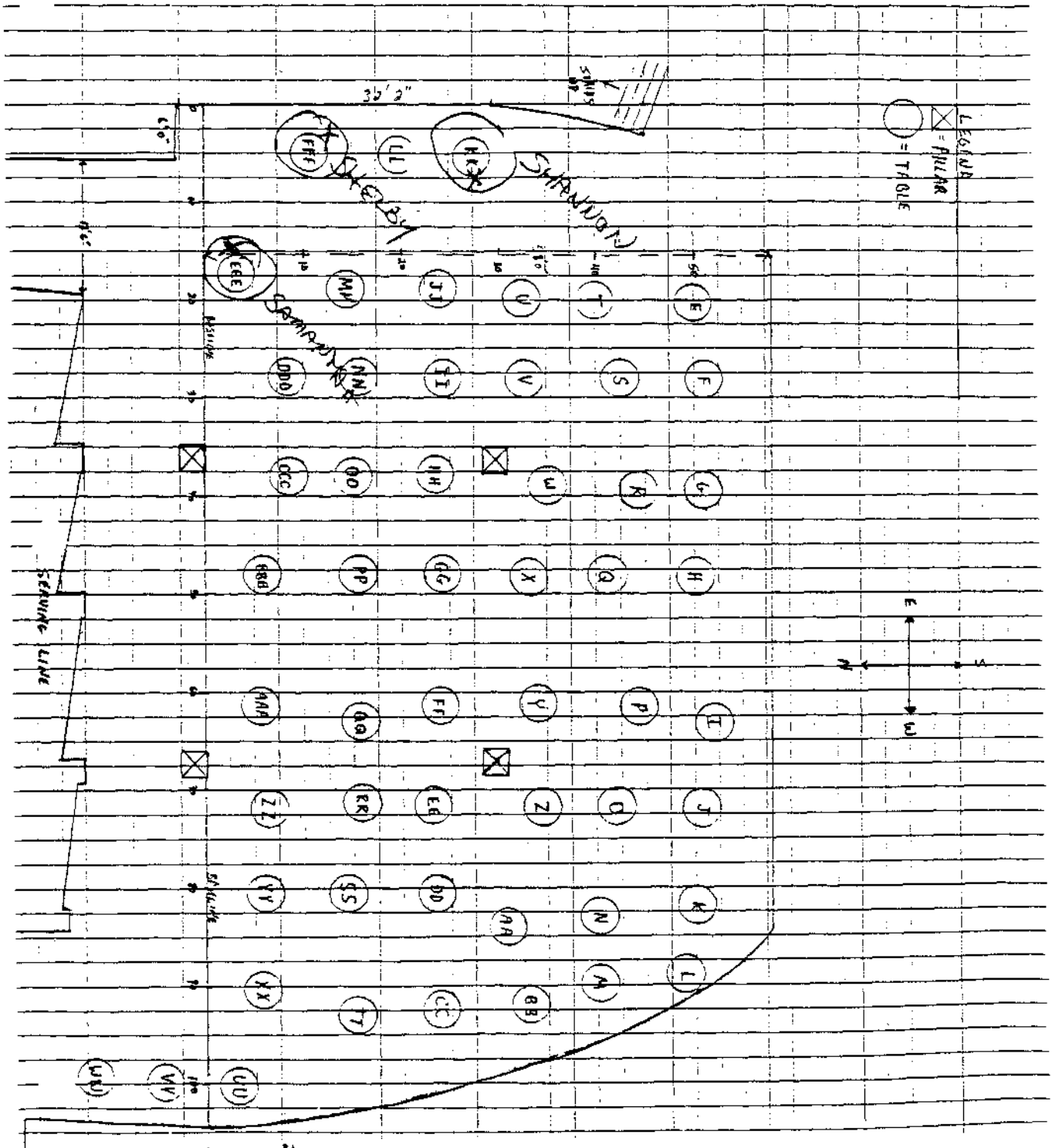

INVESTIGATION:

On 05-13-99, I was assigned control #1746 in order to speak with a Samantha Myers. Myers had provided information stating that she is an aid at the school and heard "kids" talking about two separate groups of shooters, one speaking German and one speaking English.

On 05-13-99, at about 0905 hours, I attempted to contact Myers at her home phone number (303)948-5856. I left a message on her answering machine requesting her to call me. I also left my pager number.

On 05-14-99, at 0915 hours, I received a page from Myers. At that time, I called her back.

Myers stated that Thursday, following the shooting, 04-22-99, her daughter had been at a fellowship where a cheerleader by the name of Amy Terry was present. Terry stated she had been locked in a closet during the incident at Columbine High School, and that she heard people speaking German and people speaking English during the incident. Myers requested her name not be mentioned during the conversation with Terry. Myers reiterated this two or three times.

I entered a lead into the Rapid Start program to follow-up with Amy Terry.

* She is a freshman at Columbine High.

* When asked about Eric Harris, she said she had a P.E. class with him last semester. She said that if there was no P.E. class during a particular day, the class would go into the cafeteria for the class time. She said that during those times she would be at a table with Eric Harris. She said that Eric did not talk to anyone and just read unknown books. She said that Eric was good at P.E. and did participate. She was told then by several upper classman that she should not talk to Eric because he was "weird." She saw Eric Harris and Dylan Klebold often this semester in the hallway right after her 5th hour American Government class in the social studies area. She never saw Eric in a trench coat.

* When asked about Dylan Klebold, she said that she did not know his name but would see him with Eric in the hallway after her 5th hour class. She thought Dylan always had a trench coat on.

* When asked, she did not know [REDACTED] [REDACTED]
[REDACTED] She thought a girl who associated with the trench coat students was a freshman named Jamie Schoffner. She did not know any others from the group she thought numbered 15. She has heard the name "Trench Coat Mafia" and associated them as a group, not a gang.

* When asked, she did not see any of the trench coat students or associates in the school the day of the shooting.

* When asked if she saw any unusual objects in the school, she said that she did see some kind of a black pack up against a pillar in the cafeteria. Other than saying the pack was about the same size as a backpack, she could not describe this pack any further. She did not know if it was a backpack or not. She just saw the pack by the pillar and no one else around it. Referring to the cafeteria diagram, she said the pack was against the east side of the pillar between tables W and HH.

* She saw no other suspicious objects. When asked specifically, she did not see any duffle bags.

* On the day of the shooting, she had choir for 4th hour. After getting out at 11:10 a.m., she went down the stairs to the cafeteria and dropped her backpack off at the lunch table. Looking at the diagram, she thought the table was either II or NN. Her backpack was located at II and she agreed that was the table.

* She then went into the Rebel Corner for lunch and waited in line with Megan Piro and Dan Romero. After getting lunch, she walked back to her table with Megan. They were at the table with; Nicole Ray, Valerie Jugert, and a Marnie (last name unknown)[editor's note: Marnie MacLennan]

* She said it only took about 5 minutes to get the lunch. She said she was into her third bite of her chicken sandwich when an unknown teacher (she did not know if it was Mr. Sanders) in a blue and white plaid shirt [editor's note: teacher Eric Kritzer] was running around telling everyone to "get down" and to "get under your table." She got down and looked up. The teacher said to "get back down." She said that everyone started to run out of the cafeteria. She said talk of a gun being involved had made its way to her table.

* She ran up the stairs and then went left down the hallway. She ran straight down the hallway to the east door and then out to Pierce St. and to Leawood Park. She said that she kept falling because of the crowd of students and Nicole kept picking her up and helping her.

* As she was running out, she heard talk of black coats and guns. She said there was a lot of screaming. As she was turning left down the hallway, she heard a loud explosion or gunshot that she thought came from the cafeteria. She said the report was "really loud."

* She was wearing plaid pants, a black Nike shirt and white tennis shoes.

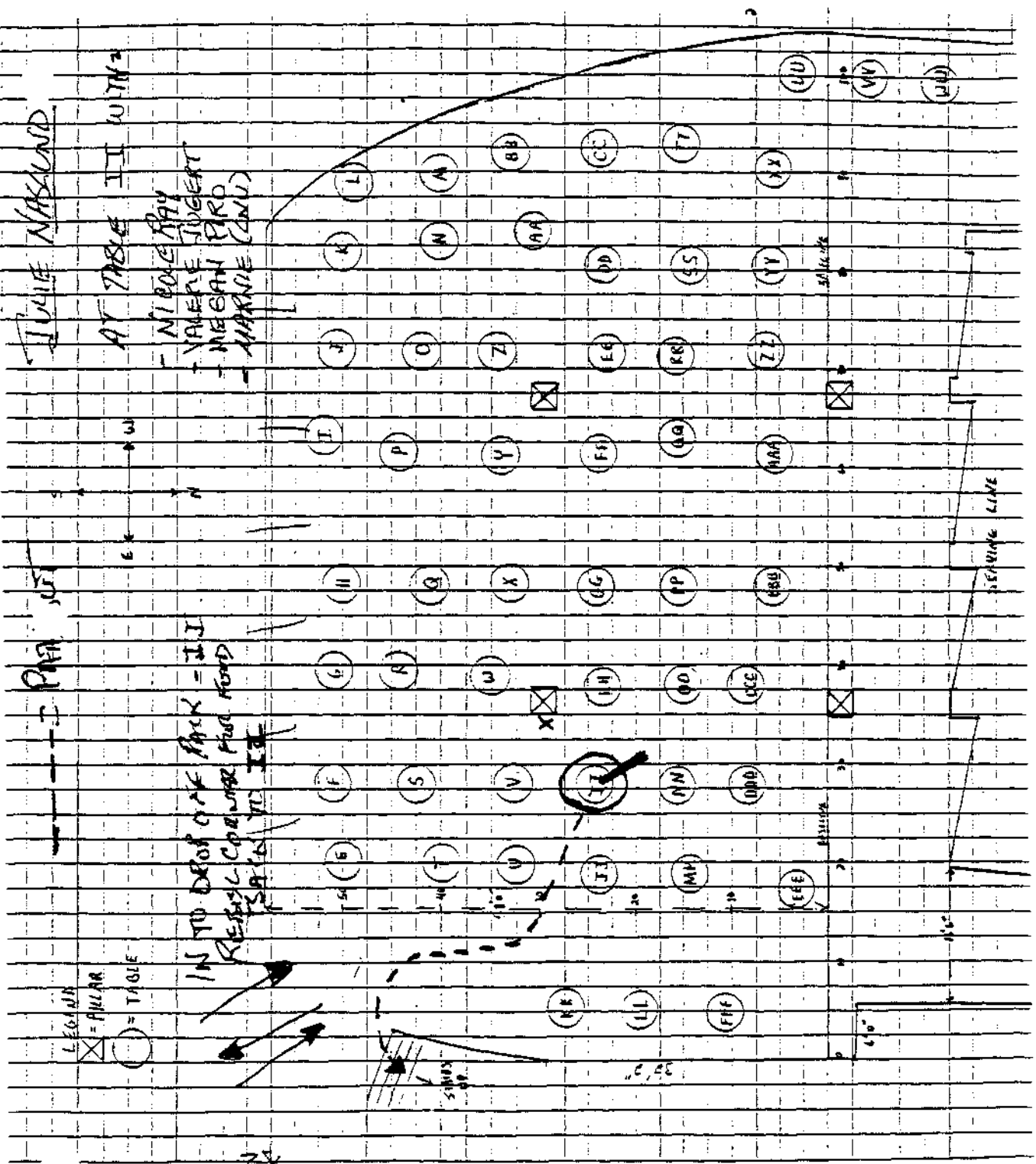

On 5/7/99 I interviewed CHS cafeteria worker Marlene Nederman at her home in Littleton, Co. Ms Nederman has worked in the Columbine High School cafeteria for 2 years and was working in the kitchen of the cafeteria on 4/20/99 from 6:30am until 11:30am.

She stated that she arrived to work at 6:30am, a normal start time for her. She began in the kitchen, doing prep work for breakfast and lunch at the school. She recalled that the east serving line window in the kitchen opens up from 7:00am to 9:30am for breakfast. The remaining 3 or 4 windows remain closed until they are opened up around 11:00am, preparing for "A" lunch.

Ms Nederman stated that she remained in the kitchen doing prep work most of the morning. At 9:45am she took a short break in the teacher's lounge near the kitchen, but returned after her break. She stated that around 11:05am she pushed her cash cart out of the kitchen and parked it near the front support post on the west end of the cafeteria. This is where she usually parks the cart, and takes the kid's lunch money before they eat lunch. I provided Ms Nederman a drawing of the cafeteria and the tables marked at CHS. I pointed out certain areas to give her a better understanding of the drawing's lay-out. Ms Nederman pointed to where she pushed out the cash cart and prepared for the "A" lunch crowd. Ms Nederman's cash cart was parked directly north of table ZZ, on the west side of the support pole.

Ms Nederman did not see any large duffle bags laying inside the cafeteria. She did not see anybody carrying a large duffle bag into the cafeteria and leaving it. Ms Nederman stated that over 150 kids that have 4th hour free hang out in the cafeteria and many were there on 4/20/99. She reiterated that she did not see anything unusual that morning, specifically a large duffle bag laying alone in the cafeteria.

Ms Nederman stated that shortly after the kitchen began serving the kids who came for "A" lunch she heard an explosion out the west windows. She was seated outside the kitchen collecting lunch money. Many kids stood up to look out the windows. She saw smoke from outside the windows and got down on the floor like everyone else was. Many students began yelling and running towards the steps which go upstairs inside the cafeteria. Ms Nederman remained on the floor for a few seconds. She began crawling back towards the kitchen with some students. She heard what she believed to be "rapid gunfire" near the student entrance by rebel corner. She saw kids on the steps go down, then get back up and run. Ms Nederman did not see anybody with a gun during this time.

She got into the kitchen and hid in a corner. Tony, the maintenance man [editor's note: Anthony Arnold] then came in and told them to hide better. He opened up a mop closet inside the kitchen and Ms Nederman went inside with 10 students and 8 adults and locked the door. They remained inside the mop room with Tony, who was able to communicate with the outside on a portable radio. They heard what appeared to be gunfire above them on the second floor. A few minutes later, they heard gunfire inside the cafeteria and kitchen area. She did not hear anybody talking outside the mop room, but believed there were people in the kitchen area looking around.

Ms Nederman stated that around 1:00pm they heard 3-4 gunshots upstairs. Around 1:15, the SWAT team arrived in the kitchen and rescued the group. They exited out the teacher's lounge window with SWAT escort.

Ms Nederman had no further information on the shooting or the TCM students. She stated that her fellow cafeteria workers included Linda (unknownlastname)[editor's note: Linda Tibljas], Karen Nielsen and Sue Liane.



INVESTIGATION:

On 05-25-99, I spoke with Angela Nelson originally by telephone. This lead was to determine her whereabouts during fifth period as records reflect she had this period free. When I first contacted Angela Nelson by phone, she told me she was in the cafeteria when the incident occurred. Based on this information, along with the fact she did see the shooting occur, I decided to conduct the remainder of the interview in person. An appointment was set for 1130 hours, this date.

On 05-25-99, at 1130 hours, I contacted Angela Nelson again at her address. Present during the interview was Angela Nelson's mother.

Angela Nelson was asked if she could tell me what had occurred on 04-20-99. She told me immediately after History class, which was her fourth hour class, she and a friend of hers, Kelly Fleming, left the class and walked westbound past the administrative offices, to the hallway where the Library is at. Kelly Fleming was going to the Library to continue to work on a project, which Angela Nelson thought was a biography. Angela Nelson told me that Kelly Fleming asked her if she wanted to come inside, and she told her that she was going to the commons area. She then went to the cafeteria area and sat down at table either "T" or "V". A map of the cafeteria was provided for Angela Nelson to look at. She was not sure which table she was at, but she indicated one of the two. While she was sitting there, some of the kids in the cafeteria started to get excited, and then she started hearing screaming. She then looked outside in the direction everyone was looking, and saw Dylan Klebold holding a rifle. She described Klebold as wearing a trench coat, black pants, black boots, and ball cap. She thought the ball cap was placed on with the bill pointing forward. Klebold then began shooting towards the cafeteria. She remembers windows being shot out. She did not see Eric Harris or an individual she could identify as Eric Harris, but did think she saw his boots and his pants. She was unable to tell me how she thought this individual was Eric Harris, or why she thought this was Eric Harris. She then saw Klebold moving along to the west and north, along the side of the building, and then lost sight of him. She then ran eastbound down a hallway.

and then southbound down a hallway into the Junior parking lot. As she ran into the parking lot, she saw a patrol car coming into the parking lot headed westbound. She then followed numerous kids off of the school grounds onto Pierce Street, and then into the neighborhood just to the south of Columbine High School. She then went into the third house on the right, and stayed there for approximately a half hour to an hour. She then left, and went to the drug store at Coalmine and Pierce where she contacted her mother. I asked Angela Nelson if she had her backpack with her at all times, and she said she did. She said when she left the cafeteria, she took it with her.

I asked Angela Nelson while she was in the cafeteria if she had seen anything unusual, and she said she did not. I specifically asked her if she saw a duffle bag, and she said she had not. I asked her when she was in the parking lot and fleeing from the school if she had seen any other individuals with dark clothing on, and she said she did not. I asked her how she knew it was Dylan Klebold she saw standing outside with the gun, and she said she had been introduced to him by one of her friends some time ago. She said she also knew who Eric Harris was, because every now and then the jocks would harass both of them. I asked her if she knew about the Trench Coat Mafia, and she said yes, she did, but it was through the picture in the yearbook. I asked her if there was any additional information she had that would be relevant to this investigation. She said there is a rumor amongst the students that there have been numerous warnings sent to the principal that something was going to happen. I asked her if she could identify what that rumor was, and she said it was something to the effect like you are all going to die. I asked her if she could tell me who she had heard this from, and she could not identify a specific person. I asked her if she could tell me more about the weapon that Klebold had. She described it as a long gun, and that he was shooting it like they do in the movies. She held her arms up about half way from her shoulder to her waist, as if she was holding a long gun or a shotgun. I asked her which hand he had it in, and she thought it was in his right hand, or to his right shoulder. I asked her if there was any additional information she could tell me which would help this investigation, and she said there was nothing else she knew.

DISPOSITION: Lead closed.

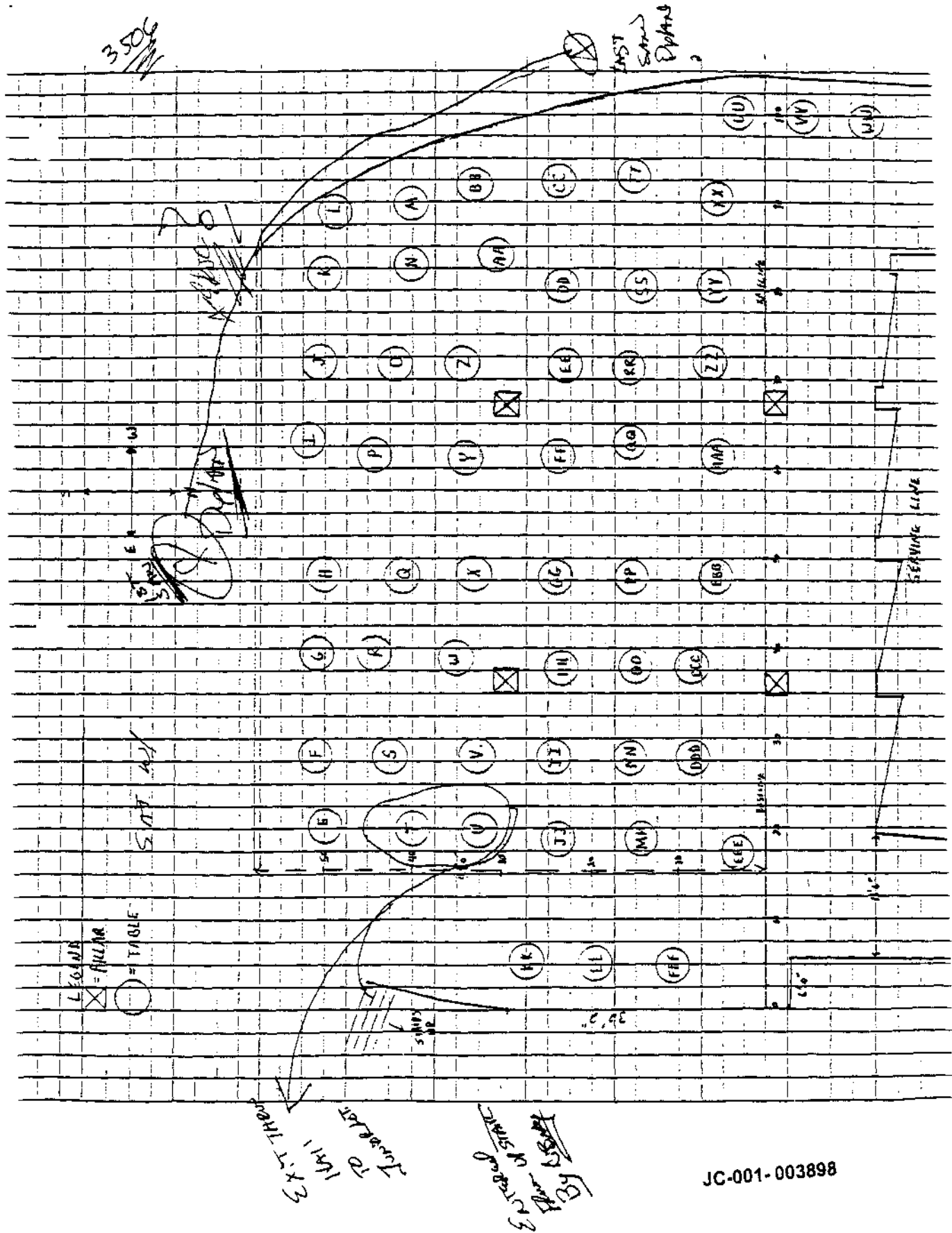

On 6-24-99, at approximately 1030 hours, I responded to 9612 West Cross Place to contact and interview Timothy M. Nep, who is a student at Columbine High School. This interview was in reference to the shooting that occurred on 4-20-99 at Columbine High School.

Timothy Nep told me that on 4-20-99, at about 0655 hours, he arrived at Columbine High School for his classes. He said his

first class was a gym/weight lifting class that is located on the upper level of Columbine High School, and he said this class lasted from 0700 to 0815 hours. Timothy said he then went to his second hour class, which was a biology class, and is located in the science department on the upper level of Columbine High School. He said this class lasted from 0825 to 0915 hours. Timothy said next he went to his math class on the upper level of Columbine High School and said this class lasted from 0925 to 1015 hours. Timothy said he then went to his English class, also on the upper level of Columbine High School, and said this class lasted from approximately 1020 to 1050 hours. Timothy said while going from one class to the next during the morning of 4-20-99, he did not observe any suspicious people or items. He was only on the upper level of Columbine High School until about 1050 on 4-20-99, when he went downstairs.

Timothy Nep told me when he got out of his fourth hour English class, he walked down the stairway from the upper level of Columbine High School to the lower level. This stairway leads down and into the cafeteria/commons area of the school. Timothy said he went to the "Rebel Corner" in the cafeteria/commons area to get something to eat. Timothy said while he was at the "Rebel Corner" he suddenly heard people screaming and said they were running from the cafeteria and commons area southbound in the hallway, past the "Rebel Corner," and were exiting the high school through the doors south of the "Rebel Corner." Timothy said he thought there was a fight taking place and believed that was why people were running and screaming. Timothy said he then heard somebody yell something to the effect of "he has a gun." Timothy said at that point when he heard somebody mention a gun being involved, he began running with the other people southbound through the hallway by the "Rebel Corner," and said he exited the south door of this hallway and then turned eastbound and ran away from Columbine High School. Timothy said he ran across south Pierce Street and into Leawood Park.

Timothy Nep said he remained in Leawood Park for approximately one hour or less with other people from Columbine High School. Timothy said while he was in Leawood Park, he heard approximately four to five explosions that sounded like they were coming from the area of the west side of Columbine High School and possibly in the vicinity of the cafeteria. Timothy said he did not remember hearing any gunshots during the incident on 4-20-99. Timothy said during the time he was in Leawood Park or prior to arriving in Leawood Park, he did not see anyone with a firearm or explosive device, either outside or inside of Columbine High School. Timothy said he did not hear any gunshots while in Leawood park that may have been directed towards the people who had gathered at that location. Timothy said he heard an unknown person say there was a shooter on the roof of

Columbine High school shooting towards Leawood Park. Timothy said he did not see anybody on the roof of Columbine High School, nor did he hear any incoming gunshots of any type. Timothy said he left Leawood Park, however, and went into somebody's house who had invited students inside. Timothy did not know who this person was. Timothy said he later left this residence and went to Leawood Elementary School.

Timothy Nep told me that he knows who the "Trench Coat Mafia" is, however, said he did not know much about them. Timothy said prior to the shooting on 4-20-99, he did not know any of the "Trench Coat Mafia" students by name, including Dylan Klebold and Eric Harris. Timothy said that sometime prior to 4-20-99 he had seen Dylan Klebold in the hallway of Columbine High School, however, he did not know Dylan Klebold's name at that time. Timothy said he now knows it was Dylan Klebold because he saw Dylan Klebold's picture through the media since the shooting, and recognized him as the "Trench Coat Mafia" student he had seen in the hallway. Timothy described the "Trench Coat Mafia" student, he now knows to be Dylan Klebold, as a white male, tall, and said he was approximately 6'2" to 6'3", and weighed approximately 200 pounds. Timothy said Dylan Klebold would wear a trench coat at times, however, would not wear it at other times. Timothy said Dylan Klebold wore a black baseball cap with the Colorado Avalanche insignia on the front of it. Timothy said Dylan Klebold would wear this hat backwards, and when worn backwards the hat had a Boston Red Sox "B" on the back of it (facing forward when the hat is worn backwards). Timothy said he could also remember Dylan Klebold wearing a T-shirt that said something to the effect of AOL Hackers are Cool.

Timothy Nep said he never saw the "jocks" harass "Trench Coat Mafia" students. He also did not see the "Trench Coat Mafia" students harass other people. Due to the fact that Timothy said he played baseball and football at Columbine High School, I asked him if the "Trench Coat Mafia" students had ever harassed him, and Timothy replied, "No."

Timothy Nep said that Isaiah Shoels was a friend of his. I asked him if he ever saw anybody harass Isaiah Shoels or racially intimidate Isaiah Shoels, and Timothy said he had never seen any racial intimidation at Columbine High School, and in particular towards Isaiah Shoels. He said everybody liked Isaiah Shoels.

Timothy Nep said he does not know of anybody, nor has he heard any rumors of anybody else, who may be manufacturing

I asked Timothy Nep how he has been doing since the incident occurred on 4-20-99, and he said he has been doing well. I also asked Timothy how the other people in his family have been doing, and he said well. I gave him one of my business cards and asked him to contact me in the future if he wishes, or a member of his family wishes to talk with a JSCO Victim Advocate. I told Timothy I would make the necessary arrangements for them at that time.

DISPOSITION: Case remains open, pending further investigation.

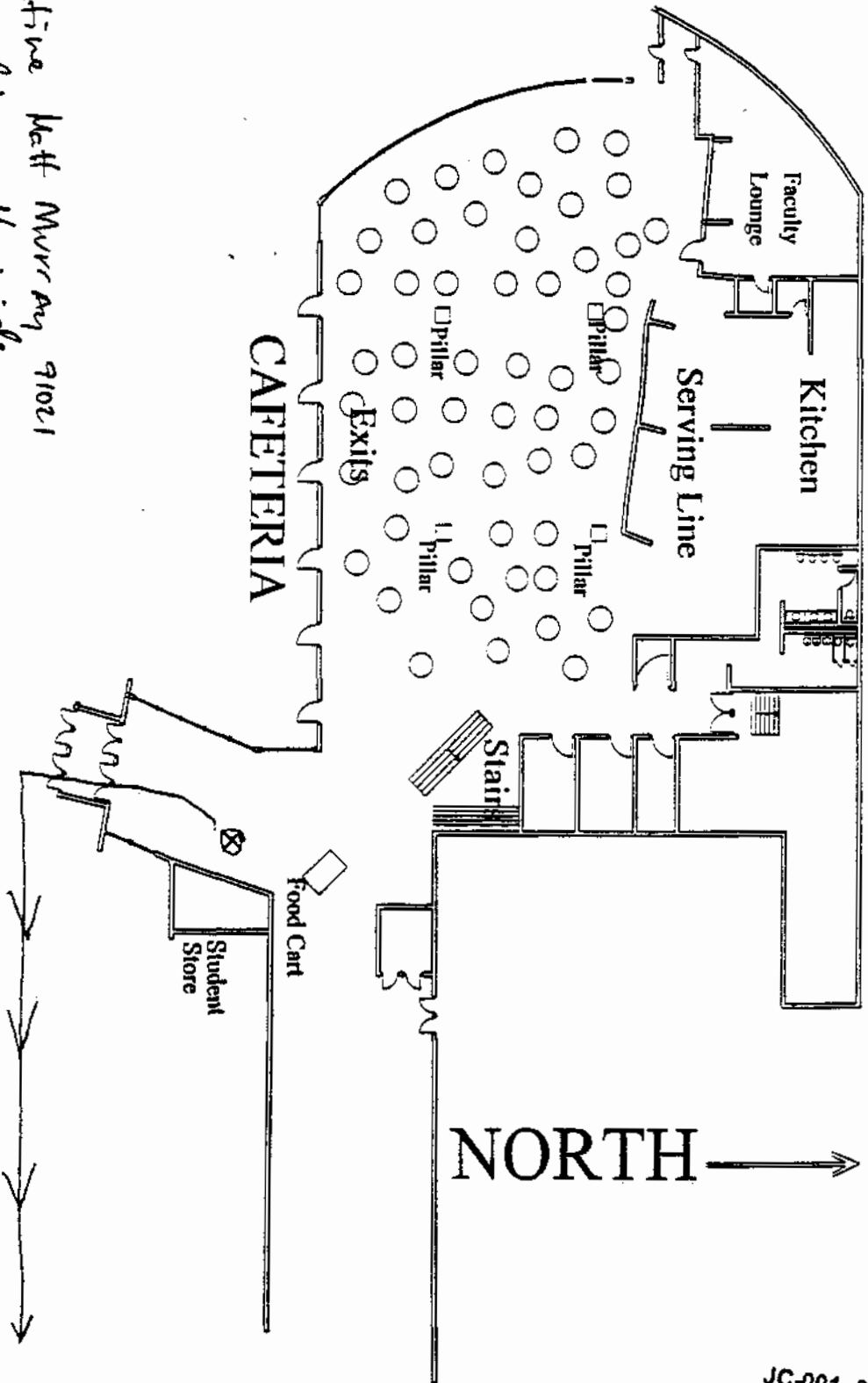

INVESTIGATION:

On 04-28-99 was assigned Information Control Number 1186 for follow up investigation. When I reviewed the lead sheet it was unclear as to whether I was to interview Mandy Erin Nicholls or Mary Sue Baribeau. I called Mandy Nicholls and found that she had not been interviewed and on 04-29-99 at 1030 hours responded to her

residence and interviewed her with her mother. Mandy Nicholls said that she had been driven to school by her friend, Jill Becerra. She said that they arrived at Columbine High School at approximately 0720 hours and parked in the senior parking lot. They entered the school through the faculty and student entrance in the cafeteria and then went upstairs to their lockers. Mandy said that she then went to her first hour class, which is business in the downstairs business class offices. She said normally that she is a student assistant in the main office but had some homework to do in her business class and she went there instead of the main office. She said that her second hour class is Spanish, which is downstairs and she left her business class to go directly to Spanish. Third hour is her chemistry class, which is upstairs and she went directly from her Spanish class to her chemistry class. Her fourth hour business class is upstairs.

Mandy Nicholls said that after her business class she left and went to her locker to get her lunch and then went to the "A" lunch. She estimated she arrived in the cafeteria at about 1115 hours with her friend, Mary Elise. She said that Mary had purchased her lunch and they sat down at a table near the south side exit doors. She identified this table as possibly being table "P". She said that at approximately 1120 hours, plus or minus a few minutes, a friend came running in yelling that some girl needed help. Mandy initially thought that this girl was choking and that a boy then came running in covered with blood saying that the girl had been shot. Mandy said that at approximately the same time, she heard shots coming from the parking lot area. The girl who came in

saying that someone needed help was Kim Blair. Mandy thought that the girl who had been shot and was in need of help, was Anne Marie Hochhalter and that the boy who came in, his name was Jason (last name unknown) [editor's note: Jayson Autenrieth].

Mandy Nicholls said that as this all transpired there were teachers yelling to get down and get under the tables. Mandy Nicholls said that there was a mass panic and a rush to get to the stairs. She said she too joined the crowd trying to get up the stairs and that as she neared the top of the stairs she noticed that there was smoke in the hallway and could hear more gunshots. She said at the top of the stairs she turned into the first door on her left, which she says is choir class. She then went into the rear choir class office. She estimated that there were approximately 60 students in the office with her.

Some of the students moved file cabinets against the doors and as they were doing this there were fire alarms going off in other parts of the building. They also moved a desk up against the door. Several students were using the phone to call their parents. She indicated that she was continuing to hear gunshots and explosions. She said that while they were waiting in the room they thought they could hear pounding sounds on the roof. She said they could also hear sounds of things being smashed and banging in the cafeteria area and that she could also hear male voices yelling, but she could not discern what they were saying. She said that after approximately three hours, she thought it was a little after 1500 hours, the SWAT team came in escorted them out of the building.

Mandy Nicholls said that she didn't know ERIC HARRIS but she does know DYLAN KLEBOLD. She attended junior high school with him. She said she was never really friends with him but knew who he was. She said that in her CCB class first semester, a class that is communications for the college-bound, all the students had to do research papers and that DYLAN KLEBOLD was in her class. The teacher was Mr. Webb and it was in sixth hour. She thought that just before Christmas 1998, that they had to write research papers. She said she recalled DYLAN KLEBOLD writing his paper on Charles Manson and the crimes that Manson had committed. She said that the class had to read their papers and that KLEBOLD's paper was a very "weird" paper. Mandy said that she was aware of what the "trench coat mafia" was and that it was her understanding that it was kids who wear trench coats and hang out with each other. She had never heard of them being picked on by other students and had never observed them being picked on by other students, or them picking on other students.

Mandy Nicholls said that her backpack is a turquoise Jansport which contains a red binder, a black binder, a chemistry lab book, a Spanish book, a red purse, a Casio calculator and her Columbine ID. She said on the day of the incident she was wearing blue jeans, a green shirt with a white T-shirt.

INVESTIGATION:

On 05-25-99, at about 9:45 a.m., I interviewed CHS Food Assistant (kitchen worker) Karen Nielsen as follow up on DN3863. The interview was conducted at Karens' home.

Karen told me that on 04-20-99, she was working in the kitchen at Columbine High School. Karen said that this was a part-time job, and that she has two other (unrelated) part-time jobs. Karen said that at 11:00 a.m., she opened the gate on the "American food" serving line, which she said was the second of four serving lines, going from west to east, as indicated on the cafeteria map. Karen said that on that day, three serving lines were opened at 11:00 a.m. The first serving was for "Mexican food" and was staffed by kitchen worker Parti Zawadzki. Karen said that she and kitchen worker Linda Tibljas were staffing the second serving line. The third serving line was for "Italian food." Karen said that she doesn't remember who was staffing it. Karen said that the fourth serving line is usually reserved for breakfast and was closed at that time. Karen said that the first lunch period formally begins at 11:10 a.m. each day, and that she and other servers usually begin serving students and staff who are in the cafeteria prior to 11:10 a.m., before the lunch rush.

Karen said that she had been serving pizza for about ten minutes when she heard someone yell, "Get down! They've got a gun!"

Karen said that simultaneously with hearing this, she heard gunshots and saw custodian Jon (Curtis) running east, with radio

in hand, from the northwest corner of the cafeteria, across and parallel with the serving lines, toward the northeast corner of the cafeteria. Karen said that she thought the voice yelling to 'get down' and the gunshots both came from the vicinity of the northwest corner of the cafeteria, possibly from outside the building. Karen thinks that the person yelling was either Jon or teacher Dave Sanders. Karen described the gunshots as "single shots, very loud." Karen said that as Jon ran in front of the serving lines, numerous students who were seated at the various tables within the commons area began to dive under tables and/or run toward the east side of the cafeteria, toward the stairway. Karen said that immediately after hearing the gunshots, she heard a "very loud explosion." Karen said that she remembered saying out loud, "What was that?" Karen said that she has heard shotguns before, but that this explosion was "much bigger, with much more of an impact." Karen said that all of this took place "simultaneously, in a matter of seconds."

Karen said that when this occurred, she remembered seeing Patti Zawadzki "get down," but couldn't remember exactly where Linda was or what she did. Karen remembered seeing Linda restocking the drinks to her right on the second serving line, but that is all. Karen said that while most people began running and making their way to the east side of the cafeteria, for "some unknown reason" she ran to the west, out of the kitchen area and into the faculty lounge. Karen said that she entered the faculty lounge through the easternmost door of its south wall, which then closed behind her. Karen said that her inclination at that time was to use the telephone inside the faculty lounge, but that as soon as she entered, she heard someone yell, "He's not breathing!" coming from outside the westernmost door of the lounge. Karen said that she then ran out of the lounge's west door, which was propped open, and toward the cafeteria's northwest door. At that time, Karen said that she could see student "Sean" (Graves) lying on the cement directly outside said door. Karen said that Sean was lying on his right side, facing the door. Karen said that Sean's head was facing northeast, and that his legs were extended to the southwest. Karen said that she doesn't remember seeing another adult near Sean at that time, but that it was possible. Karen said that she remembers talking with Sean, and that he told her, "I can't feel my legs." Karen said that she turned around and ran back inside the faculty lounge where she saw a female teacher (unknown) standing near the telephone. Karen said that she asked this female, "Have you called 911?" Karen said that the female said, "No, but I called the office." Karen said that she then picked up the telephone, called 911, and "got through."

Karen said that she remembers running back and forth from the telephone to Sean, updating the dispatcher as to Sean's injuries. Karen said that she did most of the talking, and that the female teacher stood next to the telephone. Karen said that she remembers Sean repeatedly saying, "I can't move my legs," and also remembers people attempting to move him. Karen said that she remembers leaning over Sean to look at his wound after someone had attempted to move him. Karen described the wound as "right in the middle of the back. It was a very clean shot, there was not a lot of blood." Karen said that she had to lean over Sean in order to see his wound because his back was facing away from the door. Karen said that she remembers the 911 dispatcher telling her not to move Sean, and later, her (Karen) arguing with a female teacher (Chris Redmerski) about whether or not Sean should be moved inside because of possible spinal injuries. Karen said that at some point, she also saw two other students who had been shot. Karen described these students as "Lance" and "Danny," and that both were lying on the ground near the bottom of the exterior stairs, on opposite sides of the fence. Karen said that both students were visible through the window (facing west) to west side of the cafeteria's northwest door. Karen said that she remembers telling the dispatcher that Lance had been "shot in the face." Karen said that while going back and forth from the telephone to Sean, she continued to hear sporadic gunshots. She did not remember which windows were shot out, but remembers seeing shattered glass.

Karen said that at some point, she decided to hang up the telephone because she thought the shooter(s) had entered the cafeteria through the northwest door. Karen said that she heard gunshots and explosions coming from directly outside the faculty lounge, and that she "knew they were in the building, in the kitchen, in the cafeteria." Afraid to exit the faculty lounge, Karen said that she figured the only place to hide was inside the faculty lounge bathroom. Karen said that she was the last person to enter said bathroom, and remembers thinking it would be "like fish in a barrel" should the shooter(s) decide to enter the faculty lounge.

Karen said that she entered the bathroom at about 11:30 a.m., and that in addition to herself, there were three teachers and three students (all unknown) inside, for a total of seven. Karen said that when she entered the bathroom, the light was turned off and the dead bolt was turned to lock the door. Karen said that there was very little talking amongst those inside the bathroom, and remembers hearing a lot of "Shhhh!" to keep each other quiet. During the time she remained in the bathroom, Karen said that she continued to hear gunshots and explosions from what she thought was the kitchen area. Karen said that it would be "quiet

for a minute, you'd hear them scuffling around in the kitchen, talking, and then it would be like ba-boom! ba-boom! and then a couple more shots, then it would be quiet again." Karen said that the explosions "shook the bathroom walls," and that she expected them to actually blow a hole through the walls. Karen said that in addition to hearing what she thought was the shooter(s), she could hear faint noises coming from the opposite sides of the east and west bathroom walls. Karen assumed that these noises were from other people hiding in the kitchen area. Karen said that the gunshots and explosions eventually tapered off over a period of about thirty minutes.

Karen said that there was enough light inside the bathroom for her to see her wristwatch, and remembers looking at it at about 12:10 p.m. At that time, Karen said that she decided to exit the bathroom. Upon cautiously doing so, Karen said that she looked out the faculty lounge window and saw two police cars, one parked in the senior parking lot and one parked toward the top of the hill to the north. Karen said that she saw the three kids outside, still on the ground, and that she "knew Danny was dead." Karen said that the others had followed her out of the bathroom, and that they decided to return to the bathroom after concluding that it probably wasn't safe yet because the police had yet to retrieve the three students. Karen said that after returning to the bathroom, one of the male students [editor's note: Tim Kastle or Nick Foss] and one female teacher [editor's note: Joyce Jankowski] climbed up through the ceiling panels above the bathroom. Karen said that this made a considerable amount of noise, and that the two were told it wasn't safe to do so. Despite the warning, Karen said that both continued up into the ceiling, and that about a minute later, the teacher fell through the ceiling panels above the faculty lounge. Karen said that the teacher then got up, returned to the bathroom, and was let back inside. Karen said the student disappeared.

Karen said that they remained inside the bathroom until about 12:30 p.m., when a male student, not part of their group, peered into the bathroom from the ceiling and told them that this was a good time to leave. Karen said that they all decided to exit the bathroom again, which they then did. Karen said that she then looked out the faculty window again and saw that the two of the three students (Sean and Lance) had been moved. Karen said that Danny was still lying where she last saw him. Karen said that they all then began running outside the cafeteria's northwest door, in different directions. Karen said that she ran up the hill next to the stairway, to a police car.

Karen said that during the time she was serving lunch, from about 11:00 to 11:20 a.m., she did not notice any duffle bag(s), crowds, or anything else in or around the commons area that she might consider suspicious or unusual. Karen said that she never saw any shooter(s), nor anyone wearing a trench coat. Karen said that she left her purse in a storage room inside the kitchen, where she and other staff members usually keep their personal items. Karen confirmed the names of all seven kitchen workers who were working in the kitchen on 04-20-99. The interview concluded at about 10:30 a.m.

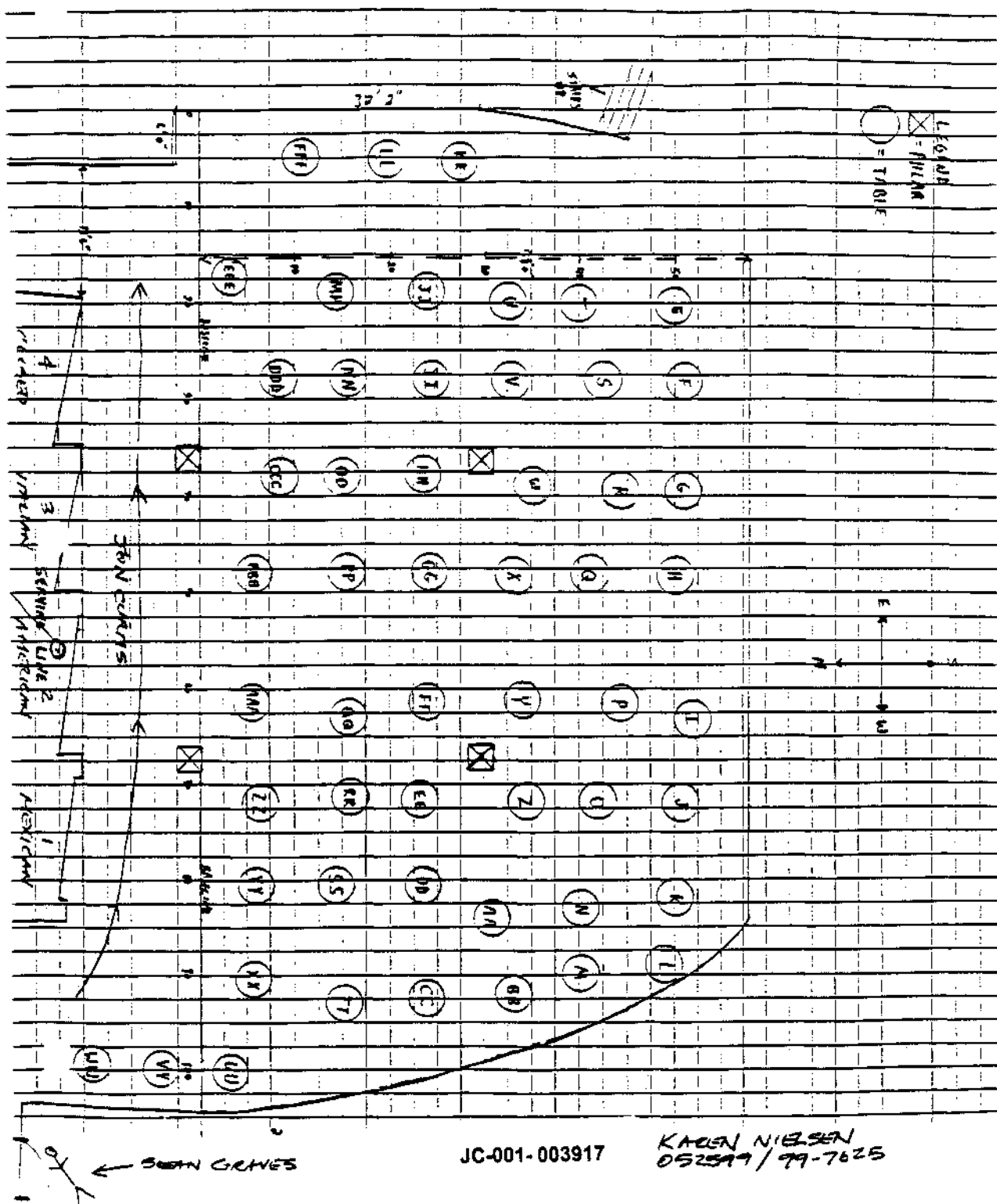

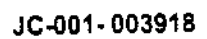
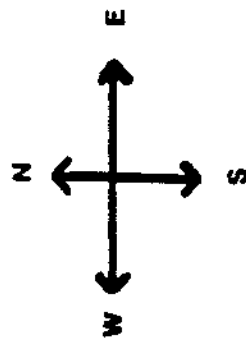

INVESTIGATION:

On 4/26/99, Investigator Reker and I met with Elizabeth Nolan at her residence reference the shooting at Columbine High School.

I explained to Elizabeth why we were there and gave her a sketch of the cafeteria. I asked Elizabeth if she could circle the table in the cafeteria where she was sitting the day of the shooting. Elizabeth circled table marked "EE" and put an "x" on a chair showing where she was sitting. I asked Elizabeth if she was sitting by herself and she said no. Elizabeth gave me thirteen names of students with which she was sitting. I asked Elizabeth if she could tell me what happened on the day of the shooting. Elizabeth told me she was in cafeteria at approximately 11:20 a.m., when she heard a teacher tell everyone to get down underneath the tables. Elizabeth said she then heard, what she described as, popping noises and the teacher yelling for them to crawl out of the cafeteria. Elizabeth said when she got to the stairway which leads upstairs she heard approximately six to eight more shots and believed that approximately 20 to 30 feet behind her a student was shot while going up the stairs. Elizabeth said there was a teacher, which she did not know if it was Mr. Sanders or not, say that he would go back and get the student and for them to continue running up the stairs. Elizabeth said that she then went to the auditorium, but the door was locked and they had to get a teacher to unlock the door. Elizabeth said that she then hid by a lighting area in the auditorium. Elizabeth said while she was hiding there, she observed the suspect come into the auditorium and look around but he did not fire any shots in the auditorium. Elizabeth said that she then ran to the stairs and hid behind some lockers in the auditorium with some other students. Elizabeth said while hiding behind the lockers, someone pulled the fire alarm. Elizabeth said once the alarm was pulled, she and other students ran through the band hall and while running through the band hall, she observed a tall skinny guy running behind them, approximately 100 feet. Elizabeth said while running with this person behind them she heard a "boom" Elizabeth said she then ran to a door and exited the school by the baseball field and ran through Clement Park. I asked Elizabeth if while running outside she heard any further shots and she said yes, she believed that she heard shots and possibly more explosions.

I asked Elizabeth if she knew who the tall skinny male was and she said she believed him to be Dylan Klebold. She said that Dylan had a mask on, but had hair sticking out of the mask and that she does know Dylan and that appeared to be him. I asked how this person was dressed and she said "Dylan had on a black trench coat, army boots, black pants and a black ski mask". I asked Elizabeth if this person was carrying anything and she said that he did have a duffle bag on his left arm and had a gun in his right hand.

I asked Elizabeth if this person was with anyone and she said no, he was by himself. I asked if she saw him shoot anyone. She said just the person on the stairway. I asked if she heard this person say anything while he was shooting and she said she remembers turning around on the stairway approximately the same time that the student was shot, and heard "Dylan cackling". I asked Elizabeth if she actually saw the student get shot and she said yes, she did, as she turned around to see who was behind her and did see the student get shot in the back and fall down. I asked Elizabeth who the teacher was who went back to help the student and she said she believed it was Mr. Sanders. I asked Elizabeth if she saw anyone else get shot and she said no, just this one. I asked Elizabeth if she was injured during this and she said no, she was not. I asked Elizabeth if she saw anyone else besides this tall skinny shooter and she said, no, he's the only one she saw. Elizabeth said she has heard from other students that there were two and possibly three shooters, but she only saw the one.

Elizabeth said a few days before this incident, some locks on the school had to be replaced because someone had tampered with them. I asked her what locks and she said the front door locks and also the door locks to the math hall all had to be replaced. The math hall is on the side of the building by the Columbine High School sign. I asked Elizabeth if she knew why the locks had to be replaced and she said all she knew was that somebody had tampered with them.

I asked Elizabeth if she had seen anyone else at the school that she felt might be involved and she said she did see a white male in a white shirt with black pants running in the hall by the band room. Elizabeth said she believed that to be suspicious because he was running the opposite direction of everyone else. I asked if she could describe this male and she said he had brown hair, short in length and he had a white T-shirt on. I asked if the shirt was a T-shirt or a dress shirt and she said it was a T-shirt. I asked Elizabeth if there was anyone else that she had seen and she said no. I asked Elizabeth if there was anything else that she could remember at this time and she said that's all she knows. I gave Elizabeth a business card and asked her to call with any further information.

On 05-18-99, between the hours of 0957 and 1036, I had an opportunity to speak with Jeff Noll in reference to the incident that occurred at Columbine High School on 04-20-99. Also present during the interview was his mother, Kathy Noll.

Jeff stated he arrived at school on 04-20-99, at about 0733 hours, and that his friend, Brad Miller (303-973-7122), had also ridden to school with him that morning. Jeff stated his father dropped them off, and once they reached the high school, they went in the school via the main entrance, and he proceeded to his Science class taught by Mr. Will. After being released from Science class, he went to his English class taught by Mr. Leyba, and then to his third period class, which was Math, taught by Ms. McWilliams. After he was released from his third period class, Jeff went to his fourth hour Government class taught by Mr. Savino. Jeff said after he was released from fourth period class, that he proceeded to his locker, #1822, which is located near the gymnasium at the school, and that his friend, Braden Pollard (303-978-1331), accompanied him to his locker. After they

finished at the locker, they proceeded to the cafeteria ^(LP), and he believes they arrived at about 1117 hours. The two of them went directly to the food service line where they got their lunch, and then they went to the tables located in Rebel Corner just across from the student store. Jeff was asked who was at the table with him, and he stated his friend, Mike Foster, Adam Hinchey, Laura Farber, Braden Pollard, Colleen Schwartzott, Kate Rebrovic, BJ Secord, Ben Johnson, and Matt Friend were all



at the table. Jeff said once he arrived at the table, he was unable to locate a chair, so he went to the common area of the cafeteria where they stack chairs. As he was walking over there, he saw a group of students standing in the common area, and believed there was a fight going on. He told me he was unable to see if there was in fact a fight, and he turned and recalled seeing Mr Sanders and an unknown janitor [editor's note: Jon Curtis] who were telling students to get down under their tables. Jeff said he walked back to his table and got underneath the table, but at this point was not sure why they were instructed to seek refuge under the tables. Jeff said as he got down on the floor and he recalls a student, Justin Norman, came running into the school and stated, "He's got a gun." At this point, the students who were located on the west side of the cafeteria began to run east towards the staircase. Jeff stated he ran south out the doors at Rebel Corner, ran through the Junior parking lot, and ran to a house located on the corner of Pierce and Polk. I asked who else went with him when he exited from the school, and he told me every body at his table ran the same direction to the house on the corner.

Jeff was asked if he recalled what time he reached the house at Polk and Pierce. He told me he called his mother at home on the incident date, and told her what had happened. Kathy Noll told me she believed it was 11:35 a.m., when she received the call from Jeff. Jeff told me he stayed at the house at Pierce and Polk for about 15 to 20 minutes, and then he got a ride to Tyler Pearce's home, where he later went to the Columbine Public Library and met with his mother at about 1:30 p.m.

Jeff was shown a diagram of the cafeteria area and asked if he observed two large duffle bags or sports type bags, one being a blue color and the other being a burnt orangish/red color. I told him the items were located in the central core area of the cafeteria and asked if he saw these items when he went to the food service line. Jeff stated he walked through that general area, but did not recall seeing those items, telling me that it wasn't uncommon for large packs or backpacks to be present in the cafeteria during lunch period. Jeff was asked if he observed any gunmen while in the cafeteria at the high school, or if he saw any gunmen after he exited from the school. He stated he did not see any gunmen, but he heard a gunshot and told me he believed it was in the cafeteria area over near the west doors.

Jeff was asked if he knew any members of the Trench Coat Mafia, specifically Eric Harris or Dylan Klebold, or their associates. He could not provide any information about this group. When asked if he knew about Harris' Website, he again told me that he did not know anything about the group. Jeff was asked if there were any rumors around school of anything that was going

to occur on 04-20-99. He told me he had not heard of anything. Jeff proceeded to tell me that there was no other information that he could provide, and told me he left the school and did not observe any activity at the school.

Jeff was asked to describe his dress on the incident date. He said he was wearing khaki colored shorts with a grey long sleeved shirt, a baseball cap, and tennis shoes. Jeff was asked if he had left any items in the cafeteria when he exited the school, and he told me he never took his backpack off, so when he ran out of the school he still had it on. He said there were no items he had left behind.


At the completion of my interview, I asked Jeff and his mother, Kathy Noll, if they had any additional information or had any questions for me to let me know. Kathy Noll told me there is a family by the last name of Wright, who live at 5391 South Garland Way in Littleton, Colorado, home phone number 303-904-1108, who have two sons who attend Columbine High School, and the older son observed either Harris or Klebold in the parking lot at the school just prior to the incident on 04-20-99. She said she heard the individuals (Harris and Klebold) were carrying large duffle bags, and these may possibly be the duffle bags that I had described earlier in the interview. Kathy Noll was unable to provide any additional information reference this incident, and suggested the Wright's be given a phone call.

Jeff was asked to depict where he was sitting in the cafeteria on 04-20-99, and his movement out of the school. A copy of that map is attached to this supplemental report.

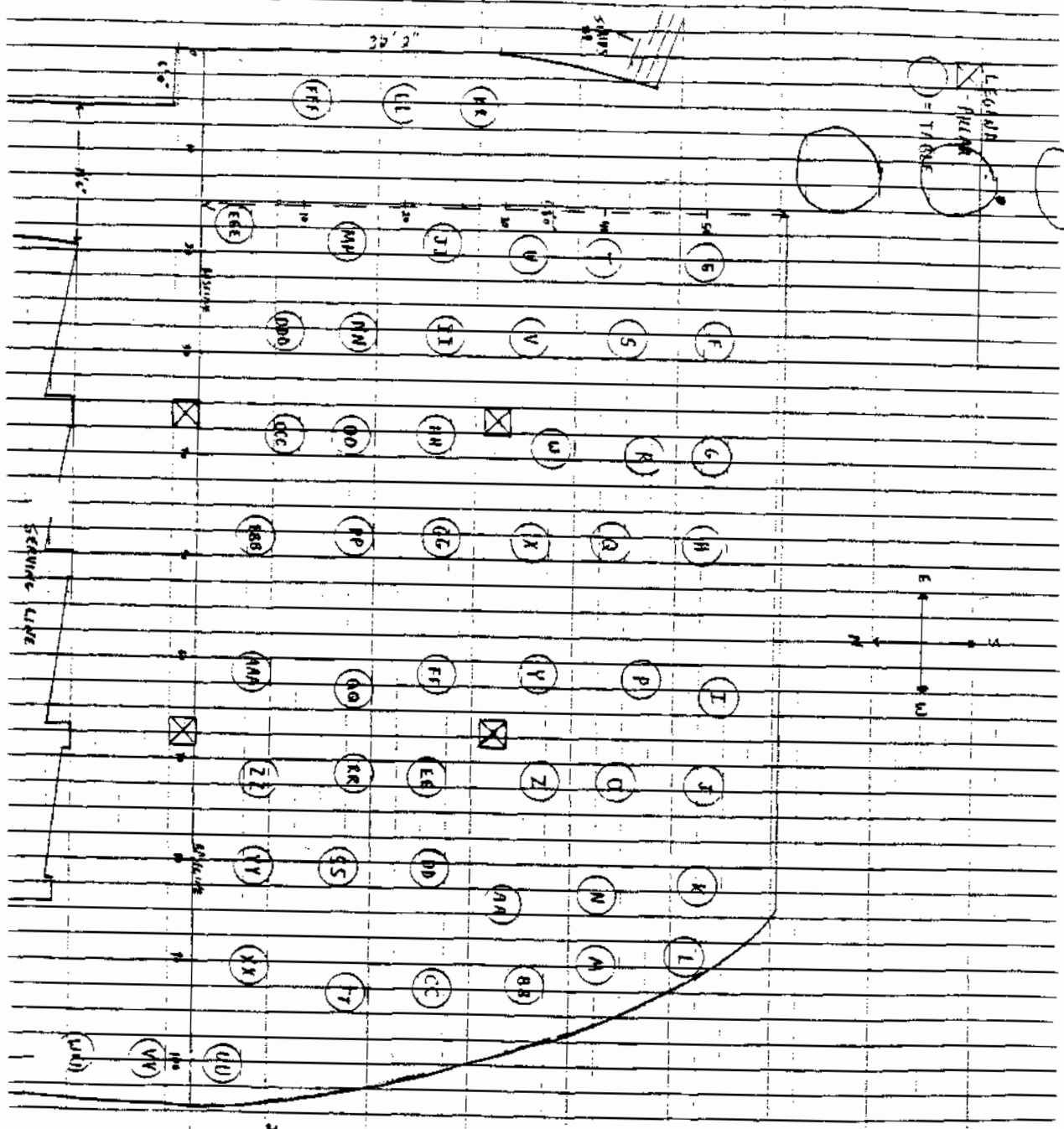

The guy had a handgun and he shot one kid in the ankle and then shot another guy who didn't move.

Then we started running. I told my friends to run and I helped some other people up. The shooter came in the door and bullets were flying past my head. We made it out and I started telling people to leave.

Then we heard an explosion. We ran outside and

Narrative:

On 4-30-99 , Inv. Reker did conduct an interview with Justin Norman at his residence, with his mother present.

Norman states that he had left weight lifting class and had met Matt Katzenmeier in the hallway and that they walked to the cafeteria at approx. 11:20 and that while he was at the vending machines next to the west doors of the cafeteria,he heard shots out the west door and that he looked out and saw two people go down and that Dylan Klebold then came into the cafeteria via these doors and started shooting,and that Klebold was shooting all over the cafeteria. Norman also related that as the bullets were going by whizzing by his head that he was busy getting people out of the cafeteria.

It should be noted that this is the first time this Investigator has heard that Klebold entered the cafeteria by this door and that he also fired numerous shots from this location. When Norman described this alledged shooting from inside the west door of the cafeteria,he held his hands by his hips as if holding a gun and did a spraying or sweeping motion from this position as he described Klebolds actions.

Norman states that nobody was with Dylan, and that Dylan was wearing a black trench coat , black boots, a "goofy" face, long blond hair,and a big nose. Norman states that he did not see a duffel bag and cannot describe a weapon.

Norman states that he then ran to the Rebel Corner and out the door and that he had his backpack with him.

Norman states that the one victim outside had been shot in the ankle and that one had been shot in the chest and that Klebold had come from the outside steps by the west entrance to the cafeteria.

Norman related that he knows Eric Harris from gym class but did not know Klebold.

Norman states that he (Norman) was wearing blue shorts , and a green vest with a white shirt.

Norman related that he was in front in front of Coach Brookfield in the lunchroom.(it should be noted that Inv. Reker did interview Brookfield and he states that he(Brookfield) was in the commons area of the cafeteria)

INVESTIGATION:

On 05-07-99, between the hours of 1108 and 1155 hours, I had an opportunity to speak with Sean Nossaman in reference to the incident that occurred at Columbine High School on 04-20-99. Also present during the interview was his father, David Nossaman.

Sean Nossaman proceeded to tell me he arrived at school on 04-20-99, at about 0710 hours, and that he drove with his friend, Ian Patrick (303-979-4977). Nossaman advised that they had parked at Clement Park and walked into the main entrance at school. Once he arrived at Columbine High School, he proceeded to his locker, which is locker #1564, and is located near the gymnasium. Nossaman stated that his first hour class is German, and it is taught downstairs in the Foreign Language hall, and the teacher is Amy Burnett. Nossaman was asked if he saw anything unusual in the cafeteria area when he was walking to his German class. I asked him if he observed anyone bringing in two large duffle bags or sports bags, one being blue and one being orangish/red in color, and placing those bags in the central core area of the cafeteria. Nossaman told me he did not see those bags, and he did not see anyone bring those bags in. After his first hour German class, he proceeded to his Math class, which was taught by Mr. Bundy. After Math he has Team Sports, which is taught by Coach Place, and fourth hour he has Language Arts which is taught by Ms. Nykanen. Nossaman was asked where his fourth hour class was located in the school. He told me it is located in the Social Studies and Language Arts hall. At about 1110 hours, he was released from his fourth hour class and

high school, and I asked if he could tell me where he was seated. Nossaman identified table #WW as the table he was seated at

and proceeded to tell me that his friend, Jeremy Mullen (303-730-6712), his girlfriend, Tanya Worlock (303-971-0805), Mike Kish (unknown phone), and Mark Radtke (303-979-7191), were also seated at the table. Nossaman explained shortly after he finished his lunch, he got up and went over to the trash cans which were located near the pop machines by the northwest doors of the cafeteria. As he was throwing away trash, he remembers hearing pops, and later identified them as gunshots coming from outside. He looked out the northwest door where he stated he saw an unidentified white male, who he believed was a Freshman lying outside the doors, and the individual was clutching his shoulder, and appeared to be shot in the shoulder area. Nossaman explained that he stepped outside, and was looking at the student when he heard three gunshots, and then a possible shotgun blast coming from outside. I asked Nossaman if he observed any gunmen while he was standing outside, and he stated he did not. After the shotgun blast, he stated he stepped back inside the cafeteria, and an unknown teacher yelled at the students to get down. Nossaman proceeded to run to the teacher's lounge, and with him was a Ms. Jankowski, Amy Burnett, Ms. Caruthers, an unknown lunch lady, Tim Kastle, and Nick Foss. Once they got into the teacher's lounge, he stated they all went into the bathroom inside the lounge and locked the door [editor's note: lunch lady Karen Nielsen].

Nossaman stated while they were in the teacher's lounge bathroom, that Ms. Jankowski and Nick Foss attempted to escape by climbing through the ceiling, but the weight of the two individuals collapsed the ceiling and they fell to the floor. Nossaman remembers that while they were in the teacher's lounge, they would periodically peer through the west window of the lounge. He stated he observed two students at Columbine who were lying at the west door of the cafeteria. He stated that Lance Kirklin was one of the individuals, and he was lying near the fence, and "it appeared his face was gone." He also stated that Dan Rohrbough was also lying outside on the sidewalk, and both individuals appeared to be dead. I again asked Nossaman if he observed any gunmen shoot the two individuals, or did he see any gunmen standing near them. He stated he did not see the gunmen.

Nossaman told me that they remained in the teacher's lounge for a short period of time when Brett Kostalnick had come into the teacher's lounge and directed everybody that it appeared to be safe to leave, at which time they exited from the school through the northwest cafeteria door and ran to a blue Honda Accord which was parked in the Senior parking lot. Nossaman advised there


were two Denver SWAT officers there, and they sought refuge behind the car. After a short period of time, the officers instructed them to run to safety, at which time they ran to the soccer fields, and then were directed to go to a central staging point at Caley and Yukon Street.

Nossaman stated after he exited from Columbine High School and was crouched behind the blue Honda Accord, that there were never any shots fired at him or any of the other individuals that were crouched behind the vehicle.

Nossaman was asked while the incident was occurring if anybody had identified who the gunmen were. He stated while he was in the teacher's lounge, he recalled somebody told him that the gunmen were Eric and Dylan. I asked Nossaman if he knew Eric Harris or Dylan Klebold, or if he knew other associates of the Trench Coat Mafia. He told me that he knew Eric Harris worked at Blackjack Pizza, telling me that his girlfriend, Tanya Worlock, works at Great Clips, which is located near Blackjack Pizza. He said on occasion, when he would go over to visit his girlfriend, Eric Harris would give them free pizza. He told me he didn't associate with Harris, and really didn't know much about him. Nossaman proceeded to tell me that their family is personal friends with the Klebolds, and their family shared Rockies baseball tickets. At this point, Sean Nossaman's father, David Nossaman, told me that he and Dylan Klebold went to the All Star Game which was played at Coors Field in 1998. Sean Nossaman was asked if he knew about Harris' Website. He told me he had no idea that the Website existed. I asked Nossaman if he heard any rumors in reference to anything that was going to occur on 04-20-99. He stated there were a lot of kids running around with "420" scribed on their hats and backpacks, and he knew that this was National Marijuana Day.

I asked Nossaman if he could recall about what time this incident occurred at the school. He stated he believed it was about 1120 to 1130 hours. Nossaman was asked if he observed either Lance Kirklin or Dan Rohrbough being shot outside the high school. He stated that he did see Rohrbough fall after being shot, but again stated he did not see a gunman. He believes that Rohrbough was shot three times in the back area, and he thought Rohrbough was walking down the stairs when he was shot. He told me he did not see Kirklin get shot, he only observed him lying on the ground after the incident.

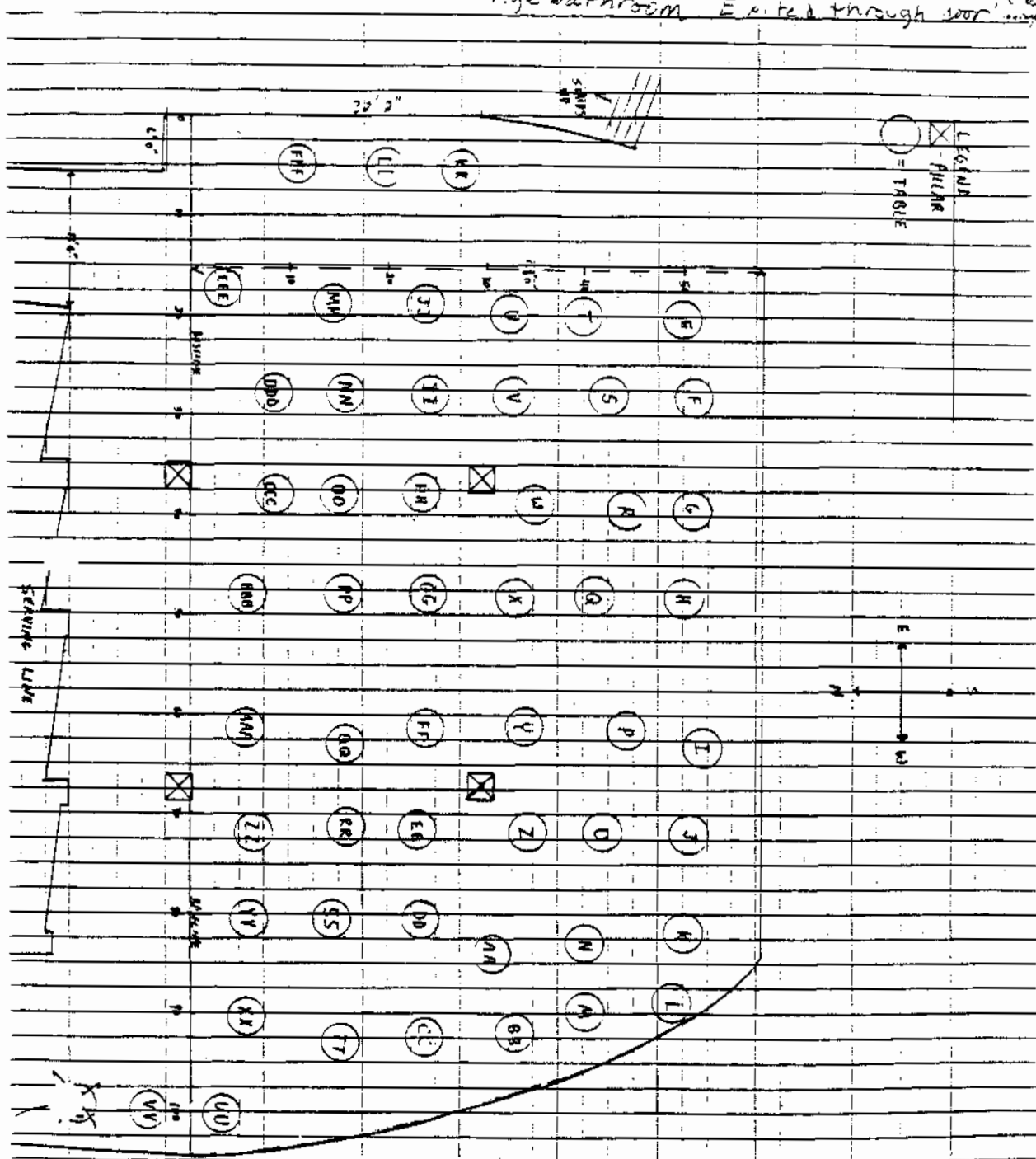

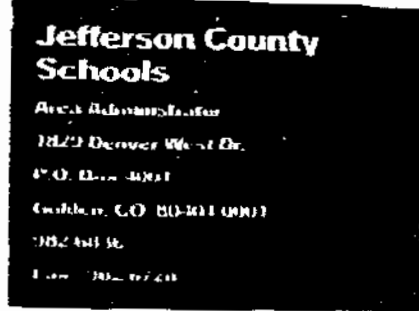

NUNCIO said she had been standing at the student store, near the entrance on the south side of the cafeteria at the time of the shooting


At about 11:25am she looked out the windows to the west and saw Anne Marie HOCHHALTER, whom she recognized from their elementary school days, fall to the ground by the southwest corner of the cafeteria. She said she ran out the exit by the store to see what was wrong with HOCHHALTER. At some point near this time a Special Education Teacher, Miss Chris REDMERSKI, told them to get down because someone was shooting. As she got to the area of the corner she saw a suspect, whom she thought she could identify as Dylan KLEBOLD, walking west from the entrance at the top of the stairs by the grassy hillside. As this suspect got to the top of the stairs he turned back toward the entrance from which he had just come and fired a handgun about ten times in quick succession towards the school / entrance. She recalled this suspect was holding the handgun in his right hand.

NUNCIO described after firing the shots the suspect then turned and went back to the area at the top of the stairs, stood by the edge of the grass. She watched as he reached into his trenchcoat and pulled out what she thought was a pipe bomb with his right hand and threw it towards the senior parking lot. She could not recall what the suspect had done with the handgun he was shooting with his right hand just prior to this. At this time NUNCIO said she turned and ran back into the cafeteria through the row of multiple doors. She then went back to the REB Corner, student store, with a few of her friends where several girls were screaming. She then ran down the hallway to the right and ran out the exit near the Foreign Language classrooms to Leawood Park.

NUNCIO clarified that she did not recall seeing KLEBOLD prior to the day of the shooting, but made this identification subsequently due to seeing their photographs on the media coverage. She felt it had been KLEBOLD due to the shooter she had seen having blond hair. She added that this suspect was wearing a black ballcap on backwards, and a black trenchcoat, but otherwise could not provide further description of him or his weapons. NUNCIO did not see anyone else with this suspect, or anything that might have been beside him at the time.

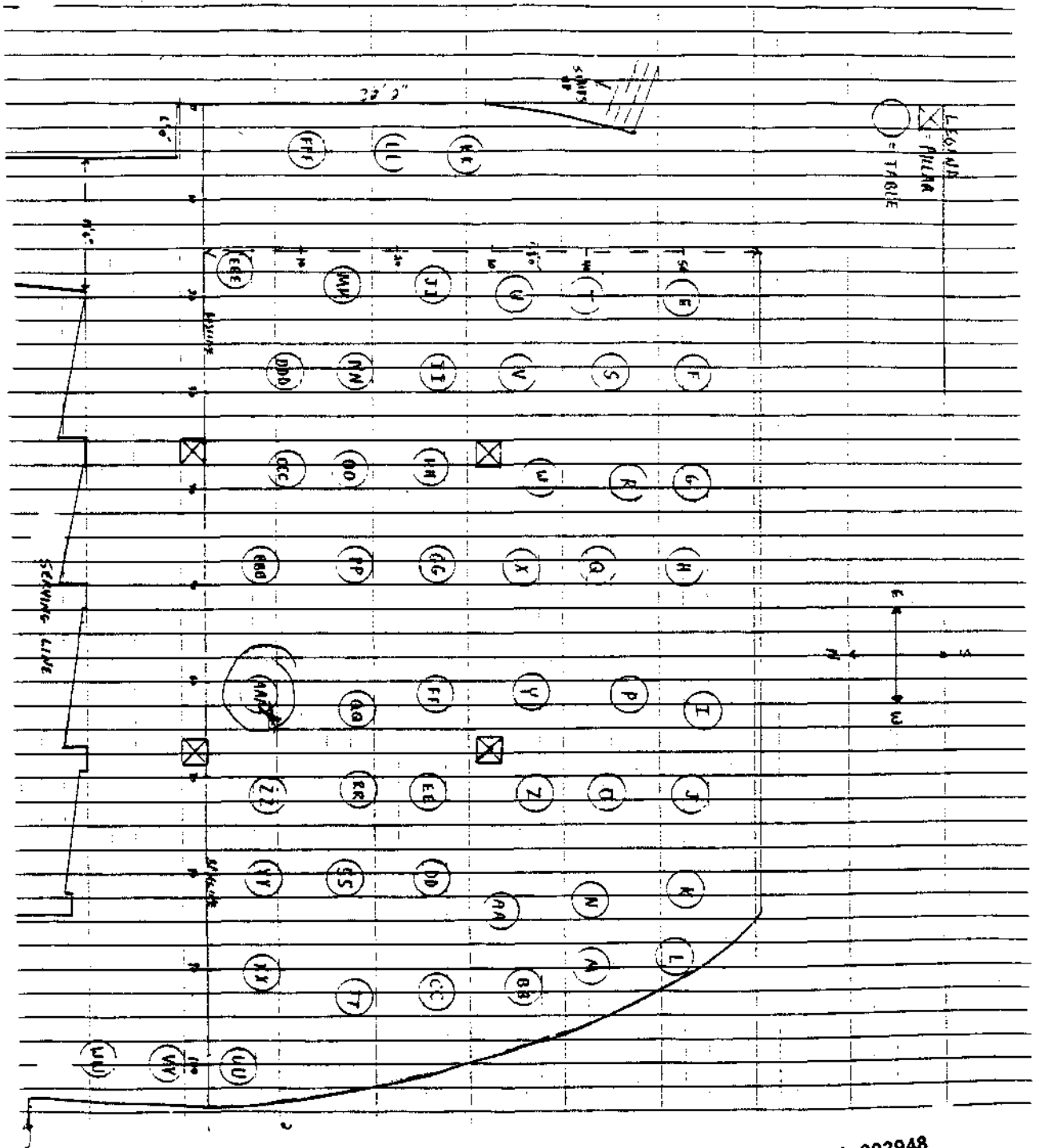

INVESTIGATION:

On 5/5/99 I was assigned information control number DN2806 for follow up investigation. The information control narrative stated that Keira O'Dell is on the original cafeteria backpack list.

On 5/6/99 I responded to 9695 West Power Circle and interviewed Keira O'Dell and her mother, Michelle. Keira confirmed that she had been in the cafeteria at the time that the incident occurred. She rode the bus to

school, bus number S2, that drops her off at the south main entrance. She said she entered the school at approximately 7:05 and went to her locker which is in the main hallway and then went to her athletic locker by the gymnasium to drop off her track equipment. She then was out in the main hall by the main entrance, visiting with friends Julie McGinley, Alison Reardon, and Jenny Naifeh. She said that she then went to her first hour, which is English on the main level near the offices. She then went to second hour, which is Spanish, on the lower level. Mrs. Hickman is the teacher. From there she went to her third hour which is Science. She went back upstairs through the main stairwell. She then went to her fourth hour class which is Choir. In between third and fourth hour she did go with a friend to a friend's locker, however she did not go to her locker. From Choir she went to the "A" lunch.

O'Dell stated that she went into the cafeteria and dropped off her backpack at the table, which she identified as ... She then went to the service line and picked up a chick filet sandwich. She went back to the table and believes she may have even finished her sandwich, and was eating and talking with friends when she heard some boys from the far end of the cafeteria yell to get down. She then looked across the lunchroom and saw that kids were getting down under the tables and that some of the students were crawling on their stomachs across the floor towards their location. She said that janitors were walking by with walkie-talkies, then she heard conversations about someone having a gun. She thought that students on the ground were talking about that. She said that all of a sudden people started to run towards the stairwell. She did not hear any gunshots at that time. She said that she and her friend Katie Jorgensen ran up the stairs together. She believes that they were one of the first ones up the stairs. She said that they ran straight down the hall when they got to the top of the stairs, and as they got to the top of the stairs they heard what they thought were loud bombs. She said that they ran straight out the doors yelling for other students to evacuate the school as they left. She said that when she ran out of the school, she ran across the street into Leawood Park. She said that she met up with 150 or so people in the park. She said that while they were there they heard more bombs or gunshots and then heard someone yell that they should get out of the park. She said that she then went to her friend Lindsay Blair's

house, and she was able to call her mother and her mother believes she received the call approximately 11:45 to 11:50. Her mother came to the house and picked up 12 of the girls that lived in the Governor's Ranch area and took them home. At Katie Jorgensen's house they were able to use the cell phone and other phones to call parents. O'Dell said that as she ran down the main corridor to exit the building, she remembers dodging in between pillars and behind walls as to avoid being shot. She said that she doesn't know why she did that now, because there was no shooting in the hallway that she was aware of, but she could hear it behind her.

O'Dell said that her backpack is blue with black trim. Inside the backpack is her Government, Math, Spanish and Vocabulary book, several notebooks, her Government and Spanish folder, her calculator, her purse with makeup and her school ID, and pens and pencils. She said she was wearing khaki shorts and a pink shirt with a pink top, and white tennis shoes.

O'Dell is a Freshman. She said that she had heard of the trench coat mafia, and had seen kids wearing trench coats around school and just assumed that they were part of the trench coat mafia. She's had no problems with any students in the group and she's unaware of any students that did have problems. She said that her friend Julie McKinney [editor's note: possibly McGinley?] received a letter during one of her classes in which the Sophomores write the Freshman letters. She doesn't know who the letter was from, but the letter was all about warning Julie about her dealings with members of the trench coat mafia.

O'Dell said that she doesn't know anybody with two pierced eyebrows. She does have Internet access at home, however she only uses it for E-mail and her on-line service. She said that she did see the Royal News Network and she thinks that she saw the thought of the day being *you don't want to be here today*.

O'Dell said that during her travels through the school she didn't notice any unusual backpacks or duffle bags. She had no further information to add to the investigation.

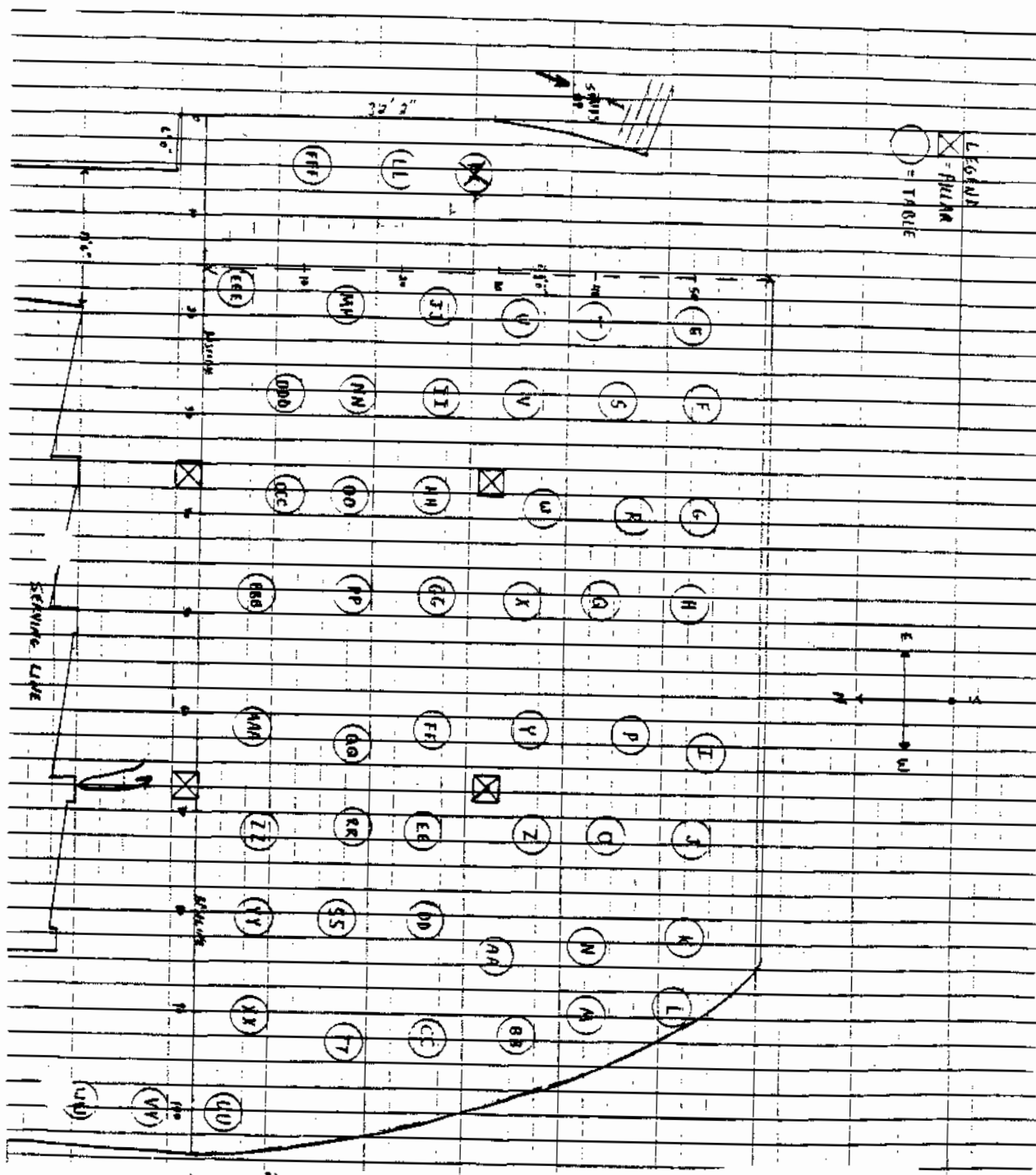

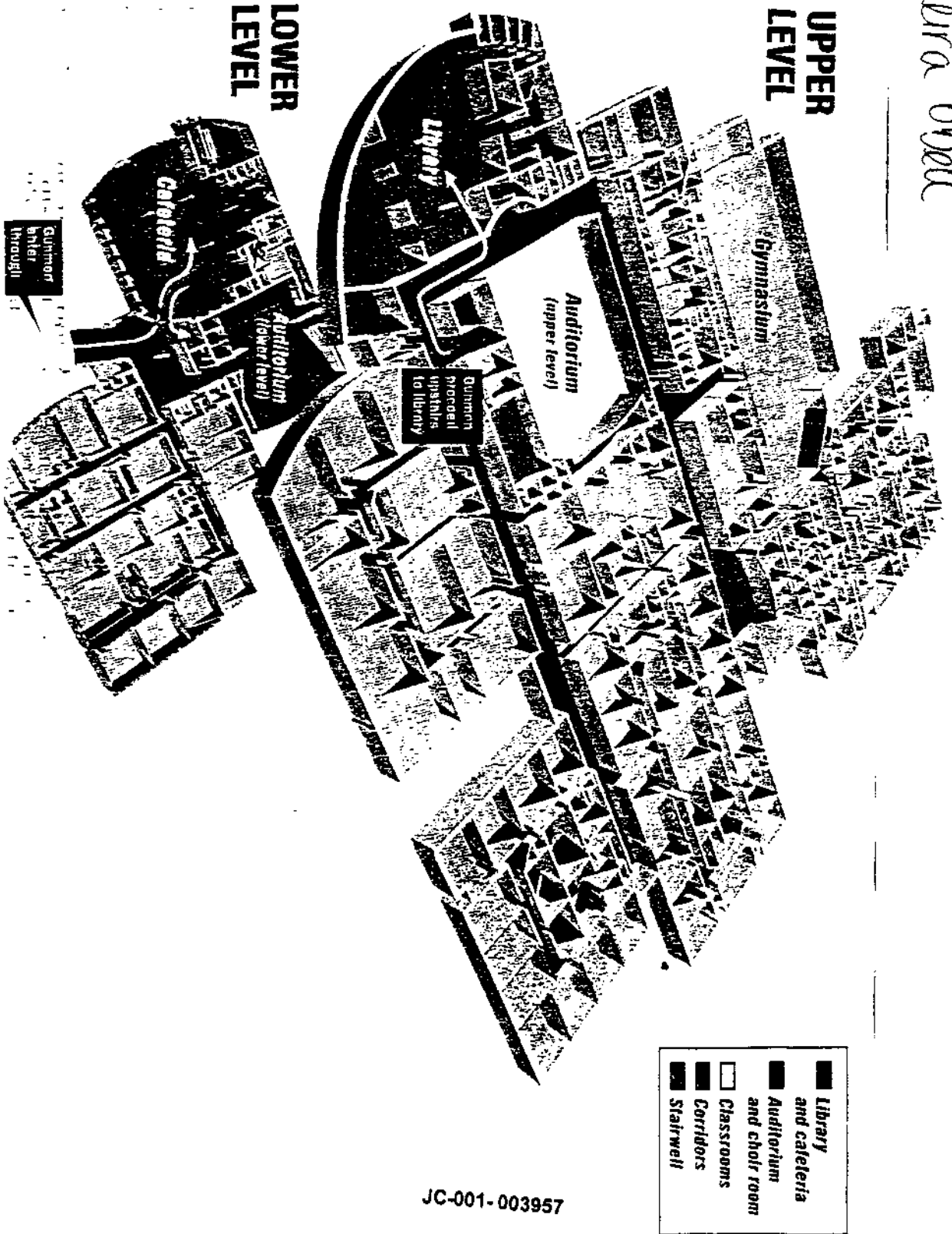

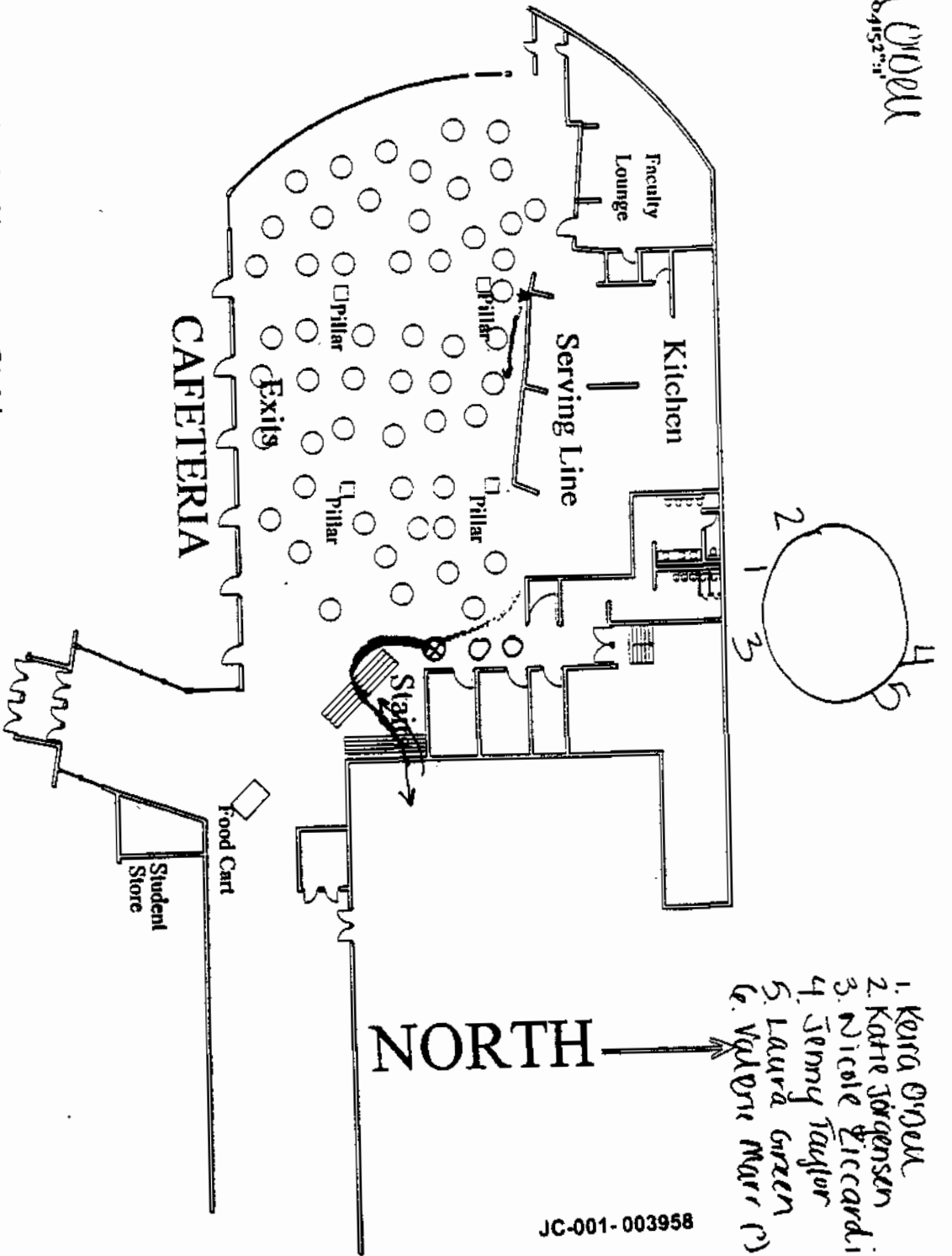

* He is a senior at Columbine High.

* When asked about Eric Harris, he said that he had Eric, Dylan Klebold, Nate Dykeman, and Chris Morris in his zero-hour bowling class. He described Eric as being a quiet guy who never said

anything. He said that Eric did wear a trench coat at times. He also knew Eric ever since they both went to Ken Caryl Middle School.

* When asked about Dylan Klebold, he did not know Dylan prior to the bowling class. He described Dylan as a bit more talkative than Eric was.

* When asked about [REDACTED] he said that [REDACTED] was in his government and economics class for 3rd hour. He also saw him around school. He described [REDACTED] as very talkative. He remembered a time in that class when the students were talking about their parents and about God. He remembered [REDACTED] saying that he was not close to his parents and that he did not love them. [REDACTED] also said that his mother was going out with some other man. He said that [REDACTED] would wear a trench coat on occasion. He did not know if [REDACTED] was in his 3rd hour class on the day of the shooting.

* When asked about [REDACTED] he said that he knew who [REDACTED] was. He said that he had [REDACTED] in his social studies class last year. He said that [REDACTED] was a nice guy who talked about cars. He never saw [REDACTED] in a trench coat. He has not seen much of [REDACTED] this year [REDACTED]

* When asked about [REDACTED] he said that [REDACTED] was also in his last year's social studies class. He described [REDACTED] as a kid who kept to himself, would talk in class, and was very smart. He thought that [REDACTED] was on the debate team. He said that [REDACTED] would also wear a trench coat on occasion.

* He could not think of any other trench coat students or associates. He has heard the name "Trench Coat Mafia" but thought they were just kids who wore black and kept to themselves. He did not think of them as a gang.

* He did not see any of the above named students or other trench coat students or associates in school the day of the shooting. He

did not think that Eric or Dylan were at the zero-hour bowling class the day of the shooting and could not remember if Chris Morris or Nate Dykeman were in bowling that day.

* When asked, he said that he did not see any unusual objects around school the day of the shooting. When asked specifically, he said he did not see any duffle bags.

* On the day of the shooting, he had math class for 4th hour. He got out at 11:10 a.m. and went straight down the stairs to the cafeteria. He said he always goes to the last table that is in the hallway outside Rebel Corner. The table is the one in that area that is closest to the cafeteria tables. This was verified by the location his backpack was found, table D.

* He was at that table with his girlfriend, Amy Evans and; Leigh Kamens, Steve Trujillo, Heather Dinkel, Nick Schumann, and Tina Bernacci. He sat down at the table and waited for the lunch lines to go down. After waiting about 5 or 10 minutes, he got up and started toward the food line.

* Referring to the diagram, as he was walking around table H to go to the food line, he saw students scrambling toward the west windows. He saw Mr. Sanders and a janitor squatting down by the west door to the cafeteria. He thought that a senior prank of setting mice loose was occurring.

* As he got close between tables X and Y, everyone began to squat down. He heard someone say something about a "shooting." He got down and does not remember if he heard any shots. He did hear crying and panic. After being down for 45 seconds, he started to crawl back to his table. About half the way there, everyone started to run out of the cafeteria. He went up the stairs and left down the hallway and out that hallway's east doors toward Pierce St.

* As he was turning down the hallway after going up the stairs, he heard two loud shots or explosions. He said it sounded like it was coming from the upstairs area.

* Once outside, he hopped into a car being driven by Chris Duven. He said that from the time there was first a problem to the time he was out of the school was about 3 to 4 minutes.

* He was wearing a blue Columbine football t-shirt, jeans and brown boots.

* He never saw any suspects.

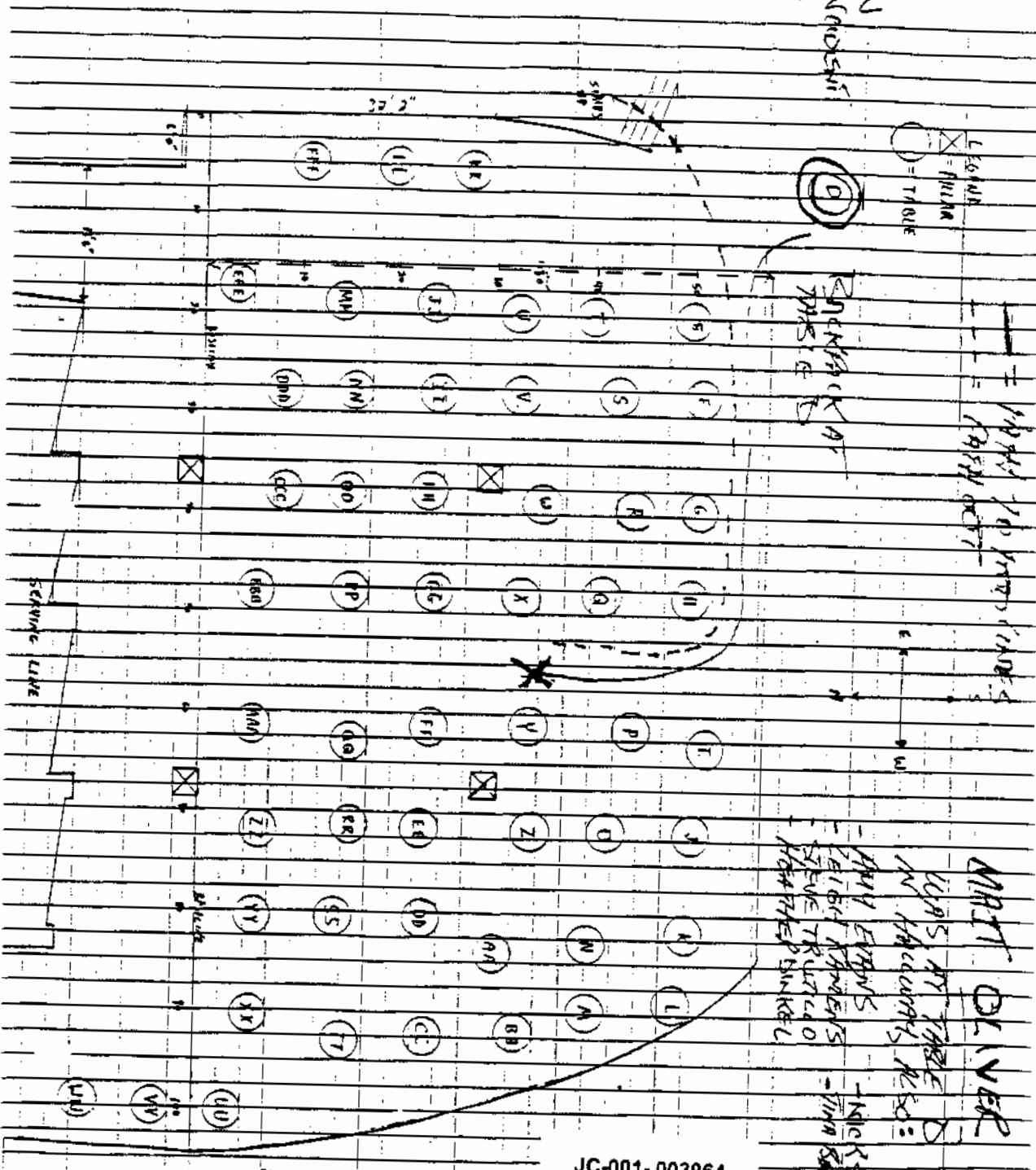

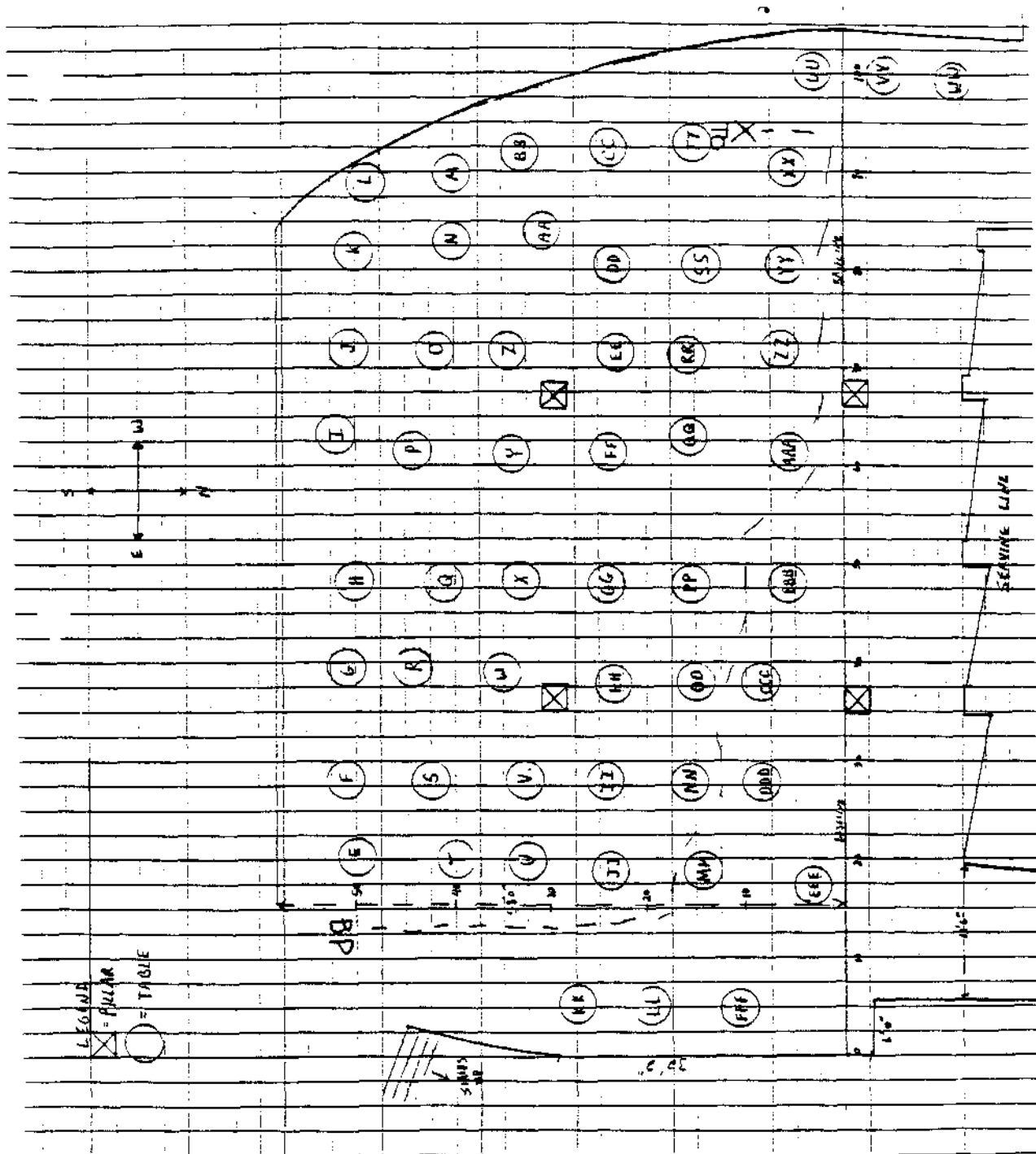



INVESTIGATION:

On 05/03/99 I was assigned Information Control Number DN2513 for follow up investigation. The narrative stated that Jeremy Orban had been in the cafeteria at approximately 7:00 a.m. The source was Brandi Wiseman, a student at Columbine High School.

On 05/04/99 at 1130 hours I met with Jeremy Orban and his mother Joann Sander-Cederl at their residence. Also present at the residence were two other Columbine students, Braden Pesusich and Ali Boukhalfa. Both Pesusich and Boukhalfa were present in the cafeteria with Jeremy Orban and they were also interviewed.

Orban stated that he walked to school on 04/20/99 and that he arrived at approximately 0710 hours and that he entered the school through the main entrance then went to his locker and down to commons or cafeteria area. He said he met a girl named Cari, last name unknown [editor's note:

Wiseman. He said they were in the commons for approximately 10 to 15 minutes before first hour. Orban said that he didn't notice anything unusual in the cafeteria at that time. He didn't notice any unattended duffel bags or backpacks, although he said he wasn't really looking for any.

Orban left the commons area and went to Spanish on the lower level for first hour. He left Spanish and second hour went to chemistry on the main level, for third hour he went to history on the main level and after third hour he went to his locker and then to fourth hour across from the gymnasium, his math class. He then left his math class and went to the A lunch. He said that when he arrived he got in line to purchase food and after he purchased his pizza he went to sit at his table. He identified the table that he was sitting at as table AA. He said that the other people at his table were Braden Pesusich, Ali Boukhalfa, Seth Biggi, Ian Hales, Nick Romanyshyn, Ravi Rao, Ryan Borus and Terry, last name unknown. [editor's note: Terry Lawson]

Orban said that he sat down at the table, took two bites of this pizza when he heard a janitor come in through an outside door yelling for everyone to get down. He said that he looked out the windows and saw a person who he believes was Dylan Klebold shot a male student in the leg and throw a pipe bomb into the parking lot. He said that he and other students then got under the tables. He said that then he and other students began running towards the stairs and as they ran Orban could hear what he described as booms thinking in retrospect that these were pipe bombs. Orban said that as he approached the stairs he could see that the stairwell was quite crowded and there was a teacher in the hallway by the food cart directing them down the hall. He said that he ran down the hall until he had to make a right and followed that hallway down to the last classroom. He said there were numerous students going into that classroom and there were several teachers in the class with them. He said that after several minutes the teachers heard the shooting from what he believes was upstairs and he, at the direction of the faculty, ran out the south exit doors from this classroom, across the student parking lot and to a house at Polk Street and Pierce. He said they went in the house for a short time and a student there had a cell phone and he was able to call his mother. He believed he was able to contact her at approximately 11:45 a.m. Orban had been separated from his

friends at the table when he left the table. Orban did not leave anything behind in the cafeteria. He said he had been wearing brown corduroy's and a green T shirt. He said he took his backpack with him when he left. Orban said that he noticed nothing unusual in the cafeteria prior to the incident beginning, that he didn't notice any large duffel bags or backpacks that appeared to be unattended. However, he stated that he probably wouldn't notice such an item because it is common practice for the students to drop their packs and go get food, using their packs to save a spot. Orban said that he was familiar with the trench coat mafia only by name and knew that they were kids that wore trench coats, but had no run in's with them and could provide no further information on the trench coat mafia. He also did not know Eric Harris or Dylan Klebold. Orban did not know of any students who were building pipe bombs or stockpiling weapons. He does not have his own web site and does not have Internet access at home.

I next interviewed Braden Pesusich. He indicated he had not been in the cafeteria any other time during the day and had gone to the cafeteria for the A lunch. He said that he had come from the upstairs into the cafeteria, had gone to the lunch line and then made his way to the table when the incident began. He said that he observed people standing up by the west windows and felt perhaps there was a fight. He said that he had a fairly clear view of the kid running up the hill, trying to run up and get away, when he heard more shots. He said that he then observed what he thought were pipe bombs being thrown into the parking lot. He said that he saw one of the gunmen by the window shooting down towards the ground. He could not see what the gunman was shooting at. The only description he could remember was that this gunman had long curly hair and in retrospect thinks it was Dylan Klebold. He said about this time people were starting to run for the stairs to the cafeteria. He said that he ran along the south wall and that he saw a girl screaming. He thought her name might be Kim or Patty Blair. He couldn't be sure because the Blair's are twins. [editor's note: it was Kim Blair]. He said that the girl was screaming "Anne Marie, Anne Marie". [editor's note: in reference to Anne Marie Hochhalter being shot] He said that shortly past this girl that was screaming, was a male student who was covered with blood [editor's note: Jayson Autenrieth]. He said he didn't appear to be injured, but he had blood all over him. He said he next focused on the stairs and saw there was a large crowd there and ran

down the corridor into the language section of the building. He said that he didn't go entirely down the hall, but made a right turn by the Special Ed hall. He said as he ran past the stairwell he could hear a rapid series of shots from where he believed was either behind him or upstairs. He said that he then ran down the corridor past the Special Ed classroom and out of the building. Pesusich said that he took his pack with him and he was wearing khaki colored pants and a dark blue T shirt and left nothing behind in the cafeteria. Pesusich said that he was familiar with the trench coat mafia only by name but had no run in's with them and could provide no further information on the trench coat mafia. He also did not know Eric Harris or Dylan Klebold. Pesusich did not know of any students who were building pipe bombs or stockpiling weapons. He does have Internet access at home, however he does not have a web page or user name. Pesusich could add nothing further

I also interviewed Ali Boukhalifa, who also stated he had only been in the cafeteria during the Attack and that he had come from upstairs. He said he had been in line and was making his way back to the table when the incident began. He heard a commotion and a loud thud outside the west windows. He got up and saw a suspect with what he believed was a shotgun. He observed him shoot the gun but did not know where he shot it into. He then saw what he thought was a pipe bomb go flying through the air and then the suspect ran to the north side and up the stairs. He then heard several loud bombs as he was getting down. He said that when the students began to run out of the cafeteria he ran for the stairs. He went up the stairs and then directly east out the southeast main entrance and across the street into the park. He said that as he was running out the corridor he could still hear gunshots which he believed were coming from behind him. Boukhalifa could not identify the person he saw with the shotgun and could provide no further information as to what the person might have been wearing.

Boukhalifa left nothing behind, he was wearing jeans and a dark grey T shirt with a marbled top. Boukhalifa said he was familiar with the trench coat mafia and had seen them around. He also did not know Eric Harris or Dylan Klebold but that in retrospect he had seen Klebold around the school. He had no direct involvement with the trench coat mafia, but had a friend named Brett

Sullivan who had transferred to Englewood several months ago for other reasons. Sullivan had bumped into Klebold and they got into a pushing contest. Boukhalfa received this information second hand and did not have personal knowledge of the incident. He could only add that the trench coat mafia members seemed rather odd and he stayed away from them. He did not know of any students who were building pipe bombs or stockpiling weapons and noticed nothing unusual in the school the day this incident occurred. He does not have a web page and could add nothing further.

Both Pesusich and Boukhalfa verified the students that were at their table. They also indicated on the maps provided their routes into and out of the building. Orban indicated his entrance in a solid orange and his exit in a dotted orange, Boukhalfa did his entry in a solid green and exit in a dotted green and Pesusich did his entry in a solid red and his exit in a dotted red.

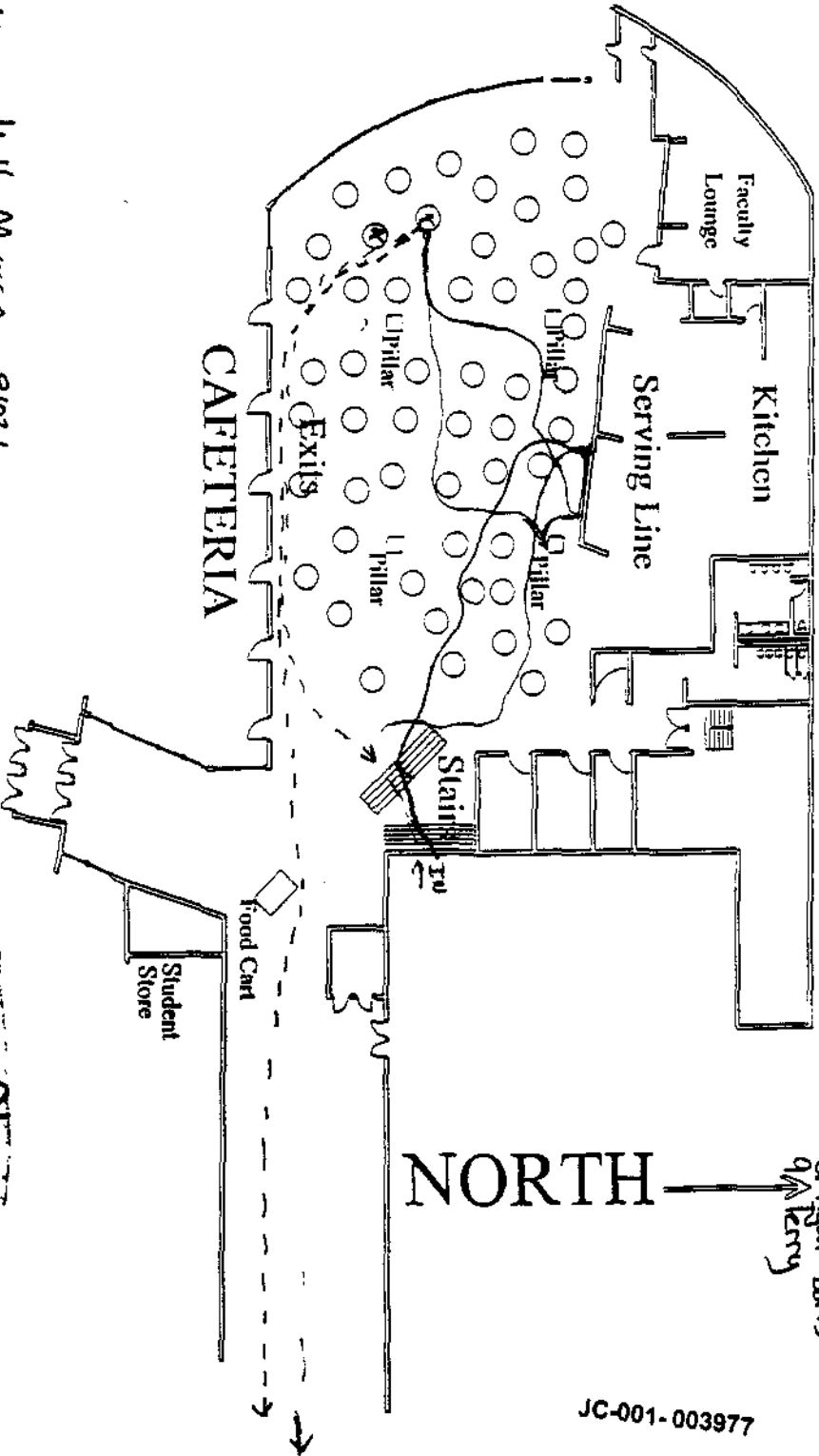
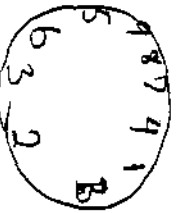

INVESTIGATION:

On 05-04-99 I was assigned Information Control Number DN2801 for follow up investigation. The Information Control narrative stated that Alisa Owen is on the original cafeteria backpack list.

On 05-06-99 I responded to 6338 Geddes Drive where I met with Alisa Owen and her mother. Alisa Owen confirmed that she was in the cafeteria when this incident occurred.

Owen stated that on 04-20-99 she drove her car to Columbine High School and parked in her assigned parking space #214 in the senior lot. She entered the school through the student entrance into the Commons and went up to her locker, which is on the main hall by the auditorium. She estimated she arrived at approximately 0700 hours. She then went to her physics class on the main level and spoke with her teacher. For first hour she has physics with Mr. Manuello. Second hour she has Spanish with Ms. Birch-Sterling. Third hour she has language arts, which is back on the main level and fourth hour she has math in the math wing. For that class she had a substitute teacher and does not recall the name. She said that after fourth hour she went to her locker and then went to the "A" lunch. She reviewed the diagram of the cafeteria and indicated she was seated at table "DD". The other students sitting at her table were: Alex (last name unknown, a female)[editor's note: Alejandra "Alex" Marsh], Jess Brown, Jenny Colby, Lydie Perry, and Pat (last name unknown)[editor's note: Patrick Leiker]. Owen estimated she arrived in the cafeteria at approximately 1115 hours. She said that she had traveled to the cafeteria with her friend, Jenny Colby. She said that she purchased a pop, sat down and started to eat her lunch. She thinks that perhaps she ate her sandwich and had just started eating some chips when she heard a male voice yell "get down". She said at that time the entire population of the cafeteria started to get down their chairs and under their tables. She did the same and was starting to question

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her friends and asking what was going on. She noticed that then people that were near the windows were crawling on the floor and pushing their way toward the stairs. '

Owen said that she peaked up from over the table and able to look out the window. She said that on the hill area she saw someone trip and fall down. She thought that it was DYLAN. She said that he was wearing a black trench coat and his black baseball cap which he wears backwards. She said that she also thought it was DYLAN because of his curly hair. She could not see his hands and she couldn't tell what he was wearing on his feet. She said that she also saw someone by the cars that were parked near the building. She said that usually ERIC, DYLAN and Zach [editor's note: Zach Heckler] have their cars parked in the first spots. She interjected that she knew that ERIC and DYLAN and Zach had arrived at school at 0430 hours to get those get those assigned parking spaces. They wanted to have the spots closest to the school.

Owen said that Zach drives a blue car, DYLAN has a black Volvo or BMW, and ERIC also drives a black . She said that there was one person standing between two cars in the lot. She couldn't ID the person as they had their back to her, but she thought that they were wearing a black trench coat and looked heavier-set and was wearing camel army pants. She said that she does recall that there was a car parked in Zach's spot, which is the first spot and DYLAN's spot which is the second spot and thinks that the third space was empty. She then said that she started to crawl across the cafeteria floor toward the stairwell. She said that she saw people going up the stairs and she got up and ran.

Owen ran to the stairs and as she was going up the stairs noticed that a friend of hers had fallen. She doesn't recall the friend's name. She helped her up and thought that she had sprained her ankle. She said that they then heard gunshots in the cafeteria behind them and she also heard bombs. People were beginning to panic and yell "get out, get out". She said that she was frustrated as she went up the stairs because the crowd wasn't moving fast enough and that when she finally got up the stairs, she ran directly down the hallway and out of the building. She didn't recall hearing fire alarms but did say that she did hear gunshots and bombs as she was running out. These sounds were coming from behind her.

When she exited the school she went across the street into the Leewood Park and attempted to find her friends. She was at a gazebo when she heard someone yelled to run again and run into the neighborhood. She ran into the neighborhood and got into a house. She didn't know whose house that it was, but she got on a cell

phone and was able to call her mom. Her mother indicated that she received at 1222 hours. She then got a ride to Leawood Elementary and was reunited with her parents after a trip to the hospital to check on some friends. Owen estimated that it took her approximately ten minutes from the time the incident began until she was in Leawood Park.

Owen said her backpack is a blue and black Eastport, that it contains a red folder, miscellaneous papers, a dayplanner, several other books, a TI 83 graphing calculator, and a wallet. Owen said that she was wearing jean overalls, a gray short-sleeved shirt, and tennis shoes.

Owen said that she knew ERIC HARRIS and that she believes in eighth or ninth grade she had asked him to a class dance. She said that he is since been in several of her classes including her CCB class taught by Mr Webb. She was not in his particular group in the class and did not know what his paper was about. She that when ever she would hang around ERIC and his friends, they were constantly joking around saying things like "I'm going not you too". Owen said that this was just their sense of humor and she did not feel threatened by the talk.

Owen said that she had seen DYLAN KLEBOLD in the hallways and several weeks prior to the incident, had talked to him about school. She said she was extremely surprised when it turned it was DYLAN KLEBOLD was involved in the incident because she describes him as "a nice guy". She wasn't surprised to find out that it was ERIC HARRIS because he had a very dark side and he always kept to himself. I asked Owen to characterize her relationship with ERIC and DYLAN. She said that they more of acquaintances than friends.

Owen said that she also knew Zach Heckler and that he had been in one of her classes, a Power Point class for physics. However, she didn't even considered herself an acquaintance of Zach only that she knew him

Owens said that she usually ate lunch with a group of girls who liked to associated themselves with the "trench coat mafia". Their names were Nicole Markham, Krista (last name unknown)[editor's note: Krista Hanley], Alex (last name unknown, possibly Marsh- editor's note- this is correct), and Vennessa (last name unknown)[editor's note: Vennessa Grimes]. She said that usually the talk at their table was about prom or social activities and the only time she ever heard them talking about weapons was Alex and Vennessa joking about sword-fighting. She further stated that Nicole possibly Marks [editor's note: Markham], was dating Chris Morris. Krista (last name unknown)[editor's note: Hanley] was dating Eric (last name unknown)[editor's note: Jackson] who always wears a beret. She said she was unaware of who Alex and Vennessa might be dating. She said that Krista always wore black and she always wore black overalls. She said that Alex always wore dark clothes but usually black, usually dark grays and greens. Vennessa also wore

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dark clothes but not usually black. She said that another girl, Jenny [editor's note: Colby], that usually hangs out with them, always wore a color-guard jacket and Jessica [editor's note: Brown], who hangs out with them, always wore very revealing clothing.


Owen said that she had no problems with "trench coat mafia" members and had not hear of any other students having problems with them. When asked about unusual backpacks or duffle bags in the cafeteria, Owen said that she does recall a pack near their table that was between her and the pop machines. She said that it was very large and on the floor and people were stepping over it. She said she remembers someone asking who it belonged to it and no one answered up for it. She said that several students tried push it out of the way but it was so heavy it wouldn't move or they didn't move it. Owen did not know anybody with double-pierced eyebrow and does not have Internet access.


Owen's mother indicated at the end of the interview that they also were acquainted with Robyn Anderson and Tiffany Burke. She stated that on the day that the incident occurred, Alisa had been calling numerous friends find out if they were okay that evening. One of the calls she made was to Tiffany Burke. She said that Tiffany was no longer a friend but her name just appeared in the phone books that Alisa was using and she called her. She said that later when Alisa wasn't in the residence, Tiffany called and Cathy Owen asked her if she was okay. She said Tiffany's response was "I wasn't there, and I don't want talk about it". In retrospect, Cathy Owen thinks this is an unusual statement. Alisa Owen could add no further information.

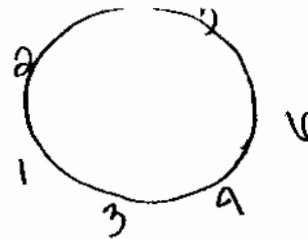

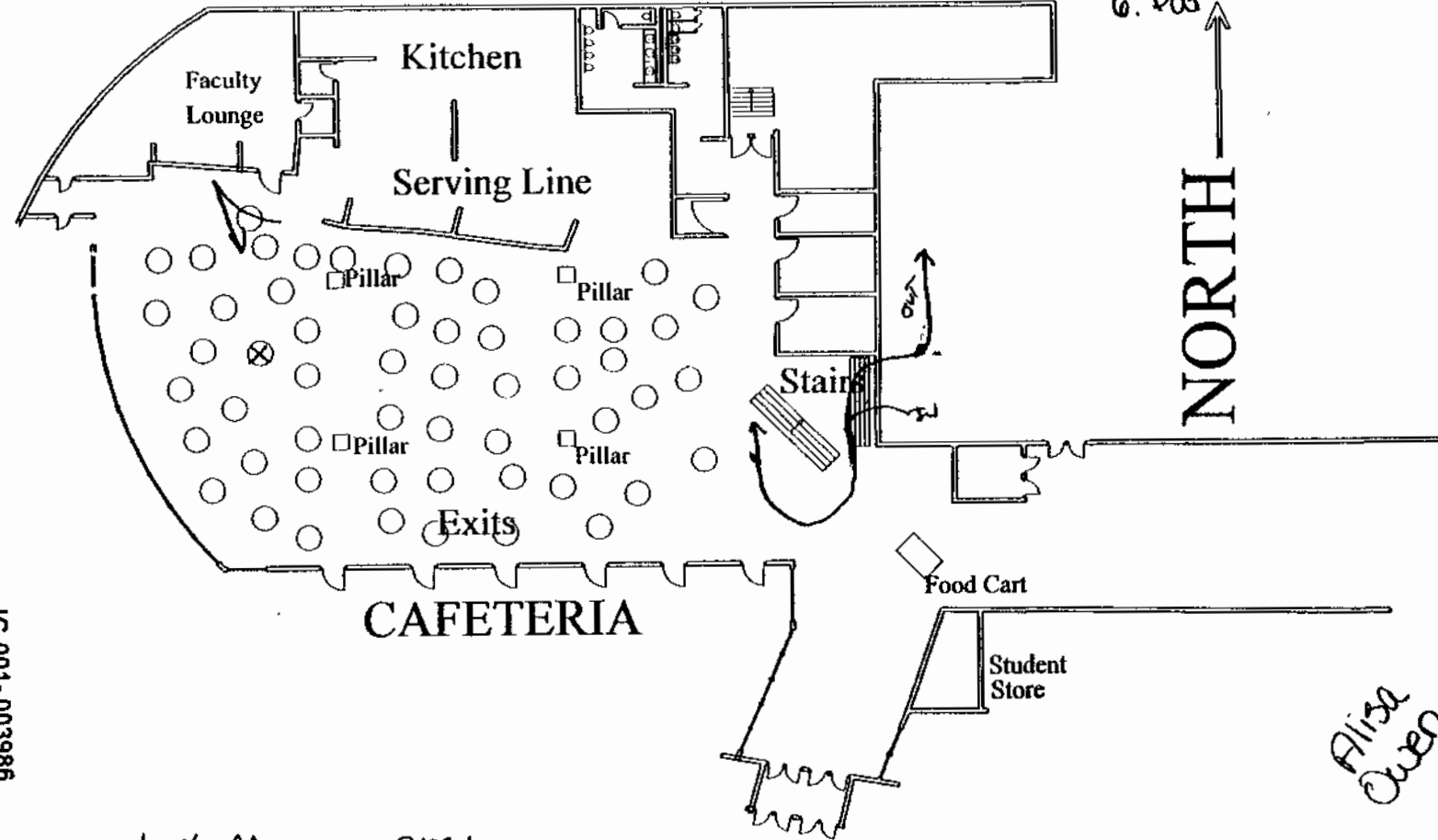

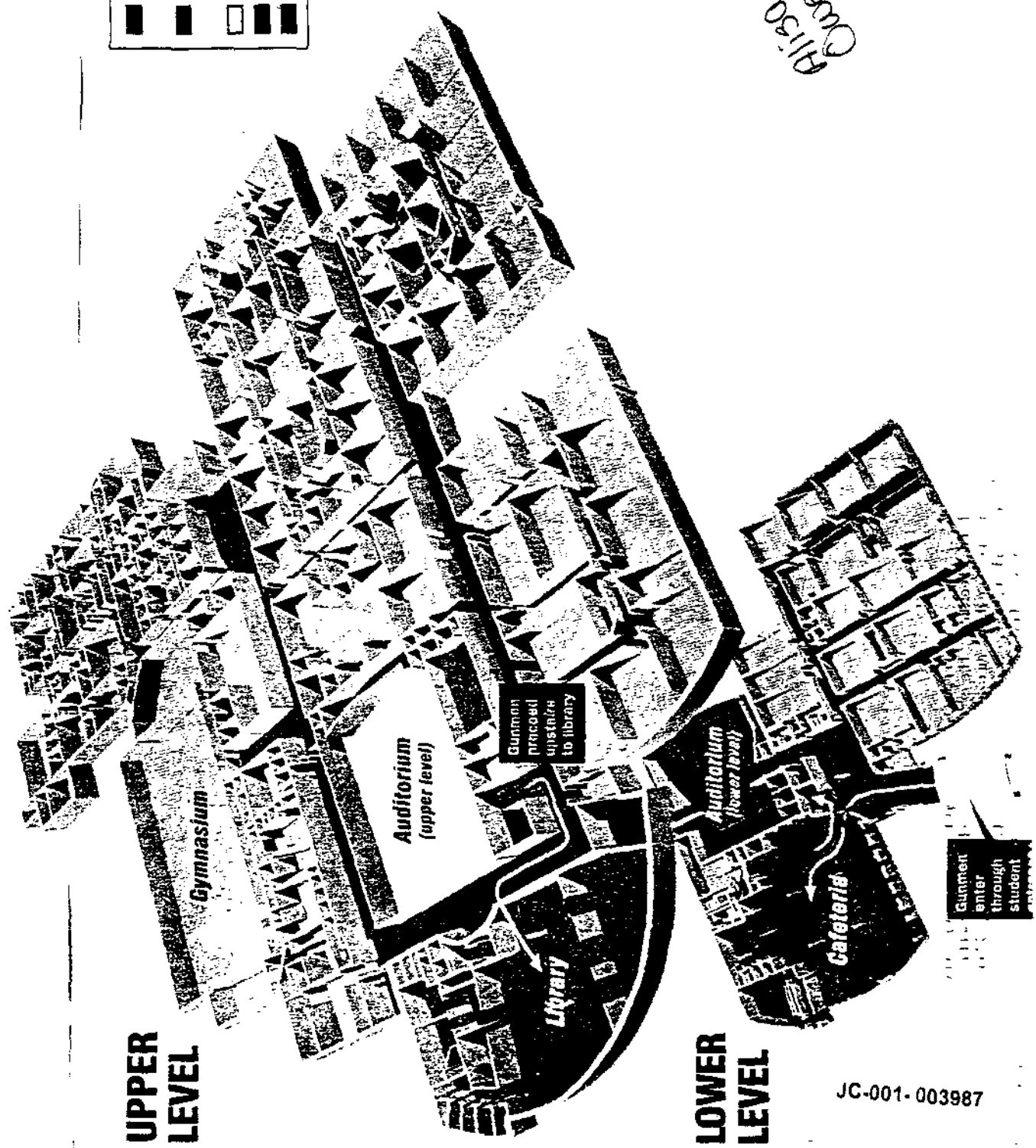

INVESTIGATION:

On 05-05-99 I was assigned Information Control Number DN2799 for follow up investigation. The Information Control narrative stated that Nathaniel Owen is on the original cafeteria backpack list.

On 05-06-99 I responded to 9704 West Power Circle where I met with Nathaniel Owen and his parents. Nathaniel confirmed that he was in the cafeteria when this incident occurred.

Owen stated that he took the bus to school. He believed the bus number is S1. He arrived at school by the main entrance, the entrance just south of the main entrance. He said that he entered the school and went to the cafeteria area and arrived there at approximately 0715 hours. He indicated on the map that he sat at a table near the east pillar, possibly table "HH" or "W". He said that he visited with other students who were in the cafeteria and then left the cafeteria to go to his first hour class which is journalism and the teacher is Jankowski. He said that the journalism class is on the main level. He left first hour to go to second hour, which is his language arts class, Mr. Leyba, and he met with Charles Whitsel. They traveled to the math class together for third hour with Mrs. Layman. He said that after third hour he has fourth hour off and went to the Commons. He said that he got to the Commons and went to his usual table which he identified as table "TT". He said that several of his other friends that have fourth hour off met him there, those being Jeff Hofer, Giff Seawright, Robbie Wisher, Chris Wisher, Jordan Grimm, and other student that they refer to as Nevel. Also Brian Bay was with them at this time. He said that sometimes they eat or do homework or just talk during this hour. He said that during the fourth hour he didn't

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notice anyone come in to the cafeteria and drop off a backpack or duffle bag. However, he indicated his back was to the doors by the faculty lounge and he wouldn't have been able to see anybody come. He said that due to his conversations he probably would not have noticed. He said that for the "A" lunch, Brian Bay remained at the table. They were joined by Mike Naifeh, Mark Opfer, Kent Foncannon, Tyrone (last name unknown) [editor's note: Tyrone Garrett] and Kenny Rupp. He said that they were sitting at their table and that he had gotten his food at approximately at 1110 hours. He purchased a Subway sandwich. He said that Mark Opfer left out the door to upstairs by the library and left out the faculty door. Shortly after he left the incident began. Owen said that initially he did not hear any shots but heard what he thought were chairs falling down or muffled bangs. He said that he turned behind him and looked out the window. He said that he looked out the window and saw three people. He said he saw two people lying on the ground and as he looked out the window he saw another student go down. He said the male student that went down appeared as though he had been shot in the leg from the parking lot area. He said that the student

was wearing baggy shorts, blue jean style, a T-shirt which is dark in color, and he had short, blond hair. He said that he immediately turned around to his friends and asked if they heard any gunshots. He said at about the same time he hear a male teacher yelling "get down, get down". He immediately dropped down and got behind some chairs. He said his initial response was just hide by the chairs and he waited a minute or two and then he started to move toward the stairwell. He said that there were people crawling and running toward the stairs. He said that he got to the stairwell, he saw that the stairs were extremely crowded and he grabbed his friend Tyrone who was standing there, and they ran down the foreign language hallway corridor, then directly to the doors. He said that when they got to the doors, he had lost Tyrone along the way. There was a girl standing by the door. They paused for a moment at the door and then the girl ran from the school. He immediately followed her and he heard a teacher yelling at them to stay in the school. The teacher then yelled to them to "get out" and other students started to come out of the school. He said that he followed the girl and then lost her at some point as he across the street into Leawood Park. He said that he eventually ended up at a friend's house that had stayed home for lunch by the name of Eric Long, and that more students arrived at the house. He said that as they were at the park, they had been told to run into the neighborhoods. He said that while they were at Eric's house, they were able to hear more gunshots and they ran from that house thinking it was too close. He ended up knocking on some neighbors homes and an older couple let him into the house along with other students.

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Owen said that he was fairly sure that student he observed was shot in the leg and that he was bleeding. He said he couldn't be sure about the other two that were laying on the ground. He could provide no description of the two. He said that he did not see anyone shooting a gun and did not see any of the suspects outside the window.

Owen said that he did not see anything unusual in the cafeteria while he was in there for four hours and a lunch. He did not notice any large, unattended duffle bags.

Owen said that his backpack is a green Jansport. He said that it is a very big bag and that he carries all of his books, a math book, a Spanish book, vocabulary book, journalism book, three large binders, several other notebooks and his Texas Instruments calculator. Owen said that he was wearing a white shirt, khaki pants, and Dock Martin boots or shoes.

Owen said that he has heard of the "trench coat mafia" prior to the incident. However, he has had no contact with them and no incidents that he has been involved in. He had heard that several weeks prior to the incident that there was going to be a fight between the "trench coat mafia" and the jocks. He never heard of anything coming of it and wasn't aware of any fight. He said that usually there are "trench coat mafia" students sitting at a table near the door. He identified that table as "UU". He said normally there is a dark, blond-haired student that wears black cargo pants and a trench coat, has sunglasses, is fairly skinny and has a pale complexion. Owen believes he is a junior at the school and is unaware of his name. He said that one time while they were in the cafeteria he had heard other students from across the way teasing this "trench coat mafia" member.

Owen does not know of any students with double-pierced eyebrows. He does have Internet access but does not have a user name or ICQ account. He says that he has not seen anything about the "trench coat mafia" on the Internet and hasn't tried to access their sites. Owen could provide no further information to the investigation.

On 5/5/99, Jonathan Owens, DOB 6/10/82, 5409 West Hinsdale Avenue, Littleton, Colorado, was advised of the identity of the interviewing Agent, and the nature and purpose of the interview. He was interviewed in the presence of his Mother, Mary Ann Owens, DOB 7/3/57. He provided the following information.

On 4/20/99, Jon arrived at Columbine High School at approximately 7:00 a.m. He went directly to the cafeteria, and sat by himself at table JJ or MM. He didn't notice any duffel bags or backpacks that stood out to him or looked unusual. At 7:30 a.m., he went to a computer class to assist a teacher with this class. Afterwards, he went to his normal classes.

His last class prior to first period lunch was his history class, that let out at approximately 11:10 a.m. From here, Jon went directly to the cafeteria. He bought his lunch at the school store, and walked to table BB, which is near the windows on the west side of the cafeteria. He was seated with the following individuals.

1. Danny Abrams ✓
2. Peter (P.J.) Capra ✓

As he was eating lunch, he noted that several students were standing up and looking out the west windows of the cafeteria. He also looked out the windows, and observed a student whom he couldn't identify with a blood covered leg running towards the baseball diamond. Next he saw a gunman at the bottom of the stairs on the west side of the cafeteria dressed in black clothing, however not in a black trench coat. The gunman had on black pants, a black shirt, and long blond hair (neck length). The gunman pointed a sawed off shotgun towards the ground and fired once. He then got down on the floor, and as he did, he heard an explosion in the school parking lot. Teachers and janitors were yelling for students to get down. Jon crawled halfway to the stairs near the trophy case, and then ran to the stairs, and heard gunfire at the top of the stairs. Instead of going up the stairs, he ran down the foreign language hallway with many other students. He and a group of students went into the last classroom on the left next to the exit. two teachers in this classroom. A student named Julianne Brunaugh attempted to call 911, however the line was busy. They were in this classroom approximately two-three minutes, and then the teachers directed them out of the school, across the parking lot, and south to the first house to the south of the school on Pierce. There were many students in this house, and after five or ten minutes he left and a student driving a small car (possibly white in color) gave Jon and a few other unidentified students a ride into the neighborhood, and went to the house of yet another unidentified student. Jon stated that he thinks that the student that gave him a ride looked like a student in the 1998 yearbook in the Trench Coat Mafia photo. The student he pointed to was Brian Sargent.

Jon did not see Harris or Klebold around school on either Monday or Tuesday. He actually didn't know Klebold or Harris per se, however he thinks that in the past he has seen them and other TCM students around the school. He didn't know very much about the TCM, but has heard that they can get drugs and guns.

John does use the Internet, and has a screen name of surfer 2K1. He does not have an ICQ, and doesn't utilize chat rooms.

A previous interview conducted with Jonathan on 5/5/99, was referenced, and a copy of the 302 provided for him to review. Specific reference in the body of the 302 was made to his viewing a gunman at the bottom of the stairs outside the west side of the cafeteria that pointed a sawed off shotgun at the ground and fired. He was then shown a series of photographs in a photo lineup in order to determine if any of these photographs were of the same individual that he saw on 4/20/99, previously referenced. He positively identified Dylan Klebold as the individual that he saw on that day.

Specific reference was also made in the body of the 302 to Jonathan being given a ride after the incident by a student that he thought might have been Brian Sargent. He was then shown another series of photographs in a photo lineup in order to determine if any of these photographs were of the same individual that gave him a ride on 4/20/99. He positively identified Brian Sargent as being the driver of the car.
